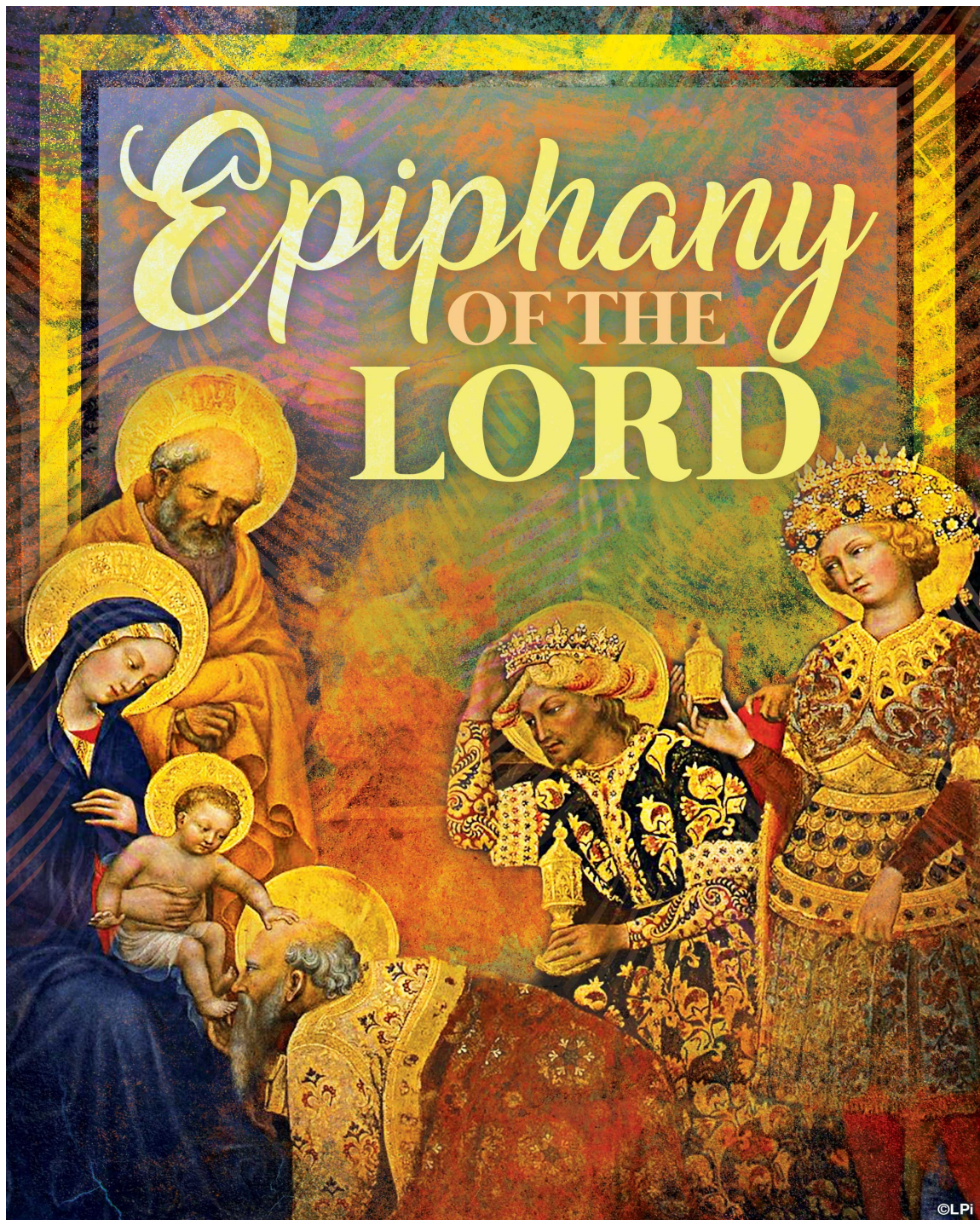

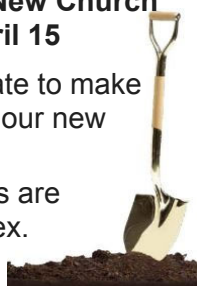

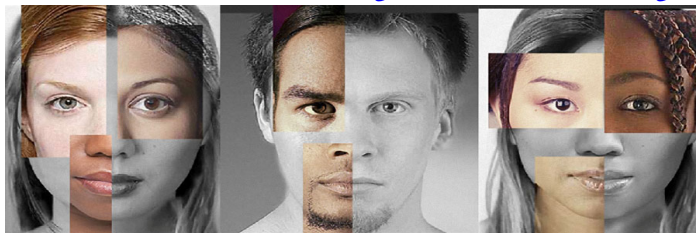
Health Update

Wow! This certainly has been one roller coaster ride of a year. For those who do not know, in January 2017, I was diagnosed with NASH and stage III liver disease. Due to the rapid deterioration of my liver, it was decided my best chance was to have a liver transplant. But because I was so overweight, I could not be placed on the transplant list. So on April 4 of 2017, I had gastric sleeve surgery. Since my surgery in April, I have lost over 120 pounds. I feel great! I cannot remember the last time I've had this much energy. I want to thank all of you for your continued support and prayers. I feel those prayers every day! I am happy to report that I am now currently on the liver transplant list at KU med.

I will be leaving Wednesday, December 27 and returning on January 8 for a much-needed vacation. I will use this time to relax and recharge and get ready for what 2018 has in store for me. I hope soon to receive a phone call saying that they have a liver available for me and will undergo the transplant process.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



During a frequent Internet search I found this picture, an excellent representation of the meaning and significance of today's Gospel reading. As we close the Christmas Season, I am reminded that though we are each unique, we are made in the image and likeness of God, and we are all one in Christ.

Today, celebrating the Feast of the Epiphany, we recognize the Magi as representing Gentiles (i.e. all non-Jewish people of the world). The full impact of this passage is reemphasized at the end of Matthew's Gospel with Jesus' proclamation to His followers: "Go therefore to **all nations (all people)** and make them my disciples; baptize them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, and **teach them** to observe all that I have commanded you." It is crystal clear from these two passages that Gentiles are coheirs with the Jews of the promises of God. In other words, God's promises are to all people, of every nation, culture and language, no matter what their circumstances in life. As such we must never try to limit God's mercy, forgiveness, and love to a few select "Christians/Catholics". In reality, here is no limit to God; God simply is. We are all His children, embraced in His loving arms, and recipients of His Grace. As Catholics we must continually embrace this truth through our words and actions. We must learn to love and serve God through loving service to one another. We cannot be blinded by bigotry, poverty, hatred, and violence just because we are not personally affected. We must look to and stand beside victims, we must fight for just systems, we must be advocates for peace, and give aid to the poor, the sick, the lonely, the disenfranchised, and those imprisoned. We cannot piously stand alone. We must embrace others, freely giving ourselves over to the will of God, trusting in His promises. To paraphrase a line from *The Sound of Music*, to know God's love is to give it away.

Finally let me reflect on one of the gifts brought by the Magi, the gift of frankincense. This substance is the hardened resin from a small plant found only in Arabia and parts of northern Africa. In Jesus' time it was used for medicinal purposes to stop bleeding, heal wounds, as an antidote for poisons and as a salve for bruises, ulcerations, and paralyzed limbs. Jesus is our gift of healing. He came to restore us, not just to heal our physical ailments but to remove our fears and doubts; to bridge the chasms that separate us from one another. Moving forward in 2018, I pray for His healing to truly accept one another in love.

Just when you thought that holiday celebrations were over and done with – January brings a host of new holidays to celebrate.

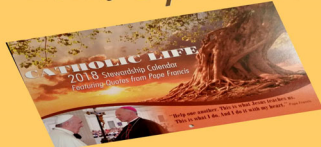

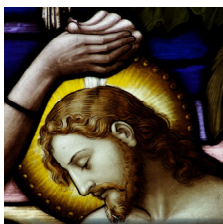

The Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord January 8



This feast brings to an end the season of Christmas. At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do.

In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary - not for Him, but for us.

Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin.

Why We Dip Our Fingers Into the Holy Water Font and Make the Sign of the Cross



When we dip our fingers into the holy water font at the entrance to the church and make the sign of the cross we are touching our forehead (our mind), our shoulders and our heart. It is a way of recalling our baptism.

It brings us back to what has brought us there in the first place. It is a reminder of who we are, and to whom we belong.

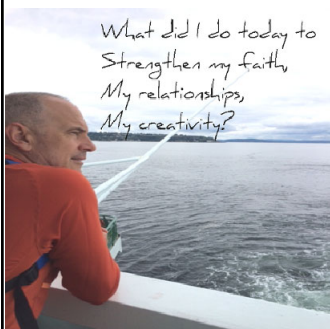

Recipe for a Happy New Year

Take twelve fine, full-grown months; see that these are thoroughly free from old memories of bitterness, rancor and hate, cleanse them completely from every clinging spite; pick off all specks of pettiness and littleness; in short, see that these months are freed from all the past—have them fresh and clean as when they first came from the great storehouse of Time.

Put in about one teaspoonful of good spirits, a dash of fun, a pinch of laughter, a sprinkling of play, and a heaping cupful of good humor.

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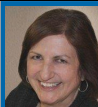
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
