Feast of the Holy Innocents - December 28

Also called Childermas, or Innocents' Day, this feast day commemorates the massacre of the children by King Herod in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus. These innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. These children were regarded by the early church as the first martyrs, but it is uncertain when the day was first kept as a saint's day.

Our Christmas joy is tempered today by a feeling of sadness. But the Church looks principally to the glory of the children, of these innocent victims, whom she shows us in heaven following the Lamb wherever He goes.

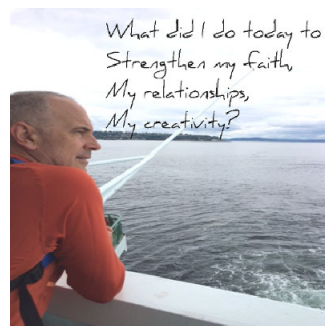

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Although Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost are my favorite feasts in the Church's liturgical year, today, the Feast of the Holy Family, is very special to me, because it celebrates **ALL** families. You may think your family should not be likened to the Holy family, but here I totally disagree. We begin with a young woman, betrothed, yet suspected of adultery. The man anxiously plans to divorce her, yet agrees to fulfill his obligation, and takes her into his home. She gives birth to a son, and both are amazed by their visitors following the nativity. Fearing for the infant's life, the man takes his family into a foreign land, becoming refugees, fleeing from unjust rule. As the child grows, the couple are faced with his unconventional behavior (Luke 2:41-52). Her husband dies and in her widowhood the woman is forced to watch her son accused, convicted and brutally murdered by the state. Not quite your image of a perfect, joy-filled family. Is it any wonder that most art depicting this family reveals sadness, sorrow, or, unrealistically pious figures. In reality, the Holy family is a reflection of true life, filled with ups and downs, joy and sadness, pain and sorrow, suffering and celebration; events which any of us might also encounter in our own families. What holds this family together, although multifaceted, originates in a complete love and trust of God. It is so much more than obedience to His laws or fear of reprisal. It is a deep, inner faith that God will care, provide, and lead them. They freely surrender to His will. When I found this picture, I felt like I was one with this couple, celebrating the birth of their first child. I knew their joy, and trepidation. I think it safe to say that a first child brings mixed emotions to the parents. There are so many questions related to the infant's care, questions that are only answered through experience. There are fears related to his/her future. How to raise them with an awareness of the world, and its problems, yet protect them from harm? How do we teach them to live a just, moral life, without also teaching condemnation of others? How to we open their minds to knowledge without skepticism, nourish faith and the mystery of God's evolving creation without an unrealistic expectation of a "magic kingdom," which provides the perfect life of fairy tales with happy endings? I certainly felt some fear the first time I held my daughter, our first-born, and yes I know I made mistakes over the years. The one constant, however, was an ever abiding, unconditional love.

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, I think the true message is that they weren't so different than any of us. The message of their day to day living is one of hope. They knew God's presence. Mary and Joseph were the human family, who gave us their son, Jesus. They open our eyes to God's complete, unfailing, and abundant love. They reflect His love in their lives, opening themselves to His will. In trust, they gave their lives and their love to God. They were faithful, and true to the gift and blessing of humanity given by our creator. Although our lives may not be easy, theirs is an example we can embrace and follow. May you and your family know and receive God's blessings.

In my house, on the night before everyone leaves some grass and water in a shoebox for the camels. The 3 Kings come in the night and leave small gifts, such as books or small toys. 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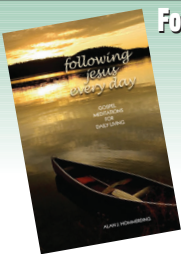
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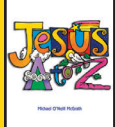
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
