

Update: Site Work on or Adjoining St. James

1. Our Landscaping Team has completed the selection process on trees that are diseased or dying. If they cannot be moved or protected, they will be removed.
2. Red Legacy Developers are committed to preparing a landscaping design between St. James and Liberty Commons which will incorporate moving or protecting selected trees. We will participate in the selection process.
3. The proposal to keep Stewart Road open to St. James during the project site work has been tabled for the present. We will continue to work with Red Legacy to minimize the period of time the road is closed. March is the probable time frame, subject to the impact of winter weather and recognition that the City will have the final say.

We will keep you apprised of activity.

From the Pastor's Pen

This Tuesday, December 8, we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. In the Constitution *Ineffabilis Deus* of 8 December, 854, Pius IX pronounced and defined that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin." Very simply, Mary was conceived and born without the stain of original sin. On this day, we also begin the Year of Mercy. Pope Francis will be opening the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This Holy Door will be a *Door of Mercy* through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instills hope. Pope Francis announced in March his intention to proclaim a holy year as a way for the church to "make more evident its mission to be a witness of mercy."

As Pope Francis stated in *Misericordiae Vultus* "I have chosen the date of 8 December because of its rich meaning in the recent history of the Church. In fact, I will open the Holy Door on the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council. The Church feels a great need to keep this event alive. With the Council, the Church entered a new phase of her history. The Council Fathers strongly perceived, as a true breath of the Holy Spirit, a need to talk about God to men and women of their time in a more accessible way. The walls which for too long had made the Church a kind of fortress were torn down and the time had come to proclaim the Gospel in a new way. It was a new phase of the same evangelization that had existed from the beginning. It was a fresh undertaking for all Christians to bear witness to their faith with greater enthusiasm and conviction. The Church sensed a responsibility to be a living sign of the Father's love in the world."

In this Year of Mercy, we are all called upon to seek God's mercy in our own lives as well as to share that gift of mercy with others. The ways in which we are called to treat others, judge others, and respond to others. In those places in our lives and in our world where there is need for healing and reconciliation, may we also pray for mercy and justice so that others may see the loving face of Jesus. As we continue this Advent journey and make ready our hearts and homes, we welcome the one born of Mary and the one who is mercy and justice.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today we greet the New Liturgical Year, and once again begin the Last week I shared some of my fears of letting go, and walking with Jesus. Today, I want to continue the theme of preparing ourselves for the journey of surrender this Advent.

This week's epistle is from Philippians 1:4-8: **"Brothers and sisters: I pray always with you in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel. . . I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. . . and this is my prayer, that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value. . . filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ of the glory and praise of God."** There are several words which caught my attention in this passage. **First "praying with you."**

Following Jesus is not just about me. It is all about community and my relationships with others. Prayer is a powerful way to stay connected. Just look at the Our Father: "thy will be done." It isn't about my will and desires, it is about God's will. It is about doing His work, caring for His people, His creation. These simple words link me to the entirety of God's kingdom. **Second "Partnership for the gospel."** This reminds me that my first vocation, as one of the baptized, is to not only speak, but live the gospel of Jesus. He calls me to loving service. He shows me the path of humility. He offers forgiveness, and teaches me to follow His example. He leads, and in partnership, I follow. **Third: "the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it."** I am a work in progress. I don't know all the answers. I am certainly not perfect. I have far to go, but I am never alone on the journey. Each of you add something to my life, and Jesus helps me sort it all out. Sometimes we comfort one another, other times we challenge. Sometimes we show great compassion, while there are times when we are so caught up in our own problems, we neglect to listen and be empathetic. Sometimes a quick response is perceived as cruel and thoughtless, but God isn't finished. He continues to create us in His image and likeness.

Fourth: "That your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value:" I know as I've grown older my thoughts, actions, and attitudes have changed. I think I see the world through simpler eyes, yet what is important to me has remained constant. Relationships are true treasures, but I ask: Do I show family, friends, and strangers the kind of love the God offers me? Do I respect life in its fullness? Do I embrace diversity? Do I care for those forgotten in our world? Sometimes life presents challenges, and I'm not sure where God is leading me, but I do believe He is leading. He asks me to open my heart, to grow in wisdom, and to discern how I can best serve. **Finally: "filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ of the glory and praise of God."** I know I repeat myself when I say it is easy for me to see God's glory and praise Him whenever I look at nature. I feel close to God when I think about our Universe. It is filled with His majesty and mystery. It is infinite and fills me with my oneness to His grace. Life itself is a gift. God, help me embrace my life, its beauty, and fill it with the universality of your love. Your sister in Christ **Sandy Gagnon**




