A few years ago the Pacific Province folded and we are now two provinces in the U.S. So in addition to celebrating our 200th anniversary, we will also be celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Kansas City Province.

A famous quote from our founder, St. Gaspar, is "I wished I had a thousand tongues to proclaim the merits of the precious blood." And so we are hoping for a thousand tongues to join us on August 16 to celebrate with us. We will begin with Eucharist at 4pm here at St. James and then continue our celebration with dinner and festivities at Precious Blood Center. All our invited as we celebrate the end of summer and the presence of our Community.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

CATECHESIS

Catechetical formation is an essential part of initiation into the Catholic church, and the **primary** minister of initiation in the RCIA is the **parish community**. The quality of lives within the community, their concern and interest for one another, the manner of worship, the commitment to social justice and outreach activities, all of this is the where and how of the RCIA. People come to a particular community to become part of that community. It is the community's responsibility not only to welcome them, but to show the interested persons what makes the community distinctive, warm, involved, and what makes it a Catholic Christian community. Therefore, it is essential that all members of the community understand their responsibility in the adult initiation process.

Catechesis is an echoing of the gospel. It is a ministry of the word that proclaims and lives the good word of God's grace; salvation in Jesus. It is a full and robust action that invites the full person to a response in faith, a response embodied in charity and justice. The full person is called and challenged through good catechesis.

Catechesis is concerned with helping the catechumen name their experiences of God, and respond to those experiences. Additionally, the catechumen needs to come to know the story of the community named Catholic and how, throughout the centuries, we have come to name the experience of God in our midst. If the period of the pre-catechumenate was a time for storytelling, the period of the catechumenate develops that story into a dialogue. We don't abandon the storytelling and faith-sharing, but we expand it to include the particular story of our Catholic faith.

Catechesis is not about passing information. It is about enlivening faith. How can we incorporate the great symbols of our community, including the rich word symbols of doctrine, to empower and enliven their faith? This is the exciting challenge of catechesis: making the word of God, in scripture and as articulated in the faith of the community, credible and meaningful. This is not a watering down of the word of God, but rather a raising up of that word so that it has a bearing on ordinary life.

Therefore, catechesis in the RCIA is designed for adults, who after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God. They begin the journey of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts, and leads them to the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. May each of us rejoice daily in God's good news.

Back to School Items - Tax Free Weekend: August 7 - 9



Did you know that the Back to School Season is the 2nd largest selling season for retailers ?

This means that prices for back to school items, whether it be school supplies, clothing, and shoes, are incredibly competitive this time of year.

And, what's even better is that this coming Friday, Saturday, and Sunday (Aug. 7 - 9), no sales tax will be charged on certain "back to school" items.




