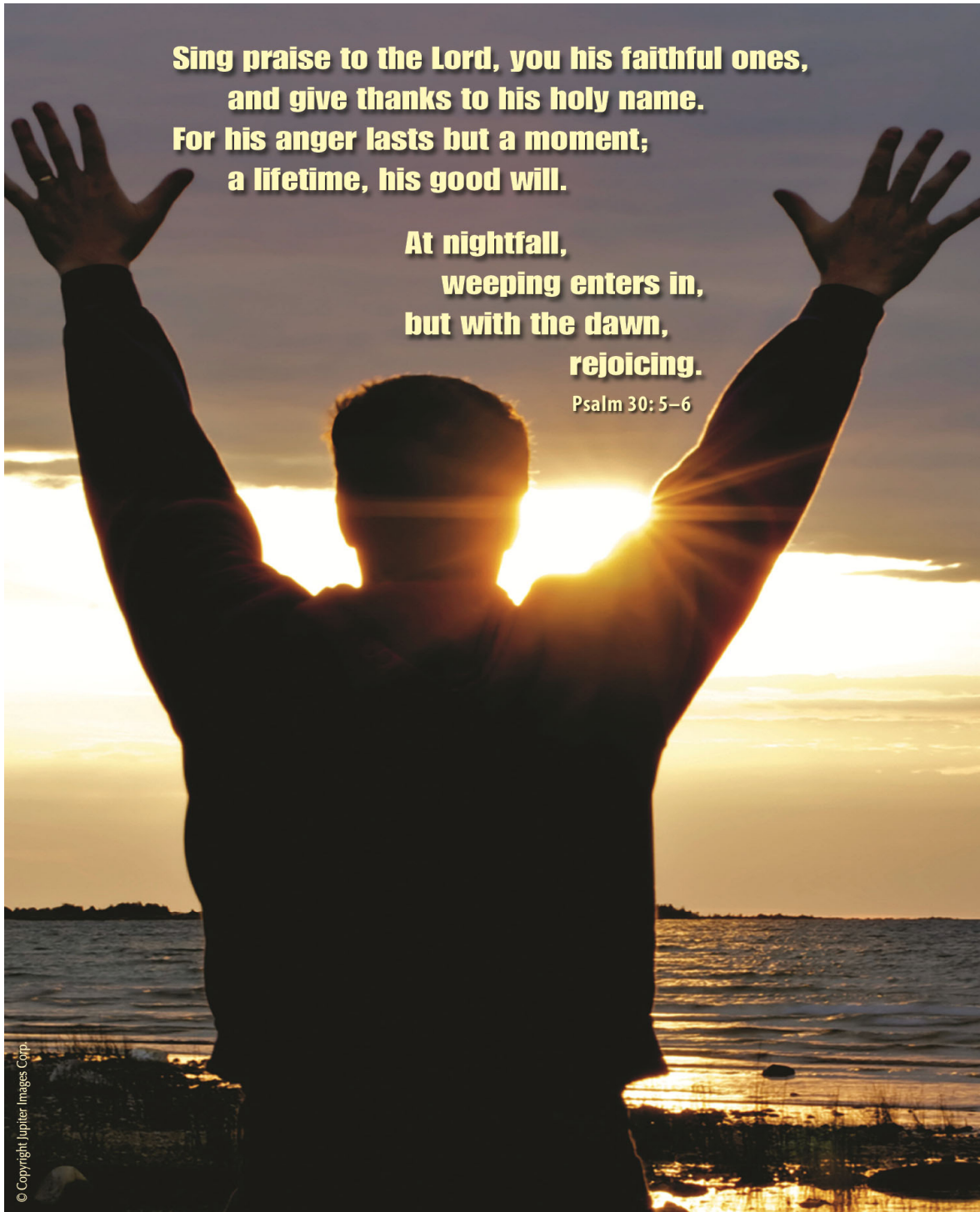

Did You Know?

Our new electronic sign in our entryway is almost complete. Following the completion of the parking lot, this is our next huge endeavor before the building of our new church.

The sign will be on the pedestal you see now at an approximate mid-point between our Palisades and the commercial road. It will have brick pillars and cast aluminum caps meant to bring to mind the frontal silhouette of our new church.

"St. James Catholic Community" will be scrolled into the aluminum and lit internally at all times. The sign proper will be two-faced LED 16mm and will have full capability to display any message we chose to post with user friendly software to allow maximum capability.

The sign will be fully visible from Stewart Road and the entrance parkway and service road and very noticeable from I-35. In the future it will be surrounded by a garden.

From the Pastor's Pen

This Monday, June 6, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood will gather at the Church of Annunciation in Kearney for our Kansas City Provincial Assembly 2016. Our theme, *Faith in Action*, will focus on immigration reform and could not be more timely in this election year. Our speaker, Sister Simone Campbell, SSS, Executive Director of NETWORK, is a prophetic voice for justice in the world. In addition to Sister Simone's presentations on Tuesday morning and afternoon and Wednesday morning, the Justice and Peace Committee will present a proposal for the province to take a corporate stance for comprehensive and compassionate immigration reform.

Our Assembly begins with a social and dinner on Monday evening, June 6, followed by a welcome and remembrance of our Precious Blood communion of saints, especially those who have died since we last came together in Assembly. We will also celebrate a Ritual of Blessing and Sending for those missionaries who will be moving to new assignments this summer. At our banquet and Eucharist on Tuesday evening, June 7, we will celebrate with our Companions who are making or renewing covenants with the community.

In addition to the discussion and discernment on a corporate stance on immigration reform on Wednesday afternoon, the Futures Task Force will present an update on the process of revitalization and reimagining that began in January.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I recently found this picture with a quote from George Addair, and I found it curious: What is on the other side of fear? Perhaps the first step to solving this puzzle was to name my fears. I came to the conclusion that my two greatest fears are helplessness and loneliness, yet I struggle with asking for help and seeking companionship. I have always been a person looking for answers, and working towards resolution. As I age, however, I find I simply cannot accomplish everything I want, in a reasonable period of time. Even working in my gardens takes longer (more rest-breaks required), and I frequently ask someone (usually my grandson Michael) to help. This is both humbling and disturbing to my sense of self reliability, but isn't this central to Jesus' message. We humans cannot, in fact never have, lived alone or without help. In fact, our day to day existence would be quite different if we tried to live in total isolation. Imagine a world where you never saw another human, where there was no form of communication, no technology, no books, art or music, where you were totally dependent on yourself. For me, that is quite fearful.

The next step, at least for me, was to name steps I should take to move beyond these fears. The answer was loud and clear: "Love, trust, let go, and live every moment as gift." In my heart I know that not only did God create all that is "visible and invisible" but that creation was an act of love. How is it possible then, that any human, even myself, could ever exist outside God's love? It isn't. God is love, and He gives Himself completely to us. (Read John 3:16 as a reminder.) To live a full life, without fears, I believe we must return God's love. As we let go of our ego-centered, selfish existence, and turn to Him, loving and trusting, we will find great joy and peace. Humbly ask Him, "How can I serve?" No matter what your circumstance in life, no matter what has gone before, no matter how lost you feel, He will provide a new path for you to follow, and He will be walking with you, if necessary, carrying you to the light. God never leaves us in fear and darkness. He gently guides, nourishes, heals, and always loves us. Gandhi said "The enemy is fear, we think it is hate; but, it is fear." Don't let fear destroy what is good. Let God lead you to the other side. I know loving and trusting God is beautiful.

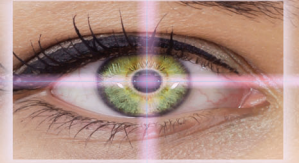

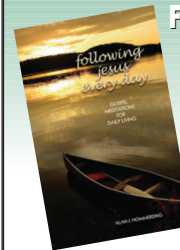
