Someone is Watching and Wondering



As RCIA Director I talk to many people who express interest in the Catholic Church. Two of the first questions I ask are: Why do you desire to become a Catholic? What/Who brings you here? The most frequent responses are: I have family or friends who are catholic; My parents are joining; I'm marrying a Catholic; I like the traditions and ritual; or I'm not sure. It seems to me these responses point to a common thread or need, namely a desire for "spirituality" and "belonging."

Richard Mc Brien describes spirituality as experiencing God, resulting in transformation of our consciousness and lives. Since God is available to everyone, spirituality is not exclusively Christian, but Christian spirituality is a life given to the Holy Spirit, and incorporation into the Body of Jesus Christ. It is surrendering to "God the Creator in a life of faith, hope, love, and service. It is *visionary, sacramental, relational, and transformational.*" (*Catholicism*, 1058.) It seems to me, this concept of spirituality is the cornerstone of catechesis for the RCIA Journey.

First, the inquirer must begin to recognize God's presence in the ordinary. Every experience of God is unique and personal; the touch of wind, the smell of roses, the warmth of the sun, the small hand of a child, the kiss of a loved one, the tragedy of poverty, hunger and suffering, the violence of war, terminal illness or death of a relative or friend. God is present in these experiences, leading our lives by a golden thread, weaving a unique pattern for each of us. When we recognize His presence in these every day experiences, we make a choice to embrace His way.

Second, the experience transforms the catechumen. They feel and act differently, opening themselves to God's gift of agape; embracing, cherishing, and sharing it. Their actions reflect His unconditional love toward all of creation.

Finally, others can see the Holy Spirit living and working in the lives of the Elect. Their life becomes one of faith, hope and service. They become visionary, sacramental, relational, and transformational to others.

This is the path all Catholics must follow. Learning doctrine and attending Mass at least once a week is not enough. Our strength as Christians, lies in embracing the whole of human life, experiencing God in that wholeness, and through our actions, witnessing to the saving grace of Jesus Christ. I believe the catechumenal journey continues throughout life, until we experience the joy of seeing God and being glorified with Him. I hope each of you will journey with our RCIA team and individuals seeking initiation. Share your experiences of God freely and look for ways God transforms your life. Refresh yourself each and every day by welcoming and sharing God's love.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day - July 14



Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be declared a Saint. She was informally known as Lily of the Mohawks. Born near Auriesville, NY, she suffered from smallpox as a young child, which scarred her face and greatly weakened her eyes. She converted to Roman Catholicism at age nineteen and was renamed Kateri. She settled for the remaining years of her life at the Jesuit mission village of Kahnawake, south of Montreal in New France, now Canada.

Tekakwitha took a devout vow of perpetual virginity. She was baptized in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena. Upon her death at the age of 24, minutes after her death, witnesses say her scars vanished and she appeared radiant and beautiful. Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Roman Catholic Church.

She was beatified in 1980 under the pontificate of Pope John Paul II and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October, 21 October 2012. Various miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her.

St. Bonaventure Feast Day - July 15



Born Giovanni di Fidanza in Tuscany in 1221, he received the name Bonaventure as the result of an exclamation of St. Francis of Assisi, when, in response to the pleading of the child's mother, the saint prayed for John's recovery from a dangerous illness, and, foreseeing the future greatness of the little John, cried out "O Buona ventura"- O good fortune!

At the age of twenty-two he entered the Franciscan Order. He steered the Franciscans on a moderate and intellectual course that made them the most prominent order in the Catholic Church until the coming of the Jesuits. His theology was marked by an attempt completely to integrate faith and reason. He thought of Christ as the "one true master" who offers humans knowledge that begins in faith, is developed through rational understanding, and is perfected by mystical union with God.

He was canonized in 1484 by Pope Sixtus IV, and ranked along with Thomas Aquinas as the greatest of the Doctors of the Church. He is regarded as one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages.

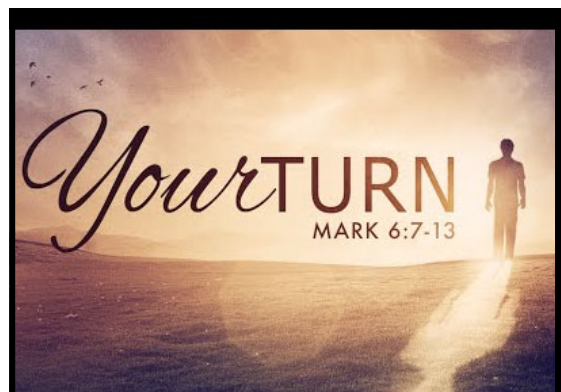
Summer 850 Prayer Challenge

Our Amazing Kids

Our St. James kids are amazing! As you probably remember, we began taking up a children's collection two years ago. We had had quite a few requests for a children's collection, but it wasn't something St James had ever done and we weren't sure how well-received it would be. We were concerned



that parents would feel like we were all about the money and would be unhappy that we were talking about money with their children. It tends to be a rather sensitive

subject. We paired the collection with a unit on stewardship so that our students would know that what we were encouraging them to do was to give back to God in some way to show their gratitude for His many blessings to them. It doesn't have to be cash, it can be helpful actions or kind words.

The response was very heartening! The yellow envelopes in the narthex have flown out of the tray and have been filled out with all kinds of good deeds and helping hands. We'd like to see the children's bowl filled with yellow envelopes — if your child is unsure where to find them or needs help filling them out, please give them a hand — it's a big step.

We were also very impressed with the money they have donated. We have collected over \$15,000 in the children's collection. The money is held in a segregated account for the donation of an item for the new church. Because children tend to be visual, we want the donations to be used for something that the kids can see and touch, whether that be a statue or a prayer bench, etc. No decision has been made yet — way too early — on exactly what will be funded by the children's collection, but it is held for the new church.

We will be repeating a unit on stewardship again this fall. Not to be "all about the money" but to encourage our children to be looking for ways to show their gratitude at least weekly, if not daily.
