Wow! This certainly has been one roller coaster ride of a year. For those who do not know, in January 2017, I was diagnosed with NASH and stage III liver disease. Due to the rapid deterioration of my liver, it was decided my best chance was to have a liver transplant. But because I was so overweight, I could not be placed on the transplant list. So on April 4 of 2017, I had gastric sleeve surgery. Since my surgery in April, I have lost over 120 pounds. I feel great! I cannot remember the last time I've had this much energy. I want to thank all of you for your continued support and prayers. I feel those prayers every day! I am happy to report that I am now currently on the liver transplant list at KU med.

I will be leaving Wednesday, December 27 and returning on January 8 for a much-needed vacation. I will use this time to relax and recharge and get ready for what 2018 has in store for me. I hope soon to receive a phone call saying that they have a liver available for me and will undergo the transplant process.

Amidst all the parties, celebrations and liturgies of the past several weeks I wonder if anyone has taken time to reflect on New Life. By this I am not referring to our celebration of Jesus' birth but rather to the new beginnings and new life that presents itself with the dawning of every new day. I hope you won't mind if I share a few of the new beginnings in my life.

New beginnings for me include: starting kindergarten and each subsequent school year, my baptism when I was in 6th grade, graduating from high school and starting college, life with my husband Bob, moving to a new country, the births of my children, completion of my Ph.D., becoming a Catholic, the marriages of my children and the births of my grandchildren, life without Bob, becoming a Gagnon, building a new home in rural Clay County, and watching my grandchildren grown into uniquely, wonderful individuals. I'm sure you will agree that my list is limited to major events and not ordinary, day to day living. As we approach another New Year in a few hours, however, my focus seems to be shifting to my daily life and new beginnings.

When I taught full time it wasn't uncommon for me to burn the midnight oil grading papers or tests, then rise at 5:00am to prepare for another work day. I found little time for just sitting, observing, or listening to the quiet, nor did I take time to reflect on who I was or what God was calling me to do. I was too busy getting from point A to point B. As I have gotten older, however, I generally go to bed earlier and get up before dawn. My quiet mornings are spent peacefully watching the sun rise and enjoying a cup of coffee (with cream no sugar). As the day brightens I take a few minutes for spiritual reading and resting in the presence of God. Only then do I wake other members of my household and proceed to what-ever chores need my attention. One of my greatest joys each day is being out-of-doors, enjoying the splendor of God's amazing creation. It may seem strange to you that even now during the winter cold of Missouri, I find evidence of new life and I am amazed. Perhaps it is in letting go of what I think is important that I have discovered what is most important: New life, new beginnings each and every day, in surrender and thanksgiving to Our Lord.

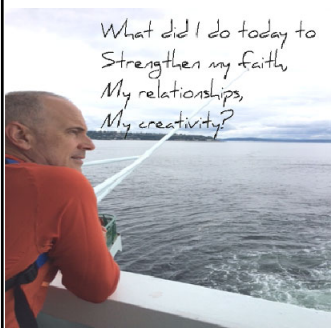
