Pro-Life Prayer Rally - January 22

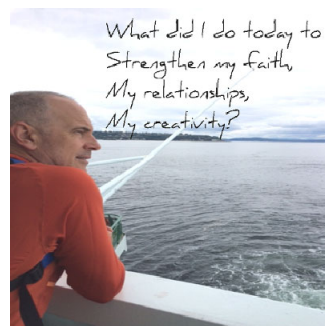

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season, and since this scene at the Jordan River is presented as the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus, today also serves as a

"bridge" into Winter Ordinary Time, which traces the historical unfolding of His ministry. While His baptism, descent of the Holy Spirit, and the revelation of Jesus as God's son is presented by all four gospel writers, the emphasis in Luke's Gospel seems to reveal Jesus as a model for all believers. Christian baptism is a fulfillment of John the Baptist's earlier promise that "he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (v. 16). At our baptism we emerge from the water as God's beloved children, freed from sin, filled with the Spirit, and consecrated to share in the mission of Jesus as foretold in the Servant Songs of Isaiah. (Chapt. 42)

Perhaps your baptism is a distant memory or photographs and story told by your parents, but currently we have spiritual brothers and sisters, here at St. James, who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. For several months they have been preparing for this sacrament through personal prayer, study, discernment, and participation in the Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass. Through the sacrament of baptism all sin is forgiven, the power of darkness is dispelled, and believers become a "new creation," incorporated into Christ, adopted children of God. As His children we are joined as brothers and sisters, in fellowship and service. As members of the Body of Christ, we truly become members of one another. From the womb of baptismal waters, we also become the people of God which transcends all natural and human limits of nations, cultures, races and sexes.. St. Paul says, "The one spirit baptizes us into the one body." (I Cor 12:13)

Baptism is the sacrament of faith, but faith needs a community that supports its individuals who come to maturity on their journey with Jesus, "who was sent to bring to the poor the good news of salvation." Born of the font, enlightened by Christ and growing in faith, believers walk as children of light spreading the good news of Christ through their actions, and work in the Kingdom of God, which was initiated through the incarnation.

As one of the guides for our Catechumenates, I ask you to pray for and with them as they continue their journey. I also ask that as you renew your baptismal promises through blessing and signing with Holy Water, that you pray for strength and courage to walk with our Lord, giving thanks for His many blessings and grace. St. James is a strong, faith-filled community, and I believe we can be a beacon of His light to the world.

Please use care when picking these up. Some people's names are very similar and you might get the wrong statement. Please verify the name and address. If you feel something has been recorded incorrectly on the statement, please let me (Katie) know and I will do my best to correct it.

Picking up these statements while at the church, saves the parish \$700- \$850 in postage cost.

The 2016 tithing pledge card will be enclosed with the statement for your convenience. These cards can be returned to the parish office or in the collection plate on Sunday. The tithing pledge does help us estimate income we can count on.

Information tidbit: Did you know when you donate stocks to the church you can record the market value when transferred to us as your charitable contribution! You will not pay capital gains taxes on stocks transferred to the church.

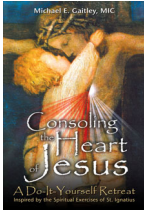

The Twelve Days of Christmas begin with Christmas Eve on the evening of December 24 and continue until the feast of Epiphany (or Three Kings Day) Jan 6th. The actual Christmas season continues until the Feast of the Baptism of Christ, which in the present form of the Roman Rite is celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany, falling on Jan 10th this year.

You can also keep the season going by celebrating Epiphany in your home. In most Latin American countries, this is the big gift giving holiday. The 3 Kings are where we get the idea of giving gifts. In my house, on the night before everyone leaves some grass and water in a shoebox for the camels. The 3 Kings come in the night and leave small gifts, such as books or small toys. I can not say I have ever received any frankincense or gold...maybe someday.

So keep the Christmas lights burning in your home and in your heart!
