From the Pastor's Pen

It was the start of a beautiful day with the sun rising over the hills of Missouri. I was driving from Chicago to Liberty for a meeting with Fr. Joe Nassal. I had been asked to become the editor of our community's newsletter, *The New Wine Press*, and I was meeting with Fr. Joe to talk about the vision of the newsletter and what sort of articles we would like to see published. I opted to drive instead of fly this time, which meant I had to leave Chicago and drive thru the night for my morning meeting. I had just finished listening to a cd and decided to switch to the radio when I was shocked to hear the news of 9-11 just as the second plane hit. I drove the rest of the way into Liberty listening and not quite believing. Was this some kind of joke? I arrived at the Center in time to hear the news of the other planes.

"Where were you when the world stopped turnin' that September day?" These words from the song by Alan Jackson continue to sing in my mind as I think about what I was doing that day. It is now 15 years later and for many of us we can still remember what we were doing that day. Our world, my world, changed that day. Having just recently been ordained, that day's events have formed and shaped my ministry. I know the fear and threat of violence that became real that day. I also know the hope and strength of a nation that came together that day and in the days to follow to comfort and support one another.

As we turn the calendar page to September 11, what will this day speak to us? Will it be memories of fear and revenge or will it be of hope and comfort of a nation who came together to deal with a tragedy? My hope and prayer today is that we can continue to work together to bring about healing and peace and an end to war and violence.

As Alan Jackson's song ends, "I'm just a singer of simple songs, I'm not a real political man, I watch CNN but I'm not sure I can tell you the difference in Iraq and Iran. But I know Jesus and I talk to God, and I remember this from when I was young, Faith, hope and love are some good things He gave us, And the greatest is love."

For indeed, the greatest is love.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Reading today's scriptures I was overwhelmed with the appropriateness. Unless you are very, very young you know that today marks the anniversary of the terrible events which shocked our country in 2001. In fact for many, those horrific images are forever engraved in our memories. In remembering that day, however, I also imagine the faces of ordinary people helping, embracing, and consoling one another. As I look back I also hear Jesus' words as He taught His disciples to pray: "**forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.**" He also told them "I came to heal sinners."

At first reading today's Gospel story of the two sons, I'm sure the father's reaction seems somewhat unfair. Yet with the unfolding of events it becomes obvious that both son's have sinned against the father. The younger son's request is equivalent to wishing his father were dead, and the eldest son repudiates his son-ship ("I have slaved for you. . ."), insults his father ("I have never disobeyed you. . .") and accuses the father of favoritism ("him a calf; me not even a goat.") These two sons are essentially the same and equally offensive. The real difference comes with the sons' responses. The younger admits his sin and begs for forgiveness. The elder, however, appears to reject his father's words, actions of forgiveness and unconditional love. He appears too caught up in his own pride, and self-worth as one who always does what is expected. As usual, Jesus points toward the unexpected, unearned grace bestowed by our heavenly Father. In contrasting the two sons, Jesus is asking each of us to follow the younger. We must look within our hearts, searching for the darkness which needs His light. We must openly confess our sins, asking for His forgiveness. We must give our lives freely, seeking His guidance and direction for how we too must forgive. We must also acknowledge He bestows grace on all.

I freely admit that I find it very difficult to look with love on people who continually commit acts against others, evil acts which spread fear and hatred. Acts against innocent people, people who have no voice, and cannot defend themselves. People who have been ignored, even scorned by our culture and voices of those in power. Hate mongering, prejudice, and bigotry have no place in God's kingdom. I think it is easy to say "hate the sin but love the sinner" but that message seems so trivial. It is easy to fall into the sin of the elder brother, with the words "It just isn't fair" coming so readily to our lips. God's way may seem strange to us, but we aren't God, and we cannot see what isn't obvious from our own experiences. One thing we can do, however, is ask Jesus to help. Part of my daily prayer is the following: "Open my eyes so that I may see, my ears so that I may hear, my voice so that I may speak, and my heart so that I may love as you teach. Help me Father to do your work."

7. Jesus is placed in the tomb






