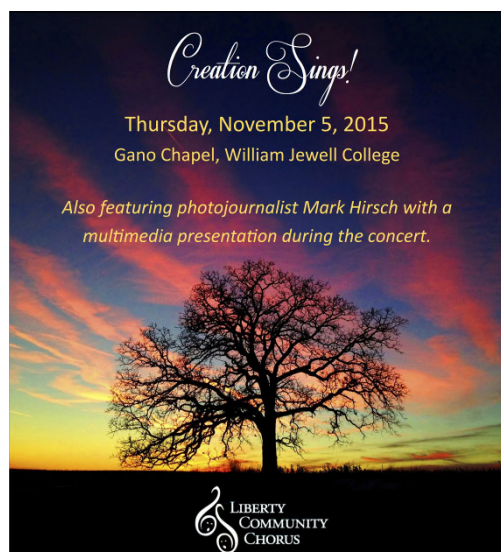

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Living in the Midwest we are fortunate to experience each season with distinct weather and changes in the appearance of our natural world. Each season also seems to have a unique atmosphere, inducing mental images and emotions. For example, the arrival of fall with its beautiful colors reminds us of bountiful harvests, the result

of our farmers' diligent spring planting and summer nurturing, while the fall equinox is a reminder of approaching shorter days and long, dark, colder nights. Emotions seem to run in high gear, and are all over the spectrum. There is great excitement generated by fall sports and various harvest festivals, while at the same time we are reminded of the brevity of life. The grass turns brown, leaves fall to the ground, gardens fade, and animals migrate or prepare for surviving the barrenness of winter. In our country, this atmosphere gave rise to two popular traditions which are only indirectly connected to Christianity (Halloween and Thanksgiving Day, separated by about one month).

Halloween (All Hallow e'en) takes its name from being the eve of All Saints, which we celebrate today. Its origins are from pre-Christian times, and traditional practices associated with this day are both delightful and earthy. The Celts in Wales, Ireland, Scotland and Brittany celebrated New Year's Day on Nov 1st. Under the religious leadership and influence of Druids, a festival was held the evening before to honor Samhain (pronounced Sow'en), their lord of death. While the celebration ushered in the season of winter, it was also a symbolic reminder of the mystery of human death. They believed the Samhain permitted the souls of the dead to return to their earthly homes on Oct 31st. Sinful souls could be released from eternal torment and eventually admitted into heaven, through gifts and sacrifices. Great, sacrificial fires were lit with the hope of rejuvenating the sun and warding off evil spirits, demons, and witches who roamed this night, greeting their season of darkness. These spirits played tricks on people, and the only way to be safe was through bribes of treats, or passing as one of them through dress and actions. Ghosts were only satisfied with a banquet table laid out in homes. When Christianity arrived in Celtic lands, there was an attempt to transfer this custom to the eve of All Souls Day, Nov. 2nd, and masked children would go from door to door praying for departed loved ones in return for a treat.

Knowledge and understanding change, but ancient customs and traditions remain, perhaps with a different twist or emphasis. Some parishes incorporate Halloween practices into their holy day eve Mass on October 31st, with children attending in costume, while other parishes organize pageants, with fanciful costumes, depicting saints. Whether or not you participated in any Halloween activities this year, it's roots are a reminder and a looking forward to today and tomorrow (All Saints and All Souls.) It is a time to examine our lives, turning away from sin and rededicating our lives to Jesus. We are each God's beloved children, and we remember the great communion of saints, both living and dead. We especially remember our friends and family who have left their earthly life to enter into eternal unity with our heavenly Father. We find hope and inner peace, knowing that the church is a community, a fellowship of all the faithful, both living and dead. This community, called by God, transformed in Christ, and living in the Spirit is most effectively expressed and celebrated when gathered for the Eucharist. Recently I found this quote from William Hazlitt: "Man is the only animal that laughs and weeps; for he is the only animal that is struck with the difference between what things are and what they ought to be." Although memories may bring tears and a reminder of all that is lost, I hope they also bring great joy and hope throughout this beautiful season, of what is yet to come.

We have a family! The staff at Hillcrest Hope are placing a family in our apartment this week. We, of course, won't have personal details to give out, but it's a 28 year old Mom with a 7 year old daughter and a 6 month old baby.

The apartment looks great – our thanks to everyone who made that happen. We have had so many lovely donations, and families have stepped up to make our apartment a place that a family could be comfortable in while they get back on their feet!

Our PB&J families have volunteered to provide the Move In Day meal, and our parish choir asked to donate the startup groceries for the family. But how can you help? We will be finding ways to support them along their journey and we will celebrate with them as they graduate the program. We are also sponsoring some donation drives in the coming months to benefit our family, and the other families in the program.

We are going to sponsor a drive to collect donations of simple medicines in early November. 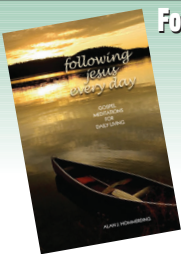

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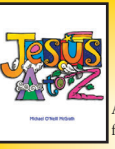


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
