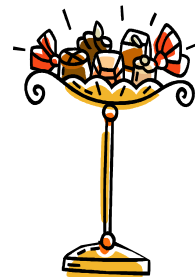

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In today's Gospel Jesus seems to be chastising His disciples when they ask Him to increase their faith. "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to {this} mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." Did the disciples doubt their faith, believe their faith was insufficient, or were they just requesting one more thing from Him. Jesus' reply is clear. It isn't about the quantity but rather the quality of faith. As I reflected on Jesus' words, I asked myself: What is **Faith** and What is the quality of my faith?

A natural beginning for me was to search for definitions of the word. Here is what I found to be the common thread of several references to faith: Complete trust or confidence in someone or something - belief, trust in and loyalty to God - belief for which there is no empirical proof. While straightforward, these definitions didn't really answer my basic question. I believe in God, I think I am loyal to His teachings, but do I truly trust God? Is there empirical proof, i.e. can the existence of God be measured and quantified?

The question about proof is easiest for me to answer. Every time I look at creation I am struck by its patterns and order. The existence of stars, planets, animals, plants, rocks, rivers, mountains, oceans isn't random. When I think about the growth of a seed or embryo, I find myself caught in the process of evolving life, so beautiful yet complex and intricate. When I consider the totality of human intellect, I am amazed how natural events continue to occur without our intervention. My only answer stems from my belief in One that is greater than I; One who sees beyond my limited vision; One who creates from nothing; One who loves everything into existence. I choose to believe in our loving Father, God who made heaven and earth; God who loves me in spite of my limitations, sin, and short-sightedness. Whenever I see people helping others in need, caring for the sick, visiting the lonely, feeding the hungry, sheltering the forgotten, I see the faces of God in both the giver and the receiver. Creation in all its beauty and the work of human kindness is all the empirical proof I need. Only one question remains: Do I have faith, even as small as a mustard seed? I do not have a satisfactory answer for this question. I know that every new day I am being called to trust God a bit more than the day before. I also know that it is His real presence which gets me through each day. I don't know if it's faith, but I feel the need to say, **Thank You** whenever I pause to be with Him.

A Great Start

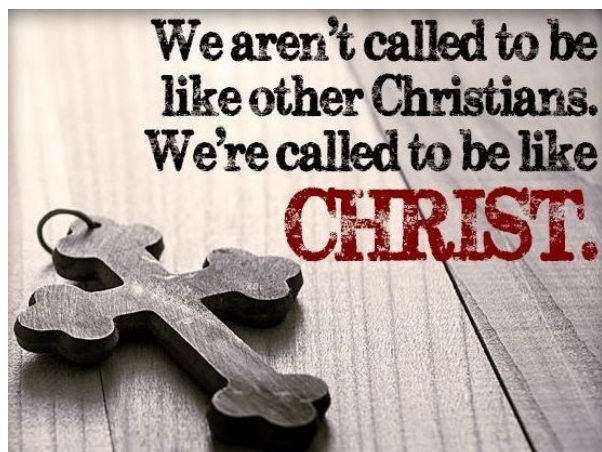
