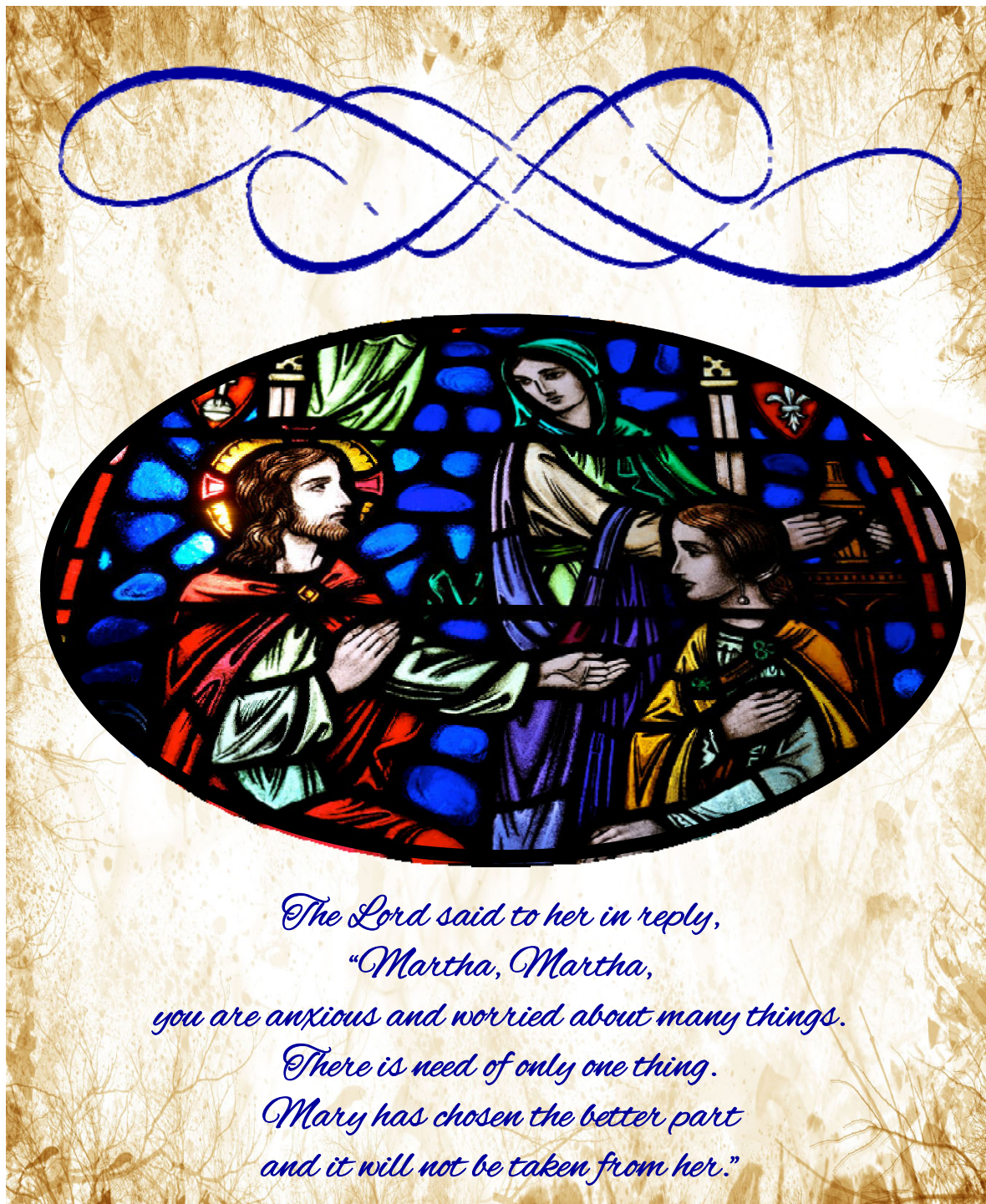

From the Pastor's Pen

As luck would have it, I decided when I arrived home late Monday night that the grass needed watering. As I walked into the house, I decided to press the start button on the sprinkler system and let it run. The next morning I awoke before the alarm to the sound of thunder and wind and heavy rain. Just how it goes sometimes.

The summer is almost half over already. Just a few more weeks and the school will be buzzing once again with students. I once had someone tell me, "Oh Father, school's out and things should calm down around here." Well classes may be out the end of May, but very little slows down around the church and school during the summer. It just seems to shift from being busy with teaching to being busy with cleaning and repairs and preparing for the next year. That person said those words to me my first summer after ordination and I'm still waiting for things to slow down a bit. Ha!

It seems we are busy about many "Martha things" in our lives. There are the must-do lists that seem to always be there. As many things as we cross off, it seems that many more get added. Sometimes that "Mary time" just to sit and be sounds pretty good. We do need that balance in our lives, to know when to be busy about important things and when to sit and be about important things.

This next week, Debbie Bolin, a Precious Blood Companion, and I will be traveling to Chicago to spend the week at the Precious Blood Ministry of Reconciliation Center. It is one of ministries that grew out of a need to Chicago to minister to those who need a safe space away from gangs and violence. The Center is open to youth as well as adults. Safe spaces have been created where youth can share their fears and concerns as well as Mothers of incarcerated sons or daughters. It is a space of both "Martha work" and "Mary quiet" where lives and stories are shared. Debbie and I will be interacting with the youth present for the summer camp as well as working on a few different projects. These projects include building a water feature, installing an auto water for the garden, and maybe even a canning project using the fresh garden produce. More importantly it will be a week just to be present.

In the quiet and not so quiet time of summer may we know the "Martha work" we must do as well as make time for the "Mary presence."

May the quiet of the day speak to the buzzing of our hearts.

Why Everyone Should Sing at Mass

Singing is a powerful way of uniting a group of individuals into a single body. For example, the singing of the national anthem at a sports event can unite thousands of strangers in a stadium into a single body, standing together in a common gesture of respect and honor. Similarly, communal singing during the Mass has a way of gathering the many individuals present and making them into a visible expression of what our faith proclaims: that we are one body, united in Christ, offering a single prayer of praise and thanksgiving to God.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal recalls the old proverb, "One who sings prays twice." This reminds us that our music and singing at worship is not entertainment or background music for our prayer. Our singing is our prayer. Putting our prayer into music not only helps to unite us in the prayer we make, it also gives a unique expression to our prayer that words alone cannot achieve. For example, the Alleluia we sing before hearing the Gospel is an expression of praise to the Lord who is present to us in the proclamation and hearing of the Gospel. Merely saying this acclamation of praise does not easily convey the joy and strength of our prayer at that point. The Gloria that we sing in the introductory rites of the Mass is another example of a hymn of praise — made to be sung, not recited.

All of us who participate in the liturgy are expected to sing. No doubt there are some who feel that they don't have a beautiful singing voice. Others may feel uncomfortable singing together.

But the voices we have are gifts from God. God does not hold auditions for prayer; God simply asks us to use the voice He's given us. When everyone sings, we can truly feel the power of the liturgy encircling the assembly. We owe it to ourselves and to one another to participate as fully as we can to make our experience of worship as rich as it can be.



Someone is Watching and Wondering

RCLA

As RCIA Director I talk to many people who express interest in the Catholic Church. Two of the first questions I ask are: Why do you desire to become a Catholic? What/Who brings you here? The most frequent responses are: I have family or friends who are catholic; My parents are joining; I'm marrying a Catholic; I like the traditions and ritual; or I'm not sure. It seems to me these responses point to a common thread or need, namely a desire for "spirituality" and "belonging."

Richard Mc Brien describes spirituality as experiencing God, resulting in transformation of our consciousness and lives. Since God is available to everyone, spirituality is not exclusively Christian, but Christian spirituality is a life given to the Holy Spirit, and incorporation into the Body of Jesus Christ. It is surrendering to "God the Creator in a life of faith, hope, love, and service. It is *visionary, sacramental, relational, and transformational*." (*Catholicism*, 1058.) It seems to me, this concept of spirituality is the cornerstone of catechesis for the RCIA Journey. On this journey there are three primary stages.

First, the **inquirer** begins to recognize God's presence in the ordinary. Every experience of God is unique and personal; the touch of wind, the smell of roses, the warmth of the sun, the small hand of a child, the kiss of a loved one, the tragedy of poverty, hunger and suffering, the violence of war, terminal illness or death of a relative or friend. God is present in these experiences, leading our lives by a golden thread, weaving a unique pattern for each of us. When we recognize His presence in these every day experiences, we make a choice to embrace His way.

Second, the experience transforms the **catechumen**. They feel and act differently, opening themselves to God's gift of *agape*; embracing, cherishing, and sharing it. Their actions reflect His unconditional love toward all of creation.

Finally, others can see the Holy Spirit living and working in the lives of the **Elect**. Their life becomes one of faith, hope and service. Their lives are visionary, sacramental, relational, and transformational to others.

This is the path all Catholics must follow. Learning doctrine and attending Mass at least once a week is not enough. Our strength as Christians, lies in embracing the whole of human life, experiencing God in that wholeness, and through our actions, witnessing to the saving grace of Jesus Christ. I believe the catechumenal journey continues throughout life, until we experience the joy of seeing God and being glorified with Him. I hope each of you will journey with our RCIA team and individuals seeking initiation. Share your experiences of God freely; look for ways God transforms your life, and envision how to share God's love in the present.

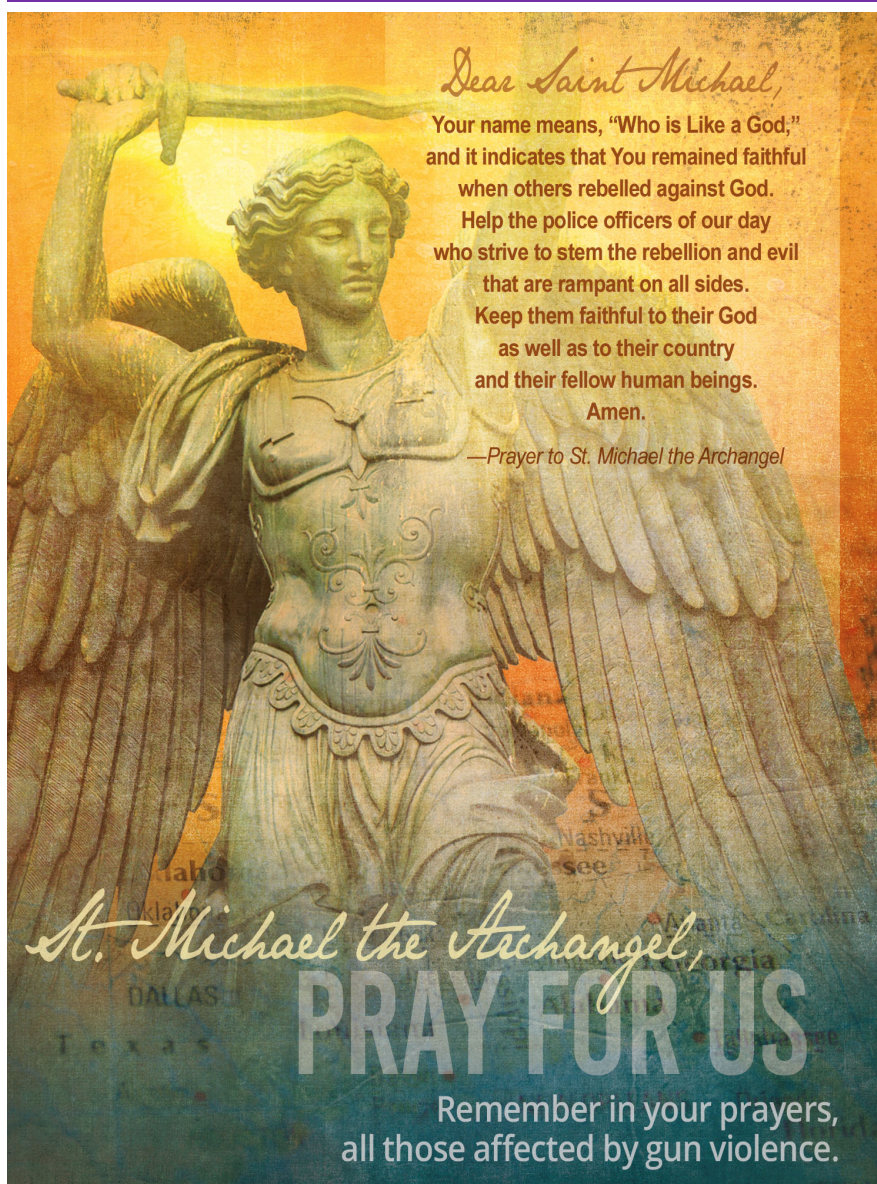

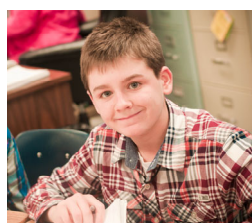
