Important Information About the Parish Hall Partitions

Last September St. James invested close to \$20,000 for the purchase and installation of the Parish Hall partitions. The purpose of that investment was and is:

(1) To allow multiple groups a clean and professional environment for meetings or small class sessions. Space is always a problem in our growing community.

(2) To provide minimum security in a professional environment for very small children to be contained, under adult supervision, in a smaller area. PBJ and nursery etc.

Please Be Aware that neither of these utilization's require locking the partitions.

When properly aligned the partitions will close securely and easily with no need to apply the locks. If the partitions are locked and you are not scheduled (critical dates) you probably do not need to get in. If you have that need, use a dime on the lock, NEVER a screw driver or similar device. The lock has a half-moon receptacle on the outer side.

Two of these locks have been damaged in the past weeks by using a screwdriver. Muscle is never the way to handle the lock or the partitions. We will ensure that groups using the facilities after hours through critical dates are alerted.

From the Pastor's Pen

As I write this pen, we have just completed this year's Provincial Assembly and have witnessed Peter Tam Hoang, C.P.P.S. being ordained to the priesthood. (And yes, I misspelled his name previously.) It was a wonderful week of C.P.P.S. community and a sharing of who and what we are about. We are Missionaries of the Blood committed to reconciliation and renewal of the church through the preaching of the Word. Our discussions over this past year and a half have focused on answering the question what does it mean to live an authentic Precious Blood way of life. We were challenged to go deeper in terms of what this means and how we are living it out in our lives – the challenge we face of inviting others to discern with us and listen and respond to the call of God in our lives.

On this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we reflect upon what this gift means to us in our lives. As a community of Precious Blood, the Cup, the Blood of Christ, is central to our spirituality. The blood that was poured out for us. His precious blood that was shed on the cross for the forgiveness of sins. In John's account, blood and water flowed from his side. An image of new life and birth. We each know how important blood is to each one of us. It is the very life-force that flows through our bodies that feeds and nourishes us. Jesus' words to Peter, "Can you drink of the cup?" What does it mean for us today to drink of the cup? Is it a cup of blessing? A cup of bitterness? A cup of sorrow? A cup of healing? What of our lives have we poured into this cup? And what of the cup have we drank and shared?

By this time, I should be back home recovering from surgery. Hopefully I'll be out down and out a few days as I am not one to gracefully sit around and do nothing.

As the weather turns warmer and summer is in full swing, may we enjoy these days with family and friends and know the very gift of Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist.

Hello friends! So many of you have been asking about my health, so I thought it would be easier if I wrote a little update this week in my column. As most of you know, on April 4th I had gastric sleeve surgery. Since my surgery I've already lost 78lbs. And I must say, I feel great! I have more energy. My back doesn't hurt and plus I'm sleeping much better.

For my next step, this is what I know. I go back to the liver doctor at the beginning of August to re-evaluate my liver. There are two outcomes possible. First one could be that because of the weight loss, the progression of the liver disease has slowed. If that's the case I won't need a liver transplant YET. Or option 2, the liver disease is still progressing rapidly and then I'll be put on a transplant list.

Your continued support and prayers are greatly appreciated and I've certainly felt them these past few months!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I haven't forgotten that today is Father's Day; a time to honor fathers and father figures in our lives. In the Church, however, today is the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). These two celebrations do not always fall on the same day since the date for *Corpus Christi* depends on the date for Easter Sunday. *Corpus Christi* is celebrated on the second Sunday after Pentecost. The origin of this feast has roots in the 12th century, with an exaggerated

emphasis on adoration of the real presence of Christ in the consecrated bread to the exclusion of the fuller meaning of Eucharist as celebration and a meal to be eaten and shared. People in the Middle Ages felt unworthy to receive Christ in communion, preferring to only gaze upon the Blessed Sacrament. This practice led to the introduction of the elevation of the bread and cup during Mass and ultimately to public displays such as the Benediction ritual.

The special feast devoted to the Body and Blood of Christ was introduced to the universal church in 1264, and tradition holds that St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the prayers and hymns for this liturgical celebration. Today, the Feast of the Precious Blood (July 1st) is incorporated in this solemnity. (FYI - Fr. Timothy and other members of the Precious Blood Community still also celebrate this feast on July 1st.)

The most obvious tradition associated with today's feast is the *Corpus Christi* Procession. This procession was common by the 13th century and within 100 years was adopted in most countries. The procession includes carrying the Blessed Sacrament, visible in a vessel called a monstrance (derived from the Latin *monstrare*, meaning to show.) In most places the procession included features of a pageant with lavish decorations and flowers. In Germany, the procession wound through the town as well as the surrounding fields. It was also popular to stop at outdoor altars or stations for prayer, song, and blessing with the Sacrament. The motive behind the procession was to publically display belief in the Real Presence. Remember, however, the procession is an exercise of devotion, not a liturgical ritual.

Vatican II emphasized reform and renewal of the liturgy with the meaning of the Eucharist recaptured in the context of a meal, the church's public worship, and most parishioners receiving Communion when they participate in the Mass. The original motives for the procession, especially the need to look at and be blessed with the Blessed Sacrament, instead of "take and eat" no longer apply.

The Friday following *Corpus Christi* is the day the Church celebrates the third solemnity, the Feast of the Sacred Heart. This devotional day is a day to honor Jesus for the love symbolized by His heart. May each of us strive to reflect His love to others every day, not just during this feast.

Early Childhood Program

At St. James, the early childhood program provides students with a wide range of opportunities. Here is a sneak peek at what we offer:

Kindergarten

A strong home-school connection is emphasized with ongoing communication through weekly emails, photo blogs and classroom websites.

Parents are encouraged to become a part of the classroom through weekly hands-on parent centers and multiple study trips during the school year.

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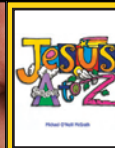


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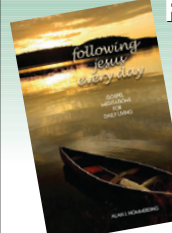


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
