She is the handmaid of the Father who sings his praises."

Someone is Watching and Wondering



To me it is very sad when people try to separate life, culture, and our world into "secular" and "holy". In fact, I wonder is it even possible to be fully alive within the created world, fully human as God intended and to live dualistically. As I understand my faith, the answer must be a resounding no. As Catholics we are called to find Jesus in one

another, in the natural world, and in every gift from God. This search or discernment is what is difficult so our tendency is to categorize everything around us into worldly and unworldly, sacred and unsacred, godly and human (with worldly, unsacred and human somehow understood as evil.) To me, that is simply a cop-out.

God isn't some master puppeteer, rather God is a loving parent who not only provides for His children but also allows them to make choices. Being alive and living our humanity to the fullest is, I think, the meaning behind the Incarnation. God's greatest gift to us was becoming human. As such He once again revealed to us that we are all created in His "image and likeness" and that all humanity is sacred. His love is everywhere and He always forgives our poor choices, all we need is to ask. If, like Mary, we surrender to His will, we become co-creators. What is conceived in our minds, created with our hands, and given in loving service to one another, I believe, is sacred and pleasing to our heavenly Father. Through ordinary work, acts of kindness, teaching, healing, planting and sowing the fruits of our labor, we continue Jesus' ministry of spreading the Gospel in the world. I believe we choose to witness to His holiness when we accept the conjoining of what we term "secular" and "holy".

As we conclude our Advent observance today, and celebrate the birth of Jesus, I ask you to look around, Life is truly wondrous and miracles happen every day. Mothers and fathers lovingly care for their children. We find safety, shelter, and nurture within families. Teachers bring the wonder of God's creation to students through science, literature, music, art, reading, writing, mathematics and history. Nurses tenderly care for patients, doctors strive to heal, ministers provide comfort, and service men and women risk all to protect others. God is present in every life, even when we choose to reject Him. The true miracle of Christmas is the softening of our hearts, the opening of our lives, and the awakening of our minds to His presence.

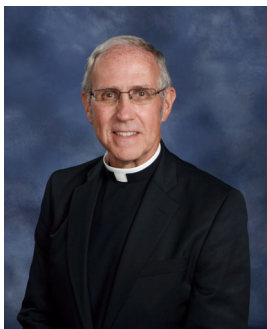
Wishing You A Blessed & Joyous Christmas

The Twelve Days of Christmas

Most of us are familiar with the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas." What may not be widely understood is that the 12 days of Christmas is a festive Christian season, beginning on Christmas Day and ending on January 5 (known as the "twelfth night"), the last day of the Christmas Season before Epiphany on January 7.

In addition to the Nativity of the Lord on December 25, the 12 days include several feast day celebrations including The Holy Innocents, The Holy Family, The Most Holy Name of Jesus, and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.

Legend has it that "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was actually a secret catechism to help Catholics learn the tenets of their faith after the Reformation in many countries such as England, where they were not allowed to practice their faith.

Thus the gifts in the song were hidden meanings to the teachings of the faith. The symbols are said to mean:

- 1 Partridge in a Pear Tree = Jesus Christ, Son of God
- 2 Turtle Doves = The Old and New Testaments
- 3 French Hens = Faith, Hope and Charity
- 4 Calling Birds = the Four Gospels and/or the Four Evangelists
- 5 Golden Rings = The first Five Books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch"
- 6 Geese A-laying = the six days of creation
- 7 Swans A-swimming = the seven sacraments
- 8 Maids A-milking = the eight beatitudes
- 9 Ladies Dancing = the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 10 Lords A-leaping = the ten commandments
- 11 Pipers Piping = the eleven faithful apostles
- 12 Drummers Drumming = the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed



Legend or not, the next time you hear this song it may bring to mind these basic teachings of our faith.

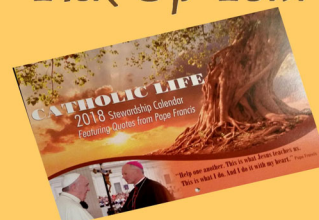
Feast of the Holy Innocents - December 28



Also called Childermas, or Innocents' Day, this feast day commemorates the massacre of the children by King Herod in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus. These innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. These children were regarded by the early church as the first martyrs, but it is uncertain when the day was first kept as a saint's day.

Our Christmas joy is tempered today by a feeling of sadness. But the Church looks principally to the glory of the children, of these innocent victims, whom she shows us in heaven following the Lamb wherever He goes.

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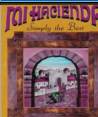
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
