From the Pastor's Pen

I love this time of the year. Spring is a great time to get back outside and play in the yard. Clean the old leaves off the deck, mulch any remains of last year's dead plants, and stir up the dirt and get it ready for new life. What a great feel to get my hands in the dirt once again! This spring has been no different in getting outside and adding some color and life to the back-yard. I can still hear Dad's voice saying, "Gotta get the potatoes in by St. Patty's day, tomatoes by Mother's Day, and something else by June 1st." And some years we were planting seed potatoes by the Ides of March, or at least by the light of the moon. I never did understand why these dates were such great markers, but it did make it easy to remember.

We have celebrated Easter and Mother's Day and as we continue this Easter journey, we will soon celebrate Ascension followed by Pentecost and two other feast days, The Most Holy Trinity and the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. These feast days mark significant happenings or experiences in our faith history. More than just marking the day, it also serves it to excite the spiritual life by reminding us of the event it commemorates.

Ascension Thursday, forty days after Easter, celebrates the ascension of our Lord. In this diocese, the celebration is transferred to Sunday. Fifty days after Easter we celebrate Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit. The promise of Jesus to be with us always. The feast of the Holy Trinity came to be celebrated to counter the Arian heresy that denied the fullness of the divinity of the Son. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. And finally, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi, celebrating the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

These feast days mark special days in our faith journey. Just as we celebrate birthdays and anniversaries to honor our cherished love ones, so to do we celebrate in our church. As we celebrate these upcoming feast days, may we take time to reflect what significance they have in the church and what they mean to us in our lives. If you were asked to share with your child what this feast is about, what would you say? If someone visiting our church asked what are we celebrating today, what would you tell them?

It's more than just a date on the calendar, it is the faith we live. My prayers are with you today, Fr. Timothy

Liberty Women's Clinic Mobile Pregnancy Unit



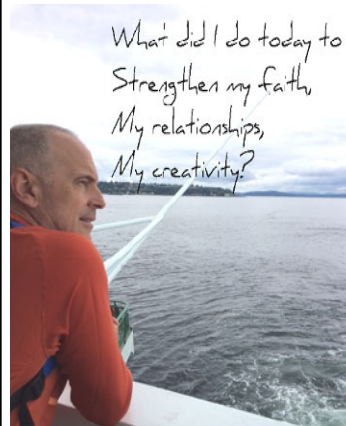
The Liberty Women's Clinic Mobile Pregnancy Unit will be at St. James this Sunday between 8:15 and 11:15 am.

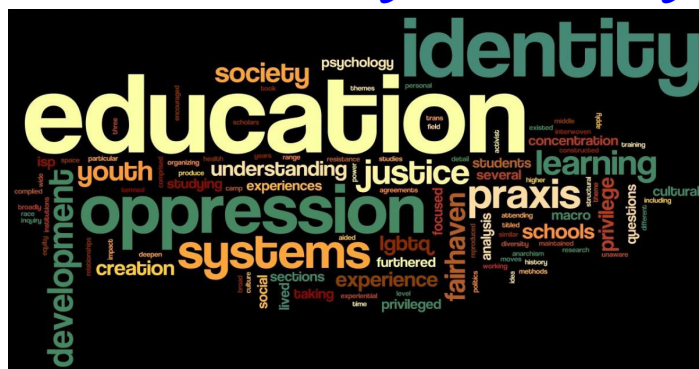

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Recently I have been re-reading the Church's teachings on social justice, and what follows is a very long quote from the *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* from 2004, which I believe is still so applicable today and worthy of our attention.

"Love faces a vast field of work and the Church is eager to make her contribution with her social doctrine, which concerns the whole person and is addressed to all people. So many needy brothers and sisters are waiting for help, so many who are oppressed are waiting for justice, so many who are unemployed are waiting for a job, so many people are waiting for respect. "How can it be that even today there are still people dying of hunger? Condemned to illiteracy? Lacking the most basic medical care? Without a roof over their head? The scenario of poverty can extend indefinitely, if in addition to its traditional forms we think of its newer patterns. These latter often affect financially affluent sectors and groups which are nevertheless threatened by despair at the lack of meaning in their lives, by drug addiction, by fear of abandonment in old age or sickness, by marginalization or social discrimination ... And how can we remain indifferent to the prospect of an ecological crisis which is making vast areas of our planet uninhabitable and hostile to humanity? Or by the problems of peace, so often threatened by the spectre of catastrophic wars? Or by contempt for the fundamental human rights of so many people, especially children?"

Christian love leads to denunciation, proposals and a commitment to cultural and social projects; it prompts positive activity that inspires all who sincerely have the good of man at heart to make their contribution. Humanity is coming to understand ever more clearly that it is linked by one sole destiny that requires joint acceptance of responsibility, a responsibility inspired by an integral and shared humanism. It sees that this mutual destiny is often conditioned and even imposed by technological and economic factors, and it senses the need for a greater moral awareness that will guide its common journey. Marveling at the many innovations of technology, the men and women of our day strongly desire that progress be directed towards the true good of the humanity, both of today and tomorrow. "

May each of us truly reflect on these words.

Classes Are Over

Classes are over, but the work still goes on! We are busy wrapping up the final paperwork for this year, putting things away and getting things tidied up. Next on our plate is to make plans for next year!

I have looked through the surveys from the last day and I so appreciate how honest and open you all were. It helps me greatly to see where you are, what you need, and what works for you. It has also been interesting to look at the differences between the Wednesday evening responses and the Sunday morning ones.

One of the things that came through very clearly is your desire to be a part of the team working with your child – to know what lessons they are working on so that you can talk about the same things at home. I'll be looking at how we can communicate better while not putting a bigger time challenge on our volunteers. I'd like to find ways for parents to be in the classrooms on an occasional basis, but at the same time trying to be respectful of the many demands on your time.

That was also a frequently mentioned challenge--that parents feel pulled in many directions with so many demands on their time and their family's time. It's hard to know where to put those boundaries, and it's easy to say "put Church first" but it's not so simple to realistically put that into practice. I could demonize sports and wag my finger about the number of practices, games and tournaments that happen on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings, taking kids away from their religious studies. But as the parent of 5 student athletes, I also know that my kids learned wonderful values in those sports that they use in their now-adult lives. My kids happened to receive other scholarships, but I know many students who received lucrative athletic scholarships from those same time-consuming sports, which is no small thing to most families.

I also know how easy it is to let one activity override all of the others, and how necessary it is for Mom & Dad to put their finger on the scale to bring things back into balance. I don't have the perfect answer to this problem, but it is one that we are looking at as we make plans for next year and look for ways to integrate classroom work with family life.

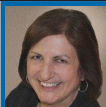
