The turnout for the St. James Parish celebration was astounding! We estimated in excess of 500 people of all ages attended; everyone appeared to have had a great time.

The celebration opened with the release of the balloon rosary (see cover picture).

Fr. Mike recognized both sets of Capital Campaign Chairs. Our first campaign (*Forward in Faith*) was represented by Kevin and Sue Nordhues and Midge Weir. (We had the word that Ed was watching closely.) He thanked the rest of that team, Blake and Mary Margaret Parrish, Bob and Bridgett Bagby and Jim and Suzie Olson for getting the rock rolling. He then segued to our current campaign chairs, Steve Gregoire, Angie Reed, Christine Bohr, Clint Elliott, and Todd Carmichael who were applauded for driving the current campaign to record numbers – \$5.8M in pledges and \$2M in cash. He closed his remarks by saying that there is an upcoming opportunity to get approval for the next phase from the Bishop in the near future.

The campaign Events Team, lead by Debbie Taylor, were on Father's "thanks" list for tying the day's events together and making the event one that we will surely repeat.

Fathers' Mike and Timothy led the parish to the new 16mm LED sign where Fr. Mike blessed it. The picture on the cover captured a segment of the attendees.

With our parking lot and our new sign to offer welcoming, St. James is becoming a highlight in the geography of Liberty. Imagine the footprint when the new church fills the space at the end of the palisade!

The Precious Blood Community were thanked for their long support of St. James as well as a generous commitment to the current campaign.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



One of the questions I propose in "Faith Formation" is "What image comes to mind, or what words would you use to describe God?" It is a question often met with blank stares, followed by words such as creator, omnipotent, judge, presence, and father. When Moses encountered God in a burning bush, he covered his face, and asked "Who are you?" God's simply reply, "I am who I am" (Ex3:14). This still doesn't answer my question: "What is your image of God." I don't intent a rapid, theologically correct answer, nor a quotation from scripture. Rather, there are two real questions: "What image of God do you hold in your mind and heart; and how do you reveal God to others?"

Do you think of God as fearful, a rule giver, vengeful, a stern, unapproachable man with a long white beard? Does the Holy Trinity come to mind, with images for Father, Son, and Spirit? Do these images meld into one being, or are they always separate? Does an image of Jesus come to mind whenever you think or pray to God? Does God ever have a female voice?

Perhaps answering the second question will help. I believe the way we reveal God to others is through unconditional love and service. It is how we treat others, like the old axiom, "Deeds speak louder than words." With this answer, I think the best description of God is simply "I am love." Not I show love, or I give love, just "**God is Love,**"

St. James School News

4th Grade at SJS!

The yearlong theme for St. James' fourth grade is "Explore Missouri." While all our students are very blessed with many opportunities, one of our yearly highlights is our study trip to Jefferson City. The fourth graders study the three branches of state government and Missouri's history. They also love to explore their own role as a responsible citizen in a democracy. St. James fourth graders were able to travel to Jefferson City on a chartered bus May 5. The classes met our state representative, Nick King, and state senator, Ryan Silvey, at the Capitol. 


