

### Someone is Watching and Wondering



How often do you hear the words "Peace be with you?" I am relatively certain that in your mind you immediately thought, "And with your spirit." For Catholics, regardless of how often we attend Mass, this dialogue is all too familiar. Have you ever stopped to consider the origin of these words, or what they mean to use as followers of Jesus Christ?

When Jesus appeared to His disciples, following the resurrection, He did not rebuke them for fleeing from Him or hiding in fear. He didn't bring up any of the painful, embarrassing events of the past few days. He never even acknowledged Peter's denial. Instead He came to them with a heart full of love, and wished them peace. We hear so many familiar stories of Jesus' unconditional love. Think of the Samaritan women, the criminal crucified with Jesus, the women accused of adultery, the man possessed with demons, the tax collector. Jesus doesn't reject them, but rather offered compassion, healing, and hope. I think that is precisely what He offers to us. No matter how often we sin, or how grievous our offenses, God is ready to forgive us and release us from guilt. He wants us to be reconciled with Him. As long as we don't reject Him, caste Him from our lives, His peace, that passes all understanding, remains. We shouldn't be confused though, His peace is not the same as the peace of this world (John 14:27). Worldly peace depends on favorable circumstances such as getting our way, things going as we expect, and all our problems being easily managed. Instead, Jesus' peace brings a quiet confidence in our hearts; guidance for challenging situations. It is a peace that is totally dependent on the never ending love of God. His peace allows us to say "I belong to Jesus the Lord, and I know he will never abandon me!" As His followers, Jesus' gift of peace should spill over into our relationships with each other. Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." (John 20:21) His peace and love empowers us to go forth to love and serve one another with the same mercy and love He has shown us.

#### May you always know His Peace!

### The Sacrament of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation enriches the baptized with the strength of the Holy Spirit so that they can better witness to Christ in word and deed. Through Confirmation, Christians strengthen their bond with the Church and become better equipped to carry out the Church's mission of love and service.

Many people think of the laying on of hands, which signifies the descent of the Holy Spirit, as the central act in the Sacrament of Confirmation. The essential element, however, is the anointing of the confirmand (the person being confirmed) with chrism (an aromatic oil that has been consecrated by the bishop, accompanied by the words "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit" .This seal is a consecration, representing the safeguarding by the Holy Spirit of the graces conferred on the Christian at Baptism.
