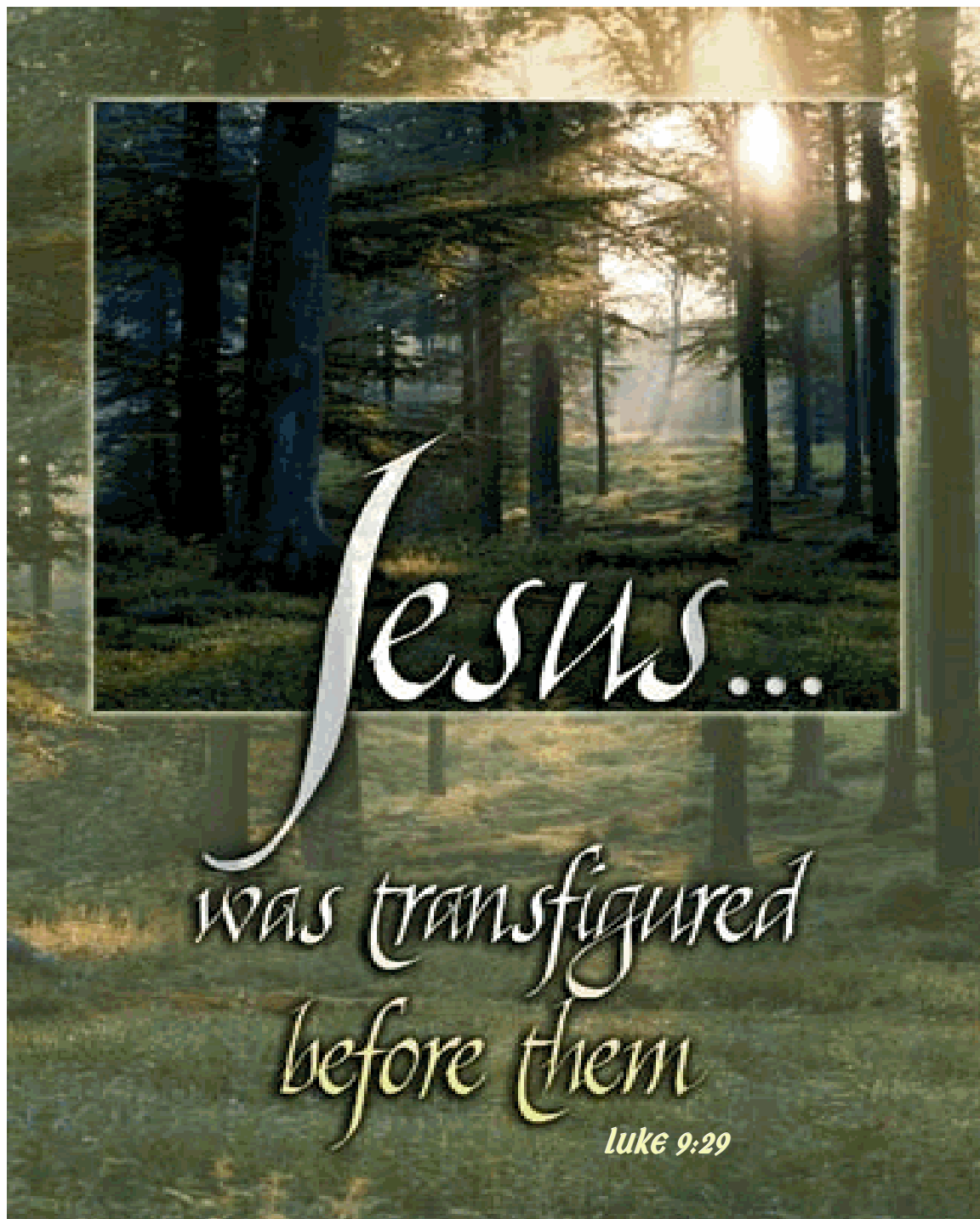

From the Pastor's Pen

As we journey through the season of Lent, we lift up our Catechumens and Candidates, who celebrated the Rite of Election last weekend, along with RCIA candidates and catechumens from all over the diocese, at the Cathedral with Bishop Johnston. We pray for these women and men as they prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

And we also remember our children preparing for First Communion and their families as they prepare to receive their First Holy Communion in the Easter season.

Hopefully you have enjoyed Matthew Kelly's book, *Rediscover Jesus* and the daily video from "Dynamic Catholic". These are both great daily opportunities to be faithful to the Lenten journey.

As Phil Baumert announced last weekend, our Campaign to build a new church is rolling right along, and the diocese is very supportive of our endeavor. If you've not had the opportunity to make a pledge yet and add your ROCK to the rocks around the Cross at our new building site, you can still do so. We have over \$4.6 million pledged - and the cost of the church is \$8 million.

We have to have 75% pledged, which is roughly \$6 million, and 50% cash. Right now, we have just over \$1.5 million in cash. We have this figure because of the faithfulness of parishioners paying off their pledge that ended in December, 2015. As we pray and reflect on our own relationship with Christ and with the Church this Lent, may we be generous in supporting our hopes for the future!

We welcome Fr. Joe Nassal, C.P.P.S., the Provincial of the Society of the Precious Blood here in our parish this Monday, at 6:30 p.m. in church for an Evening of Reflection. We're very grateful to Fr. Joe and I invite all of us to come and again, deepen our Lenten journey.

May you and your families know God's guidance and the Power of God's Spirit this Lenten season.

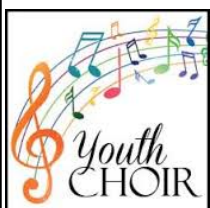

Someone is Watching and Wondering

*God, grant me the serenity to accept
the things I cannot change,*

*Courage to change the things
that I can, and the*

Wisdom to know the difference.

Lent is a season of change, beginning with Ash Wednesday and the words "Repent and be faithful to the Gospel." Repentance, of course, begins with a knowledge of wrong-doing, a feeling of deep regret, and a heart-felt desire to change, i.e. turn away from the sin. In deed, being faithful to the Gospel requires living and loving *agapically*; viewing every human as a child of God. It does not, however, mean agreeing with or condoning actions which bring harm to others or the created world. Tall order indeed, but I find guidance and strength in the words above. I'm sure many of you are familiar with this prayer.

Recently I received a paraphrased version which I would like to share with you. These words speak to a deeper, interior meaning of the change needed in myself, not just during Lent, but each and every day. "God grant me the **serenity** to accept the people I cannot change, the **courage** to change the one I can and the **wisdom** to know that it is me." While it may be easy to see areas which need change in others, it is often difficult to admit to those areas which need change in myself. It may be difficult to face the dark recesses of my life, the shortcomings of my personality, those things which harm my relationships with family, friends, and people I encounter, even strangers or those I only meet through the news media. It is difficult to challenge my ways of thinking, acting, and solving problems. It is hard to let go of preconceived ideas and understandings I've held for a long time. It is painful to take off the blinders of comfort and security and see the world around me through the eyes of another. In short, it is hard to change myself, but that is what Jesus is asking me to do, right now, today. He asks me to let go, to trust, be patient, and follow His light. He offers His love and forgiveness, and He asks me to do likewise. To do this, I must look deep inside with a desire to change, so there is room to receive all Jesus is offering.

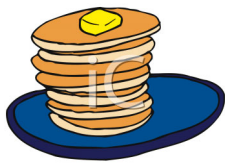

The Rite of Sending Celebrated Saturday, February 13



Evangelization is our example of faithfully living the Christian life, whereby our lives become a proclamation of the presence of Christ in the world. Even when the values of society are different, we continue our active involvement in society with its professional, political, and cultural dimensions. We live as faithful Christians within society, not separated from society, serving God's people.

Evangelization is meant to announce the Gospel of Jesus to those who have never heard it, to renew the message among the baptized, and to work for unity among believers. The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a Journey of Evangelization, proclaiming the good news of Jesus among the unbaptized (**Catechumens**) and renewing His message among the baptized (**Candidates** for full Communion in the Catholic Church).

Last Saturday evening (Feb 13th) our St. James Catechumens and Candidates celebrate the Rite of Election with Bishop James Johnston at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. During this Liturgy the Catechumens declare their intention to be among the **Elect**, those chosen by God to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, and the Candidates declare their desire to continue in the faith, in full communion with the Catholic Church.

We are looking for a few (5-10) adults who would enjoy sharing a leadership role with Vacation Bible School this summer.

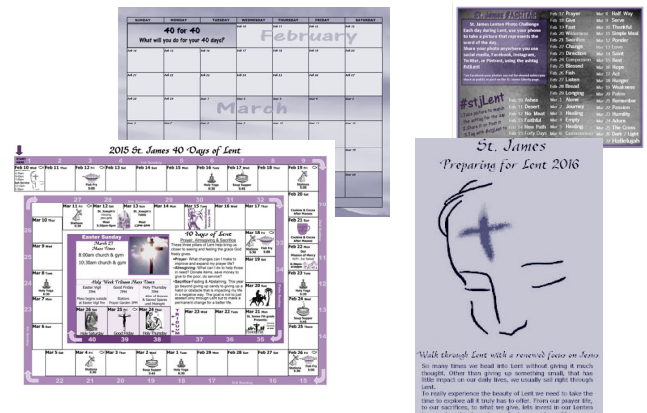
The duties would be shared, so no one person would be overwhelmed. No prior VBS experience is required, but you should enjoy working with children and adults.
