

Do You Know?

Ground water pressure has forced water through the surface of portions of our parking lot and caused considerable damage.

In the next two weeks, weather permitting, we will attempt to alleviate ground water pressure through a series of "French Drains".

Contractors will bury approximately 360 feet of 6 inch perforated pipe to relieve pressure and move the water to the slit drain that runs parallel to the Palisade Road.

We will mill 1 1/2" of the asphalt (approximately 6,600 square feet) in the damaged area and install the surface to code.

Top dress and restripe of the entire lot will tie into completion of the church.

Looking Ahead to Christmas When is Mass and For Which Day??



Because Christmas falls on a Monday, it makes the holiday Mass schedule a little different than usual.

On the weekend of December 23/24, the 5:00pm Saturday Mass and the 9:15am Mass on Sunday will be for the 4th Sunday of Advent, not for the Christmas obligation.

Also on the 24th, Christmas Eve, there will be two Christmas Masses at 4:00pm (one in the church, one in the gym), one Mass at 7:00pm and one Mass at 10:00pm. There is one Mass on Christmas Day at 9am. All of these Masses will fulfill the Christmas Holy day obligation.

For New Year's Eve and the Feast of the Solemnity of Mary (January 1), there is no holy day obligation when the feast falls on a Monday, so no "extra" masses are required.

From the Pastor's Pen

It's still a bit hard to believe it's now the first of December and the days are still sunny and warm. I'm not sure I could live in a warm climate in December. I know as much as some people dislike the cold, I still need to the cold to remind me what time of the year it is.

With the turn of the calendar, we begin the season of Advent. Just as the trees have shed their leaves and the once beautiful flowers have withered and died, we notice the drab colors of fall giving way to winter. The last few days of driving around town I have noticed the stark difference in the drab leafy trees compared to the strong, almost vibrant greens of the evergreens. To me it is a strong reminder that some things must fade away while others remain strong. It's nature at its finest continuing the circle of life. Just a couple of weeks ago I bought some fall bulbs to plant in the front flower bed. For several years now I have bought bulbs in the fall but it seems I never get a chance to plant them. The weather is nice enough to do, and when I get home I think to myself I need to get those bulbs planted and yet the next morning still they still sit in the garage. I love to see the bulbs bloom in the spring to show signs of new life but it takes some work in the fall to make it happen.

Some work in the fall to make things happen in the spring. Something to hope in for the days ahead when the daylight grows shorter and the temperature dips to cold. This first Sunday of Advent we light the first candle of the Advent wreath - the candle of Hope, a Prophet's Candle, a candle to remind us that Jesus is coming. Although we know not the day nor the hour, we still hold that hope and believe that Jesus will one day return. As we make ready our hearts and homes to welcome family and guests, how much more must we do to welcome Jesus into our hearts and homes once again this Advent season?

No one, including myself, likes to just sit and wait. I can be very impatient at times and just want to get things done. What can I do this Advent season to help enable myself to sit and wait in patience?

May the peace of this Advent season help us to be ready and waiting,



Reflection

Happy New Year, Colleagues! Isaiah (clay and potter), Paul (grace and spiritual gift), and Mark (Watch!) have made a valid attempt to start us, and Year B, off on the right foot. As musical clay in the Potter's hands we prepare liturgies with the style and grace of which Gabe Huck spoke so eloquently. We recognize this as a spiritual gift from God to be servant leaders. The call to be vigilant is also a call to be flexible. Like most, we've planned out the music for Advent and Christmas at least a month ago. As we await the coming of the Christ Child, let us be mindful of the spiritual and music needs of those around us with whom we wait.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



At this time every year, I find myself correcting misunderstandings related to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. This Holy Day of Obligation on December 8th is the time the Church traditionally celebrates the birth of Mary. Although nothing is found in Holy Scripture about Mary's birth or childhood, the apocryphal

Protoevangelium of James, although not recognized as a part of the Christian canon, does provide incite into Mary's family and reflects the development of Christian devotion to God.

According to this source Anna and Joachim were infertile but continued to pray for a child. They received the promise of a female child who would be a part of God's plan for salvation. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CC 489) "Throughout the Old Covenant the mission of many holy women prepared for that of Mary." There was Eve, Sarah, Hannah, Deborah, Ruth, Judith, Esther and many others, yet "Mary stands out among the poor and the humble of the Lord, who confidently hope for and receive salvation from Him. St. Augustine writes, "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." Her birth, like every new life, reflects new hope for the world; the love of two humans, joined with God in His creative work. All loving parents reveal their hope in a world filled with violence, hatred, and unrest that their child will be a channel of God's love, hope, and peace to the world. This is magnificently true in Mary. If Jesus is the perfect expression of God's love, Mary is the foreshadowing of His love to the world. If Jesus brings the fullness of salvation, Mary is its dawning. One might ask, how is this possible? That is the essence of her immaculate conception.

Theologically, original sin is understood as our human condition to sinfulness; the absence of holiness and perfect charity into which humans are born. Original sin is not a personal fault, but rather a state wherein we believe that temptation brings fulfillment of our desires. These desires, which we may choose because of free will, are selfish and not God centered. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception states that Mary was conceived free from original sin and immune from all stain of original sin, through the grace of God and salvation of Jesus. Thus she was "full of grace" from the moment of conception and freely accepted God's will as her path.

I think we all agree that birthday celebrations bring happiness. Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth is celebrated with great joy and offers the greatest possibility of hope to the world. As we celebrate her birth we can confidently hope for peace in our hearts and our world.


