From the Pastor's Pen

This year marks the 200th Anniversary of the founding of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Founded in 1815 by St. Gaspar del Bufalo, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood have been sharing God's reconciling message of love with the world. St. Gaspar was a preacher filled with the spirituality of the Precious Blood. It was his dream to one day have a thousand tongues to draw all people to the Blood of Christ.

St. Gaspar del Bufalo founded the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in Giano, Italy, on August 15, 1815. In the 10th century abbey of San Felice, our founder initiated a society of apostolic life for the purpose of preaching missions and retreats, renewing the Church and proclaiming the salvation that comes through the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ.

We, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood of the Kansas City Province, live out our mission today in a variety of ministries. We are engaged in parish ministry. We are part of the day-to-day lives of our parishioners. We proclaim the Word around the world, supporting the Church in Vietnam. We bring hope and proclaim the dignity of all people in places where there is great poverty and oppression. We seek to be ambassadors of reconciliation in a multi-cultural world filled with too much violence. We follow the example of St. Gaspar, preaching missions and retreats. We seek to inspire a sense of excitement about our faith in communities in need of renewal and reinvigoration.

We teach, in parochial schools, helping people to improve their lives through knowledge infused with faith. We offer pastoral care to the sick, to college students, to prisoners, to men and women in the military, to our sisters in the Precious Blood. As chaplains in hospitals and nursing homes, in jails and in convents, in the military and on college campuses, we proclaim the saving power of the Precious Blood to God's people who are often away from home, separated from those they love, or anxious about the changing circumstances of their lives. While we are committed to serving the needs of those we have served in the past, we are also open to hearing the call that leads us to new ministries. Sometimes this means leaving one ministry behind in order to meet a more pressing need. Though this is not always easy, we are committed to responding to the cry of the Blood wherever it may lead us.

As we celebrate our past we look ahead to our future. In celebration of our 200th Anniversary, we will be celebrating July 1, Feast of the Precious Blood with a community gathering in Rome and then on Sunday, August 16, we will celebrate our Founding with a 4pm Mass here at St. James followed by a dinner and celebration at Precious Blood Center. We invite you to join us for this great celebration.

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 12



Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important liturgical day in the Catholic Church.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them.

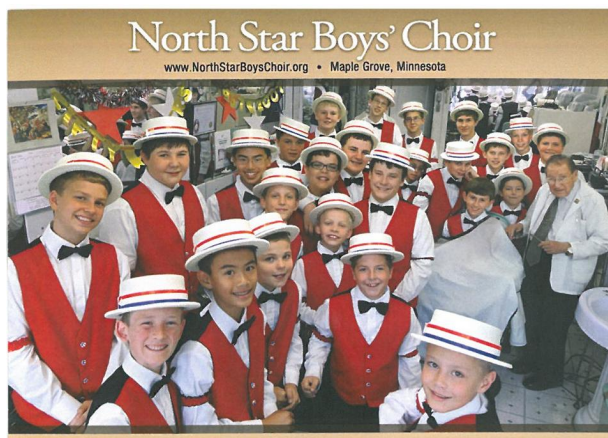
The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.

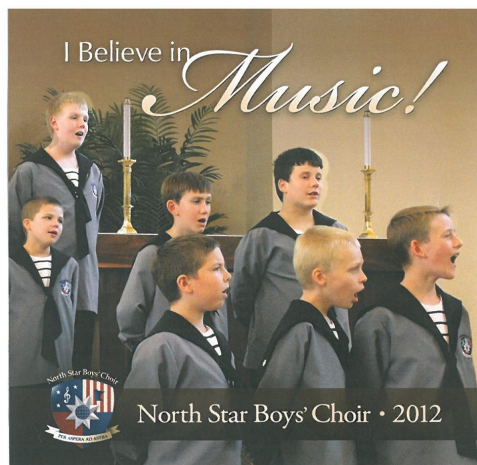
**Voices Of Gold

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In preparing to write today's piece I thought it appropriate to include a brief history of the "Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ." It was the year 1246 when Bishop Robert de Thorete of the diocese of Liege, Belgium, at the suggestion of St. Juliana of Mont Comillon, convened a synod and instituted the celebration of this feast. It began to spread, and on September 8, 1264 Pope Urban IV issued the papal bull "*Transitunus*, establishing *Corpus et Sanguis Christi* as a universal feast of the Church. It was to

be celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. Pope Urban also requested composition of the office (the official prayers of the Church) by Thomas Aquinas. These prayers are the source of the hymns *Pange Lingua Gloriosi* and *Tantum Ergo Sacramentum*. For centuries after the celebration of the Mass, the feast was continued with a procession, in which the Sacred Host was carried throughout the town, accompanied by hymns, litanies and veneration of the Body of Christ. This is a time when Catholics witness to the entire world, the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Although institution of the Eucharist is celebrated on Holy Thursday, that liturgy also commemorates the priesthood, the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, and the *mandatum*. Through the example of Jesus washing the disciples' feet, we are commanded to "love and serve one another." Today's feast is focused on the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

However, when reflecting on today's readings I came to a renewed understanding of the meaning to "becoming what we eat." Like the transformation of the bread and wine brought to the altar, we who partake of the body and blood of Christ should embrace the transformation God desires to make in our lives. We should become the living presence of Christ to the world. We must make His *mandatum* the essence of our interactions with one another. We must embrace His love and forgiveness of our sinfulness by loving and forgiving all His children. We must acknowledge our "ancestors ate manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that came down from heaven, that one may eat it and not die." (John 6:49-50) As we eat "this meal" we are acknowledging our dependence on Christ, and our interdependence on one another. We are recognizing our relationships as brothers and sisters. We are accepting our mission to be "little Christs" to the world. Our lives should be a reflection of His "good news." Each day we should open ourselves to His will, to follow in His footsteps, to reflect His light to the world. This Feast should serve to remind us, as in deed every time we receive communion reminds us, that we are all part of the "Body of Christ," and cannot function isolated and alone. Today, reach out, embrace the other with Jesus' love and peace.

Gardening Tasks for June



Pinch back annuals or any other plants that might be getting a little leggy. Pinch your Chrysanthemums to encourage them to be bushier and have more blossoms. Pinch them again, every 6 inches or so, as they grow.

This is an excellent month to pick out a few new perennials, and plant them in the garden.

Check your Roses for mildew, aphid, black-spot or other disease problems or insect infestations, and if they appear take steps to control them right away. Your roses will need to be fertilized each month through the summer.

Deadhead your annuals to encourage continued flowering. Remove dead foliage from your spring flowering bulbs, but only after it has died back naturally. Continue thinning your vegetable seedlings to provide ample room for growth.

Fertilize the lawn this month. It's not too late to re-seed or over-seed the lawn. Be certain to keep newly seeded areas well watered.
