

From the Pastor's Pen

We, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, an international community of priests, brothers, and lay associates today celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of our community and the 50th anniversary of the Kansas City Province. We thank all of you for joining us in prayer and celebration today as we celebrate this great milestone.

For the past three years our community has been on a journey leading up to today. In 2012, we began by remembering and celebrating our history. In 2013, we focused on our charism of reconciliation and this past year we have focused on our mission of responding to the cry of the Blood in the world. Our theme has been, "The Dream Continues." It was our founder's dream and famous saying, "I wish I had a thousand tongues to proclaim the merits of the most Precious Blood." As sons of St. Gaspar, we continue to live the dream today as we continue to minister throughout the world.

I grew up in a Precious Blood parish in WaKeeney, KS. I had the privilege to meet and get to know many of the members, as they would travel to western Kansas for various community gatherings. We were blessed to host not only my ordination but also the ordination of one other member. Although growing up I never fully understood the difference between a religious community priest and a diocesan priest. I never questioned where I felt called to serve once I began to discern my own journey to religious life. It is truly within the community that I have found a place to call home and to serve with others in responding to the cry of the blood. Never did I ever dream as young boy where my life and saying yes to God and to the community would lead me.

I still recall the first time meeting Fr. Joe Nassal, who was at that time the Vocation Director. It was a Friday after school and my grandmother had asked me to go visit my great aunt in the hospital to cheer her up. She said, "Oh by the way, wear your clown costume." So I did and that's how I was dressed when Fr. Joe first met me. It was years later that I learned the community story of how all the "clowns and characters" got sent out to Kansas City and California prior to the split in the 1965. As Fr. Joe said later after my ordination as he recalled our first meeting, "I knew he was one of us." Yes, we have our "clowns and characters" but that's what makes us who we are in sharing and serving the church. The clown sees the world in a different way and brings to light a message of hope, renewal, and life. We as Missionaries of the Precious Blood preach the word of God in a way that brings to life a message of hope and reconciliation though the Precious Blood of Jesus. Thank you for joining us in our celebration and may we continue to serve the church and continue to invite others to join us as priests, brothers, and lay associates to Continue to Live the Dream.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Recently I returned from a week full of wonder and awe. With two of my grandchildren I journeyed to the mountains of Colorado. Once again I was overwhelmed by the beauty and perfection of our natural world, where I always feel so very close to God. High up in the mountains, in the empty expanses of wide open coun-

try, sitting beside a rushing stream or a tranquil lake, or hiking through the forests I feel surrounded by His love. This time, however, I wondered if I was actually having a spiritual, or simply human experience. Let me explain.

According to Webster, **spiritual** refers to anything relating to or concerned with the soul-spirit or the sacred, and **spirituality** is an attachment to all that concerns the life of the soul. Indeed it is the quality of being spiritual. My experience of nature, therefore, seems simple and straight forward. Believing as I do that God created the entire universe, and perhaps beyond, then all of creation is sacred, and any true encounter with our natural world, although it involves all my human senses, is indeed a spiritual experience. I must admit, I find great peace and joy when I take the time to sit quietly, away from the business of everyday life, surrounded by trees, flowers, animals, all of natures beauty, and simple let myself be in God's presence experiencing His love.

My difficulty, or lack of understanding, however, surrounds my personhood, my life. Sometimes I am overwhelmed thinking about my life journey with its peaks and valleys, twists and turns, and the great unknowns of each day. Yes, I often ask myself, "Is my life and the journey I'm on sacred? Where is God in my story? Why don't I feel the same peace and joy within myself, in the quietness at the end of the day? Why does His presence evade me?" There are times when my mind screams, "Father, where are you?" I hate to admit this so publically, and I am not equating myself with St. John of the Cross, but for me these times are the "Dark Night of my Soul." I struggle, I fight an inner battle, I even cry, yet miraculously the light always returns. At times it is music, words on a page, or yes, even something on television, but I feel rescued. I feel hope. I feel the strength to go on, continue the journey, and know the truth that God is near and I can trust Him. I will know His love, His forgiveness, His guidance once again. I don't need to put on a happy face, rather I need to surrender myself to His care. I have to let go of my need to control every aspect of life, and truly let Him dwell in me. It's a big order, but I need to realize that I am as much a part of God's creation as is the rest of the universe. I need to recognize that all human life is truly sacred and loved by God. I need to remember that Jesus died for all, that His love knows no limits. Remember His words on the cross: "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." Yes, when I am so angry with God, when it seems He has taken a long vacation and does not hear my prayers, when I feel so lost and alone, all I need to do is think about Jesus and how He suffers for me. Every time I feel abandoned, without direction, lost in the temptation of despair, He suffers too. When I need a reminder of His presence, it may come in the wind, rain, flowers, a newborn's cry, or the peace of a per-

son who is dying, I must embrace Him, and remember He sent His spirit for me to receive, just as He did for the disciples. This is His assurance that my being, and my life abide in His light and love. I found this quote, which I think expresses so much in just a few words. I hope you like it too.






