



Someone is Watching and Wondering



As we all know one of the pillars of Lent is prayer, and as the Director of Initiation, I frequently hear the following: "Teach me to pray the Catholic Prayers. I am never quite sure how to answer that request, so I generally begin with the question, "What do you mean by prayer?" I

get many different answers, but personally, I like the above quote from Mother Teresa. In saying this, however, I must confess, although this is not a foreign concept for me, it is very difficult to "Let go and Let God." After all I know how to take care of myself, I know what I need to do, and God gave me a brain to problem solve. Right? Isn't prayer more about asking God to take care of all those things I can't, like healing, sending rain for the crops, protecting us from disasters. . .you get the idea. So what does it mean to put myself in the hands of God; does it mean I am exempt from action? No, I think it begins with falling in love and trusting God.

There are many days now when I simply want to stay in bed. I think to myself, what's the point of getting up; what should I do today; would anyone notice if I stayed hidden under the covers? The same answer keeps coming into my head: "God has given you this day, and if you let Him He will show you the way." So I haul myself out of bed, utter a simple thank you, and prepare for whatever lies ahead. Each day is like a gift, waiting to be opened and used. Each day is filled with wonder and awe. Each day brings new insights and experiences. Each day is filled with God's grace, I simply need to open myself to His love, receive whatever He offers, and trust He will be with me, guiding and directing. This doesn't mean I'm off the hook. He gives me challenges, work, and struggles that I need to get through, using my talents, wits, and strength. He puts people in my path, and I must meet them where they are, be present to them, and try to reflect God's love. He sends His word, and not only must I be willing to listen, I must also strive to understand the meaning, at that particular moment in my life.

To place myself in God's hands is to admit I don't have all the answers. It means I must be humble, patient, and willing to witness to the Gospel message of Jesus. I cannot allow myself to slip into despair. I cannot waste time in a personal pity-party. I must be able to show kindness, even when it is met with rejection, perhaps even hatred. I must quit trying to play God, and strive to be with God. When I make my will the criterion of what is good and evil, I reject God and His grace, but when I place my life in His Hands I also embrace grace. So begins my prayer, "Into your hands, Lord, I place my life!"

Sharing Our Losses...

A Journey of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love

Have you ever felt that your life was in the middle of a great storm? You weren't sure how or when it would end, or where it might take you. Perhaps you were frightened, disoriented, felt lost, angry numb, guilty, sad, or alone. If you have experienced a recent loss in your life due to a divorce, separation, the death of a loved one, loss of a job, loss of a pregnancy, prolonged illness, you may have known and experienced some of those emotions.

During Lent, our St James community began a series of five sessions entitled "Sharing Our Losses." The sessions are offered both in the early afternoon (Wed 1-2:30pm) and evening (Tues 6-8:30pm). There is time for prayer, sharing and reflection. It is the hope of our facilitators that this journey will help your healing process, bringing new hope and inner peace. We know that God is the true healer, but we also believe that He works through each of us as we share His love with one another. We will provide a safe place and time for anyone who is hurting. As such, all sharing will be confidential and respectfully received. This is not an attempt to provide professional counseling, but rather to share personal stories with others who are also experiencing loss. The facilitators will be with you as guides, fellow travelers who, like you, are searching for answers, new direction, and a continual rebirth of Christ's love in our hearts. We are all broken in some way; we all need Christ and the hope, peace, joy, and love that only a relationship with Him can provide.

Sessions began last week, but it's not too late to begin attending. We meet this week in the Gasper Room on March 3 in the evening and March 4 in the afternoon.






