From the Pastor's Pen

Wow!!! Summer is here or so I hope it is! After days of rain, it so great to see the sun again. I just returned from spending Memorial Weekend in Chicago with some friends. The day I arrived it was gorgeous and sunny and I walked all over the Edge Water and Rogers Park. The next two days were overcast cloudy and rained off and on. Finally, Monday the sun appeared on a cloudless day and everyone and anyone was out along the beach. What a refreshing time to walk along the beach feeling the sand between one's toes. And now, back home.

I returned home amid preparing for our annual Precious Blood Assembly. This year our Assembly is being held at the Hilton Kansas City Airport. We begin on Monday evening, June 5 and end with the Jubilee Dinner on Wednesday evening, June 7. On Thursday morning, June 8, we will travel to St. Francis Xavier church in St. Joseph, MO, for the priesthood ordination of Rev. Peter Thom, C.P.P.S. Peter Thom is originally from Vietnam. Once ordained, he will return to Vietnam and continue to serve with other C.P.P.S. Missionaries.

As part of our Assembly this year, our focus will be upon looking ahead to our future as a province and community. At the 20th General Assembly in Rome, our entire community worldwide has been charged with answering the question, "What does it mean to live an authentic Precious Blood community life?" For the past four months, we, members and companions, have been meeting to discuss varied aspects of community life and have been gathering data from our small group meetings. As we come together for Assembly, we will be writing a final statement that will be presented at the meeting in Rome in July. This statement will share our experiences as well as answering the question of authentic Precious Blood way of life. In some sense, it is what we do. Now, how do we put it into words?

This whole discussion will lead us into the future of how we continue to live together in community and invite vocations as well as companions to join us in ministry.

We ask for your prayers as we embark on this journey and continue to serve as Missionaries of the Precious Blood.

SILENCE

A Perspective on SILENCE In Church.

It has been brought to my attention by many of our faithful parishioners that the "NOISE AND TALKING" before Mass, in church, is getting out of hand.

So I'm going to address this in my column this week.

After doing a bit a research on Catholic Teachings and Practices, there's no simple solution. Even in our daily culture we rarely find moments of silence.

So we look to our faith and the rich traditions that have been laid before us.

Why should we try and observe a sense of quiet and reverence in church before we celebrate the Liturgy?

The most common answer is that we need to respect those around us. Many people use this time to pray and prepare their hearts and minds for the celebration that is about to occur.

For some, this is the only time in their busy hectic lives they get to clear their minds and spend time in prayer.

Now, that doesn't mean you can't say hello and welcome your neighbor as they sit next to you!

By all means, be hospitable and welcoming. But this is not the time to share your past week's experiences or talk about lunch plans.

Most of you notice that the musician at Mass plays a prelude before Mass.

This isn't "elevator" music or background music for conversations.

These are musical prayers that have been practiced to be shared with the faithful

to help them enter into a sense of sacredness.

But lately, a lot of people just talk LOUDER and pay no attention.

So, in the coming weeks, I ask you to be mindful of the sacredness of the space. If you need to talk, please do so in the Narthex and allow others in church the opportunity to pray without distraction.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over the past several years I have tried to answer the question: "What does it mean to receive the Holy Spirit; when and how does this happen?" I personally have never had an experience like the apostles on the first Pentecost or Saul on the road to Damascus. When I was confirmed (at 46 years of age) and anointed with Chrism I felt a

warmth within and experienced a feeling of peace and well being. I knew that I had made the correct decision in becoming a Catholic Christian and renewing the baptismal promises I made many years before. I was entering a new stage of my life, welcoming the challenges to come, and embracing God's love after many years of seeking and questioning. Yet I did not sense any great change or wisdom in my life. In retrospect I realize not only how my life has changed, but a deepening experience of God's Spirit working within me. There are so many things I once believed to be important, even necessary in my life, that today seem insignificant. I no longer feel the need for accumulating possessions, seeking personal recognition, or achieving lofty, self serving goals. Instead, sharing the love of Christ, speaking out for the voiceless, protecting the vulnerable, seeking and offering forgiveness, embracing the beauty of God's creation while trying to be a good steward, and walking with others who are in pain or looking for peace and joy seem to be the direction in which He is leading me. Since my confirmation 22 years ago I have fallen more deeply in love with Jesus and continue to learn how to trust Him and surrender to His will; yet I know my journey of conversion is far from complete. I realize I am still somewhat afraid to fully let go of my ego and desires. I still cling to my independence and ability to make decisions for myself. I want to follow Him, do His will, show His face to the world, but the path seems unclear with many blind hills and curves. Upon further reflection, however, I feel that to receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit I must be patient, be open, and be willing to give my life to God, in loving surrender. Like Jesus I may ask my heavenly Father to take away the cup of pain and suffering while being willing to embrace His will.

When did I receive His Spirit; that moment He graced me with life. It is my choice, however, to welcome that same Spirit each and every moment as I go about living in His kingdom. Whenever I ask Him to be with me, lead me, and help me to make a choice or decision, I am inviting His Spirit into my life. Today, may we joyfully renew reception of the Holy Spirit.

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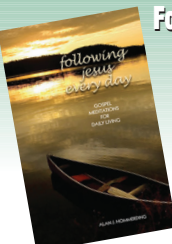


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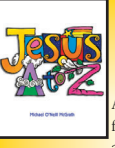
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
