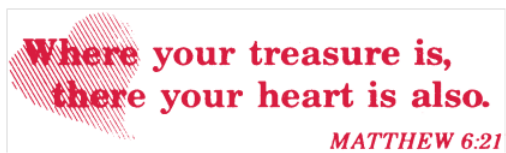

From the Pastor's Pen

I stood at the finish line cheering and screaming along with many others! I was so wrapped up in the excitement of the event that I almost forgot who I was cheering for. And then my sister standing next to me pointed and said, "There he is!!!" And we all cheered as my nephew crossed the finish line. It was just a 400meter dash but from the sounds of the crowd you would have thought it was a marathon! As my nephew later displayed his medal for winning, he beamed from ear to ear!

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday. We recall and celebrate Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. As I think about the day, I wonder just how crazy and chaotic the city was in Jesus' day as he rode in on that donkey. How many people understood and knew who he was? How many people were excited and making the news known to others, "Sing Hosannas, to the King of David!" Today as we lift high our palm branches we remember those joyful cries and what this week ahead means for us.

Every so often we might see someone walking along the side of the road carrying a wooden cross. I've even seen one such person carrying a cross that had a pair of roller skates strapped to the end. Just when I thought I had seen it all, I was stunned by what I saw passing me on the highway. I was traveling south on 291 to merge onto I-70 East. Just before I turned off 291, a white pickup passed me. Strapped to the back of the pickup, laying flat tilted up at an angle, was a crucifix. There was what appeared to be wood in the pickup bed and this was laying on it. The bottom part of the cross extended down towards the ground past the tailgate. I'm not sure message this person was trying to convey or the reason for hauling the cross they way it was strapped to the pickup. To me, it looked like it could easily break free and slide right down onto the ground into traffic. I can still picture that scene in my mind's eye. I'm not sure whether to approve or disapprove of what I saw. I guess what bothered me the most was the way the cross appeared to be just there and not strapped down too securely. All I could say as the pickup flew by was, "Hold on Jesus!"

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and enter into Holy Week, may our hearts and minds be open to seeing Jesus present in our midst as we share this great story of our faith.

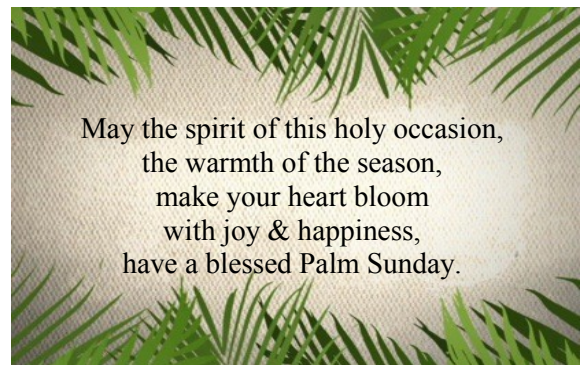

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today marks the beginning of the most sacred week for Christians throughout the world. **Holy Week** is not just a time of remembrance, rather it is the time for each of us to walk with Jesus, to hear His words, share His meal, feel His pain, and rejoice at His resurrection. It is the time for us to renew our commitment to walk with Him, today and every day, in service to His people. It is the time to surrender to His light, embracing with clean hearts, fresh eyes, and open minds the **Hope, Peace, Joy** and **Love** that only He can give.

Today's liturgy begins with these words: "Dear brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by (prayer) penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that He entered His own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, **following in His footsteps, so that, being made by His grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in His resurrection and in His life.**" I highlight these last words because I feel there are times when we forget that our life journey is also Christ's life journey. He walked this earth just as we do, and He continues to walk with each of us every day. He is our beloved friend and companion. It seems only fitting, therefore, that we set aside this week every year to walk with Him to Jerusalem, to enter the Upper Room, to go to Golgotha, and to the Tomb. Let Him cleanse us as He washed the disciples feet. Let Him nourish us around the Passover table. Let us feel the weight of His cross, and the pain of His suffering. Let us lift His body, and gently carry it to the tomb. Let us wait in Vigil through the night, praying for understanding, strength, forgiveness, and courage to face the new day, the day of His resurrection. Let us celebrate this sacred week, participate in the **Triduum**, and rejoice anew at His love.

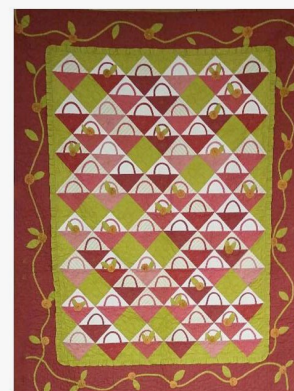

The Triduum: One Mass ~ Three Days

The Triduum is the holiest time in our Liturgical Calendar. It is the most important part of Salvation History as Christ, in those three days, fulfilled the promise of God when He said He would send a Savior who would reconcile humanity to Himself.

There is but one Mass celebrated over 3 days during the Triduum beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and ending at the close of the Easter Vigil on Saturday

Our Liturgy reflects our solemn, adoring and anguished spirit. *The Mass of the Lord's Supper* on **Holy Thursday** does not "end." There is no "Go forth" or "Thanks be to God." There is only the procession of Christ to His place of repose and the silent, prayerful adoration of the faithful that stay watch with Him as He endures His Passion (akin to the Apostles as Christ led them to the Garden of Gethsemane to keep watch as He began His Agony in the Garden).

On **Good Friday**, there is "no Mass." Again, this is because technically, the Mass from Holy Thursday has not ended.

Finally, on Saturday, we arrive at our **Easter Vigil**. This special vigil is held after sundown. This is significant because this darkness is indicative of the spiritual darkness we are experiencing as we await the Light of the World.

This vigil does not start with the typical "opening Mass prayers" we're used to. Instead, the priest blesses a special fire which is typically made of Holy Oils from the previous year, salt, and twigs. This special fire is the first light we see and is symbolic of the Resurrection. This light is what's used to light our brand new Paschal Candle (the Christ Candle), and after the Candle is lit, the light begins to spread throughout the Church, from member to member, as a flame is passed between individual candles all are given at the opening of Mass.

As this Vigil Mass commences, we finally are able to hear again the priest's command to "Go Forth" and respond with a jubilant "Thanks be to God!" We acknowledge that the sacred Triduum that marks Christ's Sacrifice has reached its fulfillment, and we take our charge to "Go Forth" with zeal. We are charged to take the message of Salvation to all people who still "live in darkness."

So, now you see why there is but one Mass celebrated over these three days.

As these three days recall the three long days of Christ's consummation by the Fire of His Love, it is our opportunity to offer these three days in solidarity with Him.
