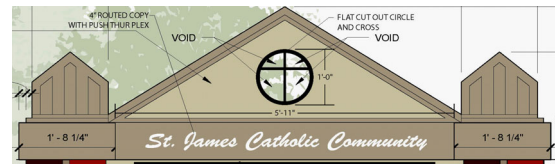

The next stage in our preparation for the new church is signage to properly identify St. James to the Liberty Community and points North and South from I-35.

A double-faced electronic sign is being constructed midway between the Palisades and the Service Road and set-in approximately 65 feet from Stewart Road.

The sign will sit on a masonry pedestal surrounded by brick pillars and capped by an illuminated header designed to represent the silhouette of our New St. James. The header will be interior lit and contain the scrolled inscription "St. James Catholic Community".

The sign will be visible from both North and South on Stewart Road and very noticeable from I-35.

There is no charge for this seminar and all parishioners, friends and family are invited.



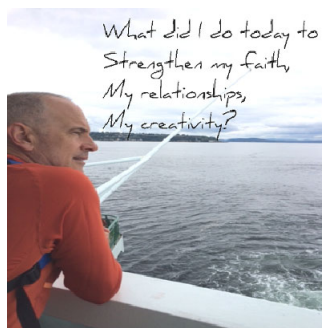

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Not being an artist myself I am always looking for images that fit with my thoughts, especially when writing these pieces. This image is from the website www.godisreal.today and depicts my idea of conversion. Jesus calls each of us, uniquely and lovingly, to trust, to embrace His love and to follow Him. Unfortunately, most often I'm not sure what that means in my daily life.

Last weekend, during the RCIA session with our younger adults (children of catechumenal age), I ask "What can we do to be disciples of Jesus." Naturally there were the common answers of going to church, praying, and telling people about Jesus, however, there was no mention of ordinary, daily tasks, such as helping a friend with a difficult assignment at school, chores around the house, or forgiving little hurts so common between family members. Yet I think for most of us, these small acts are truly signs of discipleship and our love for Jesus.

I often tell people, the way to become a Catholic is to do Catholic things. Once again, this is easily translated into going to Mass, prayer, scripture study, devotions to Mary and the Saints, and going to confession. I do not disagree with any of these answers, but I think there is a bigger picture. Learning to love and follow Jesus is most assuredly a life-long process, but it begins by learning to love ourselves, and our humanity. God created humankind, but Jesus showed us what it means to be human. He gave us examples of forgiveness and service. He helped people where they were, not where He hoped they might be. He didn't hesitate to embrace sinners, the sick, or the wounded. He gave us a commandment to "Love one another, even as I have loved you." I don't think he meant just our closest friends and family. He was calling us to trust Him, embrace our pain, welcome strangers, help wherever there is a need. We leave Mass with the command to "Go, in peace to love and serve." This is His wish for each of us, and the path for our lives. It may seem difficult at times, but He never leaves us to walk the path alone. He is always with us, hand out stretched in love.

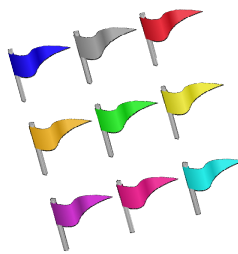

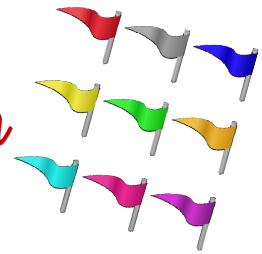
