

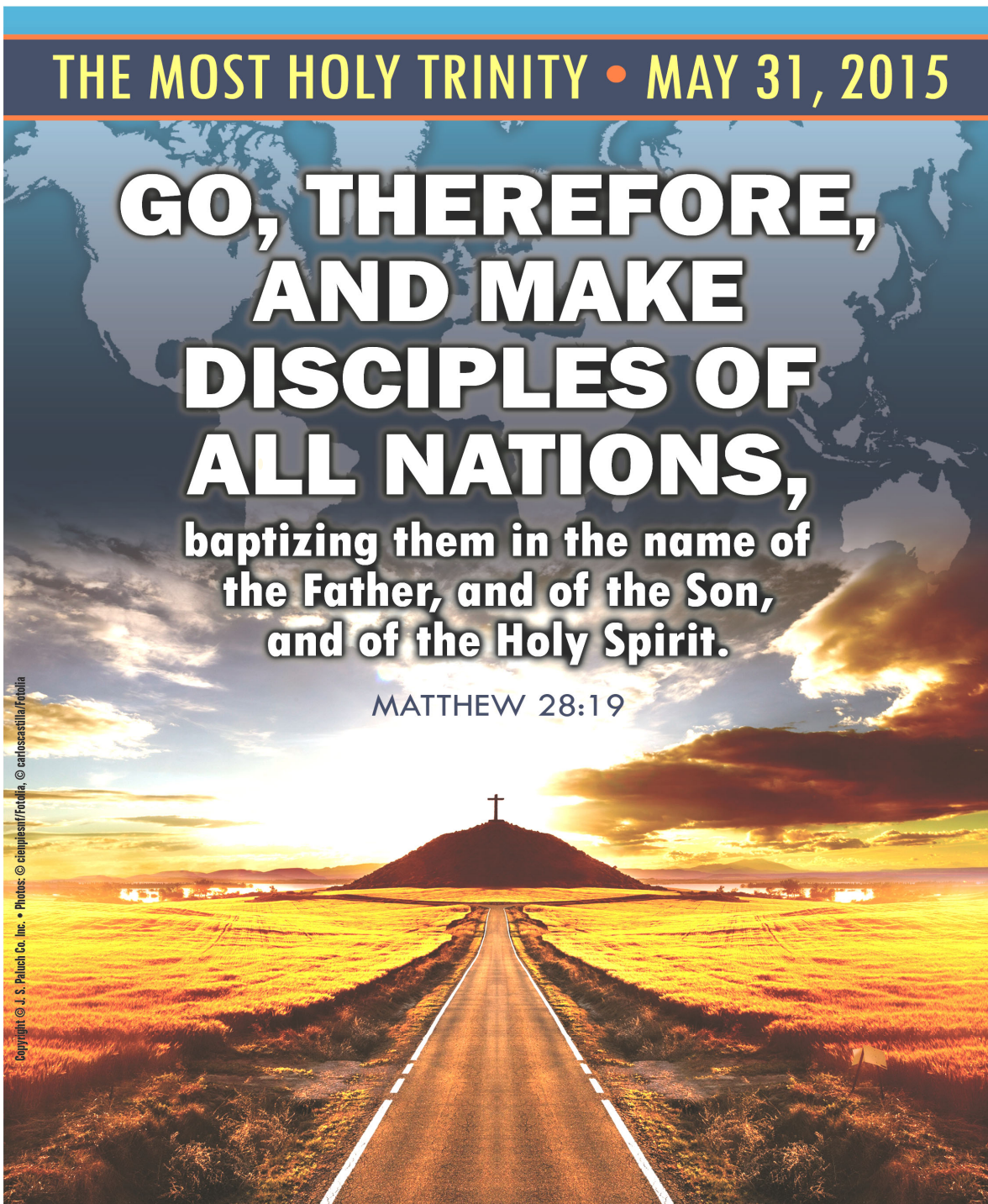

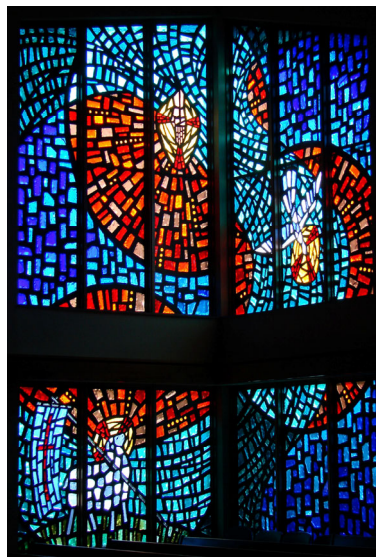


MUSIC FOR A SACRED SPACE

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over the years I have seen many depictions of the Holy Trinity, but I think our St. James Trinity window is one of the most beautiful. The colors are vivid and the depictions expressive. As the waters of baptism join the Father, Spirit, and Son in this glass art, it also brings each of us into their union. We are created by the Father, strengthened by the Spirit, and through baptism, joined to the Son; we become part of His body. So today as we

celebrate the Holy Trinity, I feel it appropriate to focus on what unites the Father, Son, and Spirit, and how our baptism completes the circle that is only partially depicted in our window.

I think one of the most beautiful scriptural descriptions of the Triune God is found in Chapter 14 of John's Gospel. It begins with Jesus' words, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." Later he states: "Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The father who dwells in me is doing his works. . . If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will Ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth. . . it remains in you. . . and will not leave you orphans. . . In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me and I am in you." Toward the end Jesus reaffirms: "The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have told you." I find such assurance in these words.

Upon further reflection, I have come to realize what a priceless gift I first received in the waters of baptism. I was nearly 12 years old, and I can honestly say that as I became aware of God's abundant grace, in the baptismal waters, I was forever changed. Oh, I have resisted the Spirit's promptings more than once, but I always felt called to return to Jesus' loving embrace. My journey so far has been full of peaks and valleys; I have stumbled and fallen flat on my face, but so far I always regained my footing. The Father's love is always with me, whether I welcome or reject it. Jesus showed the extent of that love on Golgotha, and the Spirit continues to teach, guide, and comfort me as I continue to journey through life. Today, especially I ask that the circle of triune love which surrounds me will one day be complete, and that I will be worthy of His promises.

The Promise of Our Lady of Fatima "I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me."

THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared 6 times to three shepherd children; Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta; between May 13 and October 13, 1917. She came to the little village of Fatima which had remained faithful to the Catholic Church during the recent persecutions by the government. Our Lady came with a message from God to every man, woman, and child of our century.

Our Lady of Fatima promised that the whole world would be in peace, and that many souls would go to Heaven if Her requests were listened to and obeyed. She told us that war is a punishment for sin; that God would punish the world for its sins in our time by means of war, hunger, persecution of the Church and persecution of the Holy Father, the Pope, unless we listened to and obeyed the command of God. At Fatima, Pope John Paul II said on May 13, 2000; "the message of Fatima is more relevant and more urgent " then when Our Lady first appeared. The message is an appeal of our Heavenly Mother, Who sees us in great danger and Who comes to offer Her help and advice. Her message is also a prophesy, a clear indication of what was about to transpire in the

20th century, and what is still going to happen infallibly in the near future, depending on our response to Her requests.

THE MIRACLE

As a great sign of the whole message truly coming from God, a marvelous miracle was worked in the sky above Fatima before 70,000 witnesses on October 13, 1917 at the time, date and place that Lucy and the other two children had prophesized in the name of Our Lady of Fatima.

The children were told by Our Lady that God would perform a miracle so that people would believe in the apparitions. The date the children was October 13, 1917, in Fatima. On that date, 70,000 people came to see the phenomenon. The miracle occurred with the sun. All could stare perfectly at the sun without blinking, or even hurting their eyes. While all were watching the sun, it rotated, got large and small, got close to the people, and got far away from them. The sun " danced ". Every single person who was there testified to seeing the sun dance, even non- believers who immediately dropped onto their knees and begged for forgiveness.

MIRACLES TODAY

Our Lady of Fatima continues to work miracles today through Fatima water which is sent from Fatima, Portugal around the world. This Fatima water sprang up in Fatima at the spot the Bishop told people to dig, very near where Our Lady appeared at the Cova de Iria (the Cove of Peace) in Fatima. The water is known to cure people with sicknesses and poor health. Still, other people are cured when they go on pilgrimage to Fatima, which is about 90 miles north of Lisbon, Portugal.
