From the Pastor's Pen

On Monday, I made the trip across Missouri into Illinois headed to Chicago. As I'm driving I'm thinking of all the fun I once had in Chicago while I was in formation and wondering why did I ever leave such a great city? And then!!!! I hit the traffic!!! Welcome to the parking lot on a 5-lane interstate and we go from doing 70 down to 20 and we are crawling. Now I remember why I got out of here and headed back to the Kansas City area. This past week, my friend and Precious Blood Companion Debbie Bolin, my sister Danielle and I traveled to Chicago on a Mission Trip. We will be staying at the Formation House and working at Precious Blood Ministry of Reconciliation Center. Last summer, Debbie and I traveled to Chicago and we built a water feature in the Prayer Garden along with installing an irrigation system in the community garden. Earlier this spring, more raised garden beds were added and we were asked if we would help add more irrigation lines. Sure!!! And so it begins! As I write this, we are gathering supplies and waiting for the dirt to be delivered to fill the 11 new raised beds.

In addition to helping with the garden, we are also assembling a couple baskets for the PBMR Gala Fundraiser. Last year's proceeds went towards purchasing a house in the neighborhood. This year's proceeds will go towards repairs and furnishing the house and scholarships for the continuing education of the youth who participate in the activities at the Center. The recently purchased house is a fixer upper. Working with local carpenters, it will also be a training center for woodworking and construction skills for the youth. Once the house is finished, part of it will be used for office space and the other part will continue to be used for skills training.

PBMR continues to reach out to the youth and young adults of the area. We work with those who have known violence in their lives and are trying to make a difference by offering a safe space, where youth can gather and talk about life and learn a new skill or two.

Next week I will be headed to Columbia to participate in the Busy Person Retreat at Mizzou. Please keep the students, other spiritual directors, and myself in your prayers.

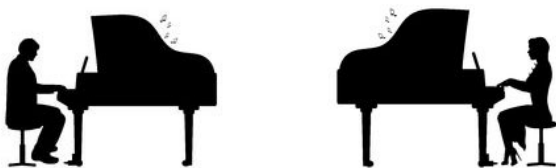
Additional 15 Decades of the Rosary After Mass

All are invited to attend this awesome event.

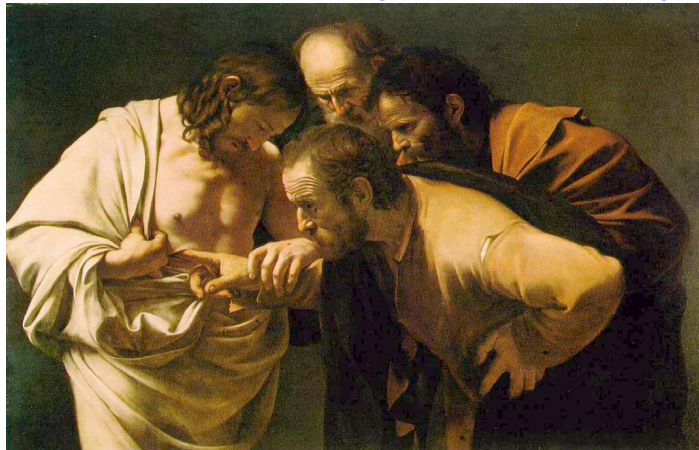

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I spent many hours this past week reflecting on the Triduum, and today on this "Octave of Easter" I find myself wondering how to move forward. Where is Jesus leading me?

Sometimes I feel like Peter, switching back and forth between exuberantly proclaiming what it means to be a Christian, following the teachings of Jesus and yet fearful of what others might think of me. I know I love Jesus and I try to be a faithful disciple but sometimes I crawl into my shell of self consciousness, not wanting to make waves or stand out from the comfortable crowd. There are other times when my scientific, fact based way of thinking kicks into high gear and like Thomas I need proof. I believe in Jesus. I know He died on the cross, rose from the grave and ascended to the father. My doubt, however, is about me. How do I live my beliefs, rejoicing in life, and opening myself to God's will? I need proof, a well marked path to follow?

I believe that my life is a gift from God. I believe that His Holy Spirit has been within me from the moment I was conceived. I believe He cleansed me from sin through the waters of Baptism. I believe I was changed when I accepted His love and was reawakened to His Spirit through Confirmation, and I know I am continually nourished and strengthened each time I receive His body and blood at communion. What I don't know is where the path He is giving me leads.

One thing of which I am certain; life is a journey of conversion for every person who identifies as Christian. The journey is relational and begins with being attracted to Jesus' teachings, or perhaps a community of faith-filled people. What comes, however, next may be totally unexpected and happens unconsciously. We fall in love. That's correct, we fall in love with Jesus. We give Him our hearts. The difficult part of this journey is the next step, and for me seems to be on-going; learning to trust Him. Not just through simple words, but truly trust Jesus with my life. Remember the words of Mary, "Let it be done unto me," and of Jesus, "Not my will but my Father's," and "Father, into your hands."

Being a bit of a control freak it is not easy to echo these words from the depth of my heart, just like it is hard for me to ask for help. I know, however, this is part of my Journey of relationship and fullness of life with God. I must surrender my life, my will to Him. I believe this is the path He is placing in front of me. I pray with Jesus' help I can embrace and follow His will.

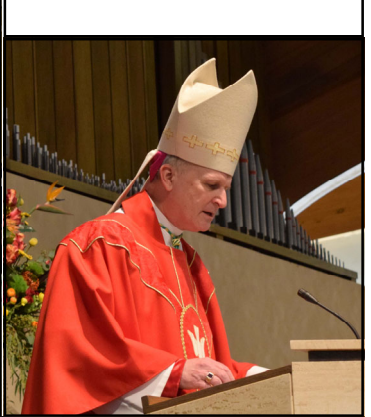
MARCH 21 BLOOD DRIVE RESULTS

Divine Mercy Sunday

This weekend is Divine Mercy Divine Mercy Sunday But what does that mean?



Divine Mercy Sunday was granted as a feast to the whole Church by St. John Paul II on April 30, 2000. That's the same day St. Faustina was canonized. St. Faustina was a young Polish nun who lived a very simple, humble life of service. Jesus appeared to her and spoke to her about His mercy. In many of Jesus' revelations to St. Faustina, He urged that there be a day dedicated to the Divine Mercy. The following quote is from the diary of St. Faustina, quoting Jesus.

"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy . . . The Feast of Mercy emerged from the very depths of My tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter." (Diary 699)

We are encouraged to perform deeds of mercy, stemming out of a love for God. Maybe it's being merciful to a friend or family member who may have upset us. We are also encouraged to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation, receive Holy Communion, and recite an Our Father and the Creed on this day to obtain the graces of the plenary indulgence." ~Dom Quaglia

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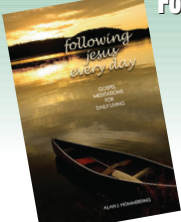
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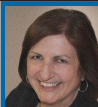
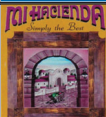
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
