


Do You Know?

St. Thomas, Apostle, Feast Day - July 3



St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas".

He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

From the Pastor's Pen

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

As Missionaries of the Precious Blood, we celebrate the Feast of the Precious Blood on July 1st. What was once a devotion has become a spirituality and charism for us today. We are a community committed to renewal of the church and reconciliation through the preaching of the Word. We hear and respond to "the cry of the blood" in the ministries that we choose. Our spirituality calls us to reach out to the poor and marginalized of our church and society.

One ministry that continues to grow is our Precious Blood Ministry of Reconciliation in Chicago. In the neighborhood known as the Back of the Arts, we reach out to many young men who are involved in gangs. For many years, our missionaries ministered in Cook County Jail and Youth Detention. We encountered youth after the fact of being involved in gangs and being arrested. Through the ministry we do today, we are able to work with youth and provide alternative to gangs and hopefully keep them out of trouble. We also minister to Moms with sons and daughters incarcerated. It is a safe place where one's story can be told and acknowledged and know that he or she matters. Recently a house in the neighborhood was purchased and with the help of professionals, the house is being rehabbed and the youth are doing the work. In the process they are learning various skills which hopefully will lead to something worthwhile in the future.

For us, it is more than just a devotion to the Precious Blood. It is a call to service, action and responding to the needs of others. It is valuing the preciousness of life and in turn hopefully helping to make the world a better place to live that life.

in the sky - they do not fall.*


*The psalmist's resolve to sing highlights

This weekend is a time for many of us to celebrate the birth of our Nation with family and friends. Along with cookouts, picnics, boating, fishing, swimming, baseball, outdoor concerts, and fireworks this is a time for reflection on what it means to live in the United States of America in 2017. To begin I present two quotations:



"We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness —That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed." and

"We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."

The first quote is from the Declaration of Independence, signed on July 4, 1776, and the second is the preamble to our U.S. Constitution. In rereading these documents I am reminded of our responsibilities to one another. They also brought to mind several passages from scripture: "Be free, yet without using freedom as a pretext for evil, but as slaves of God." (1 Peter 3:16); "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." (2 Corinthians 3:17); "For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another." (Galatians 5:13), and of course there is Jesus' call to love one another. I found so much similarity between scripture and these two principle documents of our country, that I felt a renewed sense of true freedom. Our founding fathers were very clear that there are certain "unalienable Rights" which governments, as well as every individual, must protect for all people if we are to live in a just society. For me, in order to protect the rights of other and insure their freedoms, I must first trust and live in Christ Jesus. I must open my heart to His will, and welcome His grace which leads and strengthens me. It is all too easy to attend to my own needs and security without first giving myself to others. I think protecting our freedom is found only through living in and serving Christ.




