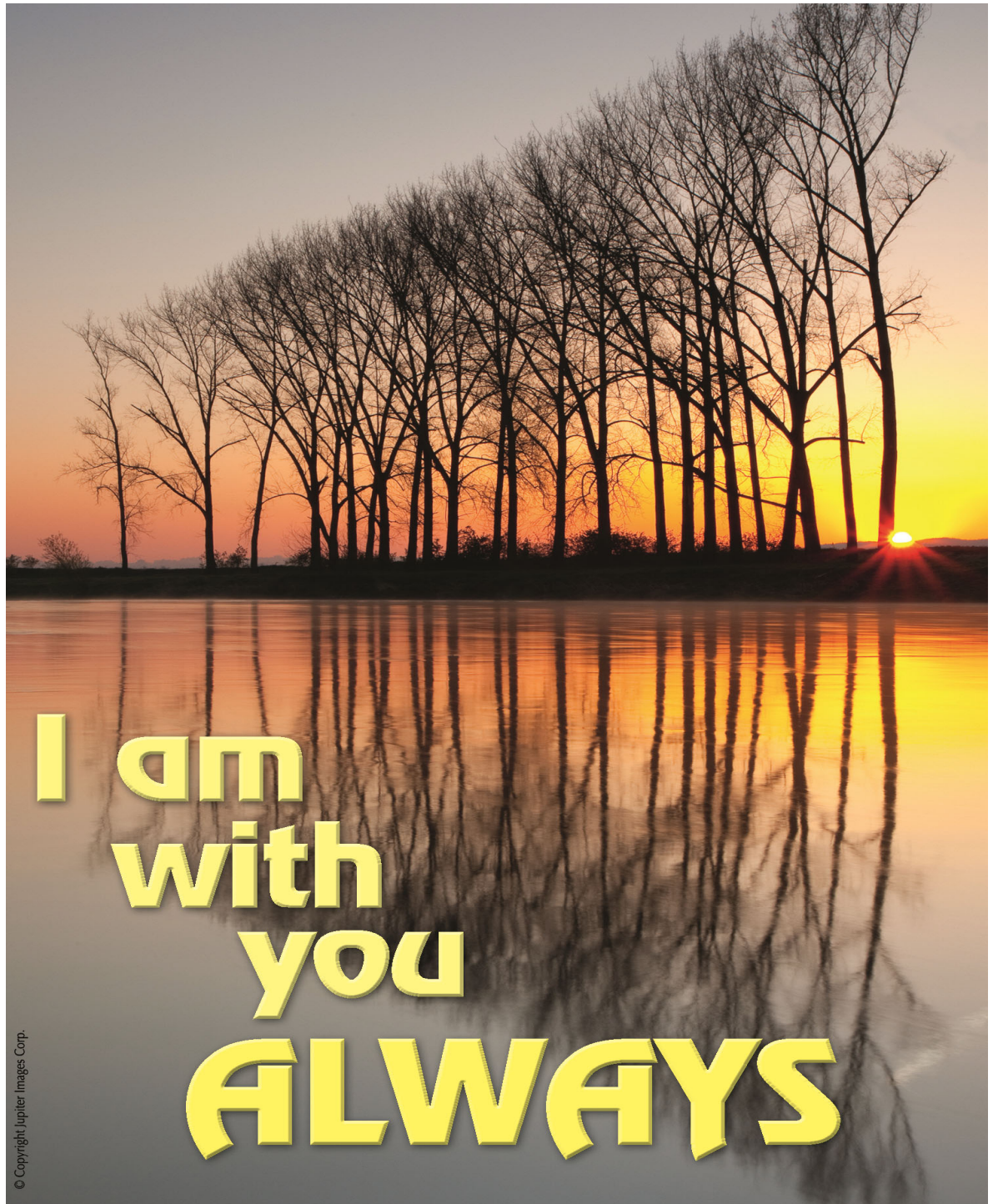

Do You Know?

The November 2016 Hail Storm damaged all our roofs. The insurance settlement will enable us to replace each of them. Starting Monday, May 8, the job was begun. The flat roof above the gym is being replaced (upgraded to TPO) first; they will then move to the roof above the middle school.

The timeline calls for both to be replaced in six working days, weather permitting.

The balance of our roofs are shingled. The parish office was completed two weeks ago and the Church, Social Hall, and the pitched roof of the school will follow.

Weather permitting (that's a wild assumption), the work will be completed by the second week in June.

An added bonus – our new Church and all the older buildings will be covered for the next generation of "Saints".

SILENCE

A Perspective on SILENCE In Church.

It has been brought to my attention by many of our faithful parishioners that the "NOISE AND TALKING" before Mass, in church, is getting out of hand. So I'm going to address this in my column this week.

After doing a bit a research on Catholic Teachings and Practices, there's no simple solution. Even in our daily culture we rarely find moments of silence.

So we look to our faith and the rich traditions that have been laid before us. Why should we try and observe a sense of quiet and reverence in church before we celebrate the Liturgy?

The most common answer is that we need to respect those around us. Many people use this time to pray and prepare their hearts and minds for the celebration that is about to occur.

For some, this is the only time in their busy hectic lives they get to clear their minds and spend time in prayer.

Now, that doesn't mean you can't say hello and welcome your neighbor as they sit next to you!

By all means, be hospitable and welcoming. But this is not the time to share your past week's experiences or talk about lunch plans.

Most of you notice that the musician at Mass plays a prelude before Mass.

This isn't "elevator" music or background music for conversations.

These are musical prayers that have been practiced to be shared with the faithful

to help them enter into a sense of sacredness.

But lately, a lot of people just talk LOUDER and pay no attention.

So, in the coming weeks, I ask you to be mindful of the sacredness of the space. If you need to talk, please do so in the Narthex and allow others in church the opportunity to pray without distraction.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I begin today by proposing a question: What is the meaning of the Feast of the Ascension?" I am confident most of us can give a good explanation of what this feast represents, but that really isn't my question. Rather, what does the Ascension of Jesus mean to you, to me; how does

this event change our understanding of living as a Christian? I propose two ideas.

First, it was Jesus' human body that ascended. Although this statement may seem overly simplistic, think about the significance of the incarnation. "Jesus, who though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness . . . humbled himself and became obedient" (Phil 2:6-8). Jesus appeared not as God but as one of God's human creatures. He was born, grew, learned a trade, left the comforts of home to begin teaching God's love and how to share His love with one another, suffered pain and humiliation, was killed by those who feared how his message might change their lives, rose from death into new life, and returned to the Father, glorified yet still human. To me the life of Jesus re-emphasizes what God did in the beginning. Created you and I out of love. We are made in His image and likeness. God continues to grace every human with life and through Jesus we know God's promise of eternal reunion with Him, at the end of our earthly life.

Secondly, the ascension of Jesus makes me think of graduation and commencement. This may sound odd, but what happens when one graduates from school? Simply stated, graduation marks the end of our old life and the time for beginning a new life. Graduation marks the moment to commence accepting new challenges, set new goals, move forward. This is what happened to the disciples. There was nothing else for Jesus to do on earth. He had loved, taught, and died. Jesus was finished, even though he appeared to them after the resurrection and continued to reassure them that God's kingdom was real and present in their lives. He was leaving so they might begin their work.

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension, it is a reminder, a recall to each of us that like the disciples our work cannot end. We must continue to teach and bring the "Good News" to one another. Christians know that love is the reason for the Incarnation, and it is love which God awaits as our response. It is this love which must enliven our social, political, economic and cultural lives. Only God's love, present and alive in our world, will bring true joy and everlasting peace.

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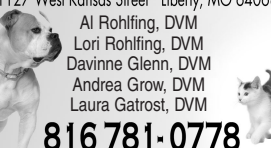
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
