From the Pastor's Pen

The Lord hears the cry of the poor is today's Responsorial Psalm. These words echo in our lives in various ways. This past week, we as a Precious Blood community remembered the Liberia Martyrs. *"In October 1992, five of our missionary sisters in Liberia were killed by soldiers in the army of Liberian warlord Charles Taylor during a civil war that left hundreds of thousands dead. Sisters Barbara Ann Muttra and Mary Joel Kolmer were killed on Oct. 20 as they drove the convent's security guard home to a neighboring suburb. They never returned. Three days later, soldiers shot and killed Sisters Kathleen McGuire, Agnes Mueller, and Shirley Kolmer in front of their convent in Gardnersville. We remember them as fellow sisters radically committed to their ministry. Their lives and martyrdom have left an indelible mark on us."* (These words taken from the Adorers of the Blood website, adorers.org) They are "Martyrs of Charity" as declared by St. Pope John Paul II. *"War is terrible! Peace. Pray for peace! Ask the Prince of Peace to visit Liberia in a special way for peace, understanding, forgiveness, and a cure for hurt and hatred."* Sr. Barbara Ann Muttra. Their story continues to speak to us today as a living witness to hear the words of the Psalm. Where do we continue to hear the cry of others today?

On October 21 we celebrated the feast of our founder, St. Gaspar del Bufalo. As people of the Blood, we know how precious and life-giving blood is in our lives from a physical aspect as well as spiritual. *St. Gaspar, you loved the persecuted Church, and in the name of God you accepted disgrace and exile. We beg your intercession for the Church today; help us discern how we are to live and promote the message of the Gospel. United with you, may our hearts have compassion for the poor and abandoned. Increase our love for the Blood of Christ, so that we may be prepared to risk our lives. We thank God for your good works and example. Strengthen our union with you that we may not weaken, but grow stronger in our vocation to the honor of God and salvation of souls. Amen. (Prayer of St. Gaspar for the Church)*

May we continue to hear the cry of others in our own lives and beware of our needs as well as the needs of other.

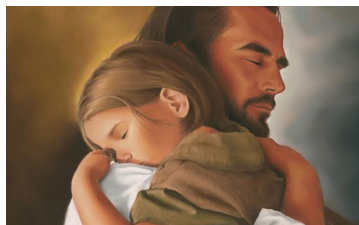

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I was immediately captivated by this picture when I recently found it on the Internet. I was drawn into the dual image of an innocent, trusting child and our loving Jesus clinging to one another. I felt the strength of their embrace. At the same time my mind was swirling with scriptural references to God's love, as I attempted to articulate my understanding of His personal love relationship with me. Is God's love as simple and complete as this picture indicates? When and how have I felt His love; am I troubled or comforted by His tenderness? Deep within my being, I know God's love is perfect, unconditional, personal and beyond understanding. His love is known through grace; it is limitless, offering healing, forgiveness and salvation. However, how do I explain God's love to someone in pain, someone who is grieving loss, or someone looking for acceptance and direction?

As I've grown older my tendency to look for complicated, complexed answers to basic questions is overshadowed by my desire for simplicity. Although simple answers often seem missing from my life, when I focus on this picture I truly feel its simple beauty, and I am encouraged to receive God's love without question. With God, I can be myself, without pretense. He knows me as I am, He understands me, and He loves me unconditionally. He is my Father, and my faith is tightly bound to accepting that I am His child. To understand His love I must let go of my adult baggage, the hurts, the scars, the pain, the failures, and yes my sins. I must run into His arms, feel His warmth, and cry until my tears are all shed. I must give myself and my life completely to Jesus, and trust in the knowledge that He will never abandon me.

Recently someone ask this question: "Do I love my spouse and family more than I love God?" My immediate thought was that we cannot show true love to others without first loving God and accepting His love for us. Then I found this quote: "God uses our love for others to reach our hearts with His love." (Eugenia Price from *The Beloved Invader*) Reflecting on this quote I was struck by its simplicity. God is love, and Jesus tell us that we will be known as one of His followers by our love. When I let go of trying to analyze everything about everyone, and simply love them as they are, help them in their need, and listen to what troubles them, I learn to love as He does. It is in self-giving that I find God's love. It is in sharing my gifts with others than I give as He instructed. It is in accepting His unconditional love for me that I learn to love all God's children as He created them.

C.S. Lewis wrote: "Though our feelings come and go, God's love for us does not." I know that I am imperfect. I also know that as I open myself to God's loving embrace all things are possible, even shedding my desire to know all the answers.

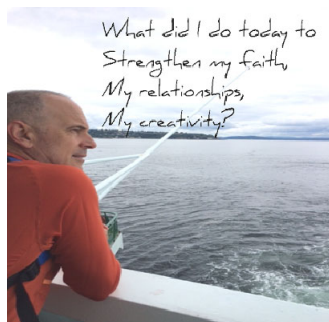
Our Little Saints Halloween Party will be held on Monday Oct. 31 from 10 to 11:30 am in the Narthex and Mallen Room.

Year of Mercy Event Holy Family Catholic Church

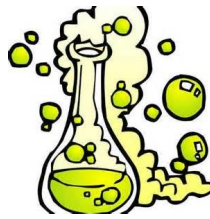

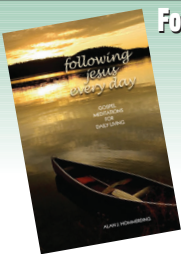
