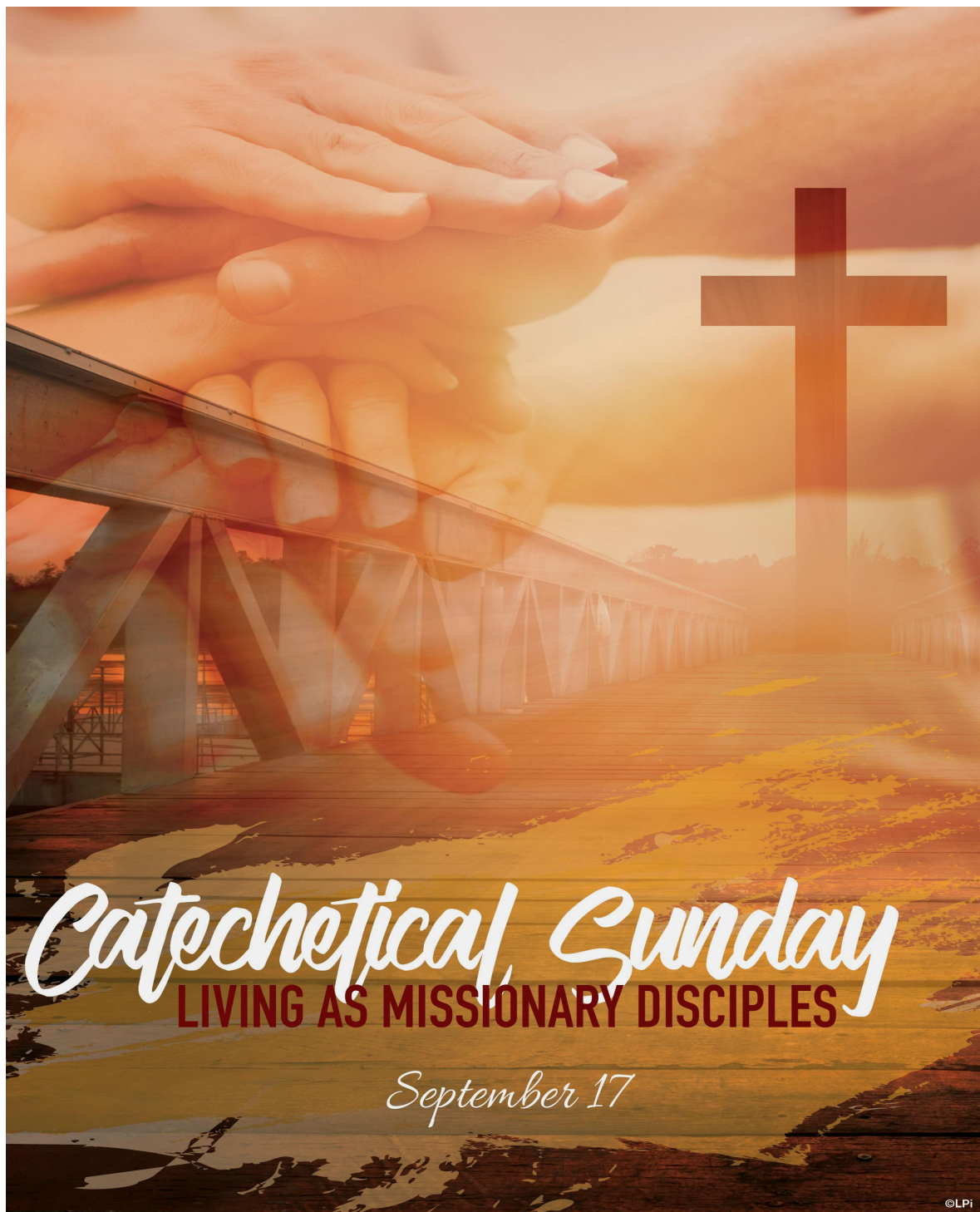

A from the Liturgy/Music Office

WHY DO CHRISTIANS SING WHEN THEY ARE TOGETHER?

The reason is, quite simply, because in singing together it is possible for them to speak and pray the same word at the same time; in other words, because here they can unite in the word.



There should be singing, not only at devotions but regular times of the day or week. The more we sing the more joy will we derive from it, but, above all, the more devotion and discipline and joy we put into our singing, the richer will be the blessing that will come to the whole life of the fellowship from singing together

It is the voice of the church that is heard in singing together. It is not you that sings; it is the church that is singing, and you, as a member of the church, may share in its song.

Thus all singing together that is right must serve to widen our spiritual horizon, make us see our little company as a member of the great Christian Church on earth, and help us willingly and gladly to join our singing, be it feeble or good, to the song of the church.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

In 1592, during the Joseon Dynasty (1392-1897) Japan invaded Korea but the invading soldiers also introduced Christianity through baptism of Koreans. Evangelization continued during the 17th century through the laity's strong faith. In the 1700's members of the Silhak (practical learning) school were drawn to Christian thought because it advocated a social structure that was not based on birth rank, and many early Korean Christians had family ties to this school.

During the late Joseon Dynasty, with its strong Confucian influence, many Christians were persecuted. Andrew Kim Taegon was born into this environment in 1821. Many males in his family were martyred and Kim grew up in poverty.



After Kim's baptism at age 15 he traveled to the Portuguese Colony of Macau, China to study at the seminary. He was ordained a priest in 1845 in Shanghai by the French Bishop, Jean Ferréol and returned to Korea to preach and evangelize. In 1846, while trying to secure passage for other missionaries into Korea, Kim was arrested and imprisoned. While in prison Kim wrote to his community of fellow Christians: *"My dear brothers and sisters know this: Our Lord Jesus Christ upon descending into the world took innumerable pains upon and constituted the holy Church through his own passion and increases it through the passion of its faithful even today persecution rages, so that many of our friends of the same faith . . . remain in the midst of persecution. Since we have formed one body, how can we not be saddened in our innermost hearts? How can we not experience the pain of separation in our human faculties? However, as Scripture says, God cares for the least hair of our heads, and indeed he cares with his omniscience; I pray you to walk in faith, so that when you have finally entered into Heaven, we may greet one another. I leave you my kiss of love."* On September 16, 1846, at the age of 25, Kim was killed. We celebrate his feast this week on September 20th. Andrew Kim Taegon is a reminder that we are all brothers and sisters in Christ, and that when one suffers we all suffer. We are all one Body in Christ.

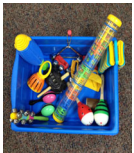
Snack Pack Ministry - Help Needed

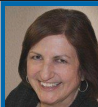
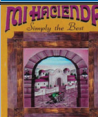
