

This weekend as we celebrate the 5th Sunday of Lent, we realize Holy Week is coming upon us next weekend! But this weekend we celebrate with the St. Joseph Table. 



Someone is Watching and Wondering



The past few months our St. James family has faced much loss, and I know I have asked, "How much more, Lord?"

There are times when I have felt despair and hopelessness, yet there are also times when I felt great hope. Father Mike has heard my statement more than once: "I think God is on Sabbatical Leave." He patiently smiles and continues to assure me that God is always present, and not to give up.

Recently I read an article in AARP Magazine titled: The Paradox of Prayer . Three statements really stood out: 1. "Prayer is an action. It makes you feel like you're doing something, even if it hasn't yet helped." 2. "The best mode of prayer at the moment (is) to help others." and 3. Music, like prayer, has a way of building our faith, and those songs have a way of causing us to remember what the Lord has done." There have been many times when my private prayer-life felt very dry, and as I mentioned earlier this Lenten Season, there are days when all I can pray is "Thank you." In reading this article and reflecting on the above words, however, I found both comfort and hope. Thinking of prayer as action, and song is what I need at this moment in my life. I feel closest to God when I am active, whether listening to others, working in my gardens, participating in liturgy, walking, bicycling, knitting, or simply offering a helping hand. On the flip side, when I have nothing to occupy my mind, when I'm just sitting alone, those feelings of hopelessness and despair rear their ugly heads. However, those feeling dissipate by simply reading a book, watching birds, listening to music, studying, looking through family pictures, or writing down my thoughts. Actions seems to clear my mind, and refocuses my thoughts to all the blessings I have received. I feel a lightness within myself, and I feel a greater desire for His presence and grace. The article ended thusly: "So we stood there. . .two people who'd felt let down by prayer, who struggled to understand the meaning of it, yet who just could not bring themselves to give it up. And maybe that's the greatest power of prayer: It winds around our world like a billion skeins of ribbon, binding people who have never met, linking cultures that otherwise have no hope of understanding one another-and then it shoots heavenward like a spiritual supernova, joining all of humanity in an instinctive reach for eternity."

I hope you feel the power of these words, and the presence of our Lord as you continue to pray, perhaps struggling like me. I offer, however, that you don't despair; He is with you!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY IS APRIL 12



Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday following Easter. Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of Divine Mercy on that day.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina (making her Saint

Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church.

Blessed John Paul II set aside this day as a day of forgiveness of sin and punishment due to sin (with sacramental confession 20 days before or after and receiving Holy Communion).

He has even prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the prayer that Jesus gave her, at the saint's tomb. Given all these connections to Divine Mercy and St. Faustina, is it any wonder that Pope John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday (the evening before the feast day), which fell that year on April 3, 2005.

Our Divine Mercy celebration at St. James will be April 12 with Eucharistic Adoration from 2-4 p.m., including opportunities for Confession, private devotion, praying and singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction.
