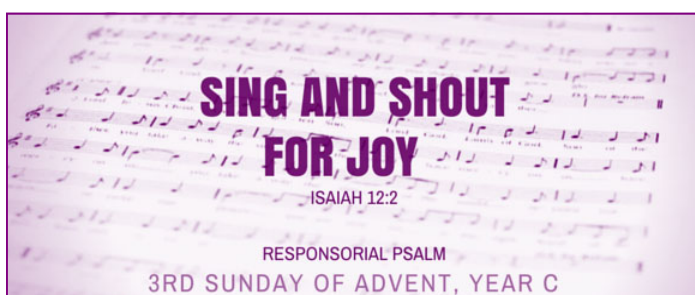

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The entrance antiphon for today, Gaudete Sunday, is taken from the second reading: "Rejoice in the Lord always; I shall say it again: rejoice!" (Gaudete is Latin for Rejoice.) Later in the liturgy, when the entire passage is proclaimed, we hear: "Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:4-7)

Not many words, yet the message is full and rich. For instance "have no anxiety at all". The definition of anxiety is intense dread (fear), apprehension, nagging worry. Let me name a few things that make me anxious; the unknown, failing health, harm to my family, loss of a loved one, dementia. These were the first words that popped into my mind, and I realize they are all things over which I have no control. Why then do I feel concerned, and yes sometimes anxious? What should I do? How do I rid myself of fears and feelings of dread?

The next few words provide my answer. By prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make (my) requests known to God. It sounds easy, but it implies faith in God's love and trust that He cares for me, provides for me, and will never leave me alone, without hope. Tall order for me, because I have difficulty letting go. I generally think I am self sufficient, can take care of my needs, and quite capable of making my own decisions. In fact it has never been easy for me to ask for help. Requiring assistance has always seemed to suggest weakness or failure on my part. As I age, however, there are more and more tasks for which I need help, and I realize how limited my knowledge and capabilities actually are. While I do ask others for help, it is still difficult to ask God because there seem to be so many needs in this world which are greater than mine. As a whole, my life is rich and full, so why fear the unknown, and what I cannot change. Once again I am reminded of a very simple prayer: "God grant me the Serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the Courage to change the things I can, and the Wisdom to know the difference." I know what I desire most is the peace of God that surpasses all understanding, which will guard (my) heart and mind in Christ Jesus. This third Sunday of Advent let's REJOICE, and prepare to welcome Jesus into our lives in a whole new way.

The Meaning of the Advent Candles



Each of the four colored candles in the Advent wreath represents a week leading to Christmas. Traditionally, three of the candles are purple, and one is pink. The final candle is white and is located in the center of the wreath. It is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

It was once a tradition for the pope to give someone a rose on the fourth Sunday of Lent before Easter to "liven up" the somber tone of the season. Before the mass commercialization of Christmas, Advent was also a solemn time, as people fasted to

prepare for the holiday. The rose custom became part of the third Sunday of Advent. Eventually, the third candle turned pink as well.

The candles are traditionally lit in the following order: purple, purple, pink, purple, white. The first is called the "*Candle of Hope*." It symbolizes faith in God keeping his promises to humanity. The second is called the "*Candle of Preparation*," reminding Christians to "get ready" to receive God. The third candle is the "*Candle of Joy*." It recalls the angels joyfully singing about the birth of Christ. The fourth candle, the "*Candle of Love*," reminds Christians that God loves them enough to send his only Son to Earth. The "*Christ Candle*," the white candle in the center, stands for Jesus Christ himself.
