

From the Pastor's Pen

I was once asked by a parent, "Father, why aren't you teaching our children the traditions anymore?" And without hesitation I responded, "So what traditions do you want me to teach your child and why? And not 'Just because we've always done it." Later when I thought a bit more about it, what I should have said was, "Why aren't YOU teaching your child the traditions?"

Each of us has various family traditions and customs that we celebrate and share each year. They hold meaning for us when the traditions are lived out and shared with others. As we celebrated the Triduum and Easter, we celebrated many traditions and rituals. Beginning with Palm Sunday and the Procession with Palms to the reading of the Passion to Holy Thursday and the Washing of the Feet and the Remembrance of the Last Supper, and Jesus' words to us, "Do this in remembrance of me," to Good Friday and Venerating the Cross to Easter Vigil and the new fire and the new light, the readings of creation, the stories of our salvation, to Easter Sunday and the Resurrection. All these many days and events hold meaning and ritual and tradition for us. Some of it is understood through reading about it and making connections, other times it can only be understood when lived.

Each year as we celebrate Good Friday and the Veneration of the Cross, I cherish the time to stand a and watch as each person comes forward. I remember year-to-year how different ones have approached. Some whose health has declined need the assistance of another. Some can no longer kneel down and easily get back up. For others, who were once scared and afraid to reach out and touch the cross without mom or dad's hand, now step forward on their own and embrace. Whatever this ritual means to us, we express it by doing it. Our faith isn't just learned from books, it is lived. Why do we do the things we do?

What does a single rose mean? It depends upon what day it is. One tradition on Mother's Day is that families wear a single white rose in memory of Mom and a single red rose in honor of Mom still living. No words are spoken, we just see and know.

What traditions do we treasure in our lives? What family traditions and customs do we pass on to our children? Do we do so just because that's what we've always done or do we ourselves truly understand what and why we do what we do?

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Do you know what it's all about and what it means to our faith? If not, join us and find out.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As many of you know the Easter Vigil always begins in darkness. The Pascal Candle is processed into the church, the individual candles of worshipers are lit from it, and the Easter Proclamation/ Exsultet is sung by these flickering lights. It is quite

unusual, in this modern age, to have only candle light for illumination, and yet it is quite appropriate as we hear these opening words: "Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation, around God's throne! Jesus Christ, Our King is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendor, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever!" At that moment, in the semidarkness, with faces illuminated by single candles, there is a real sense that Yes, indeed, Jesus is the Light of the World. We followed His star at Christmas, journeyed through the dark, sometimes cold winter, prayed for forgiveness during Lent, and now we rejoice in the light of His resurrection.


When I reflect on my journey through life, I cannot miss those times of darkness, even despair, but always there is light. Perhaps dim at first, but eventually re-illuminating the present with joy and hope for the future. Perhaps the light comes with words or comfort, an embrace, a soft breeze, bright sunshine, or gentle rain. Sometimes the light is hidden in a book, painting, or music. Perhaps it bursts forth all around me in new life. I also find light flowing from God's words. For example Psalm 27 states: "The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom should I fear?"

Especially during this Easter Season I try to name my fears, and give them to Jesus, my light, my salvation. Over the years my fears have definitely changed. I no longer fear the future, or lack of security. I know God provides. What I fear the most is succumbing to loneliness. I

have always been surrounded by people, at work, at home, at leisure. Now I find many times when it is only me. It feels empty, strange, and yes frightening. Then I remember Jesus' promise: "I am with you always!" and I don't feel so lost. I feel His love and comfort, and I Look to His Light,

He also announced a change in leadership at our sister parish that is expected to take place around Easter; a new pastor, Padre Hilton Rodriquez. C.PP.S., will be at the helm. Mark asked that we at Saint James be patient as the new pastor gets to know his new congregation and their needs over the next few months.

Due to the great generosity of the people of St. James we are pleased to inform that we will send the new pastor \$4,000 to assist in the needs of the sister parish. They are a growing parish, just like us; and this kind of support will be helpful.






