Our cross and the sign that have marked the center point of the new church for some years will be removed this week to make room for excavation



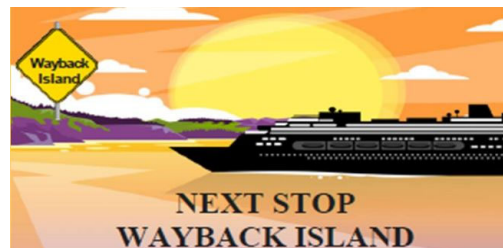
Signs are up to designate the playground as a secured area, delivery trucks will have to check with Huber's site superintendent to gain access and construction people will not have access to

From the Pastor's Pen

And it's the month of May! Springtime, flowers blooming, birds chirping and hope is alive once again. May's birth flower is the Hawthorn or Lily-of-the-Valley. The hawthorn means hope, while the lily-of-the-valley symbolizes sweetness or the return of happiness. The sweet flowers of May embody the hopes and dreams of the one who gives them. A single flower or a huge bouquet may express love, remembrance, apology, support or simply be a thoughtful gesture. Throughout human history, flowers have played a significant role as gestures and gifts. Though specific meanings and traditions may change, flowers remain a part of human connection. The language of flowers dates way back in history as a way to communicate with one another. Even the Greeks considered flowers to be of particularly high importance and associated them with the gods. In a time when people were unable to express emotions, flowers spoke in an acceptable form of expression. From the color, size, shape and even the way flowers were delivered, all had meaning. And if a flower was delivered upside down, it had the opposite meaning.

We will soon celebrate Mother's Day and our sanctuary will be decorated with the scroll of names as well as vases of flowers. It is a beautiful testament to the love of a mother and her presence in our lives. Even though other flowers may be given, the origins of the holiday began with the use of red and white carnations to show respect.

Julia Ward Howe first introduced the idea of setting aside one day a year to honor mothers in the hope that the tribute might extend a mood of peace to the country. In 1870, distraught by the loss of lives in the Civil War, Howe called on the country's leaders to confirm an official Mother's Day proclamation. Many local municipalities embraced her ideas, though the United States government didn't officially mark the day for mothers until 1908.

Anna Jarvis took up the cause after Howe's death. Following her passing, Jarvis' daughter Anna continued the battle and handed out carnations to mothers at church services throughout her campaign. Jarvis became indignant when retailers jumped on her carnation giveaways and began selling white carnations to consumers as the official Mother's Day flower. She protested the florist industry to try to get them to stop taking advantage of the occasion – to no avail.

And so the tradition was born and has blossomed to include mothers who passed away. A red carnation today signifies respect of a living mother, while a white carnation is worn or given in honor of a mother who has died.

May we be reminded of the love of a Mother in the giving of flowers once again this year.

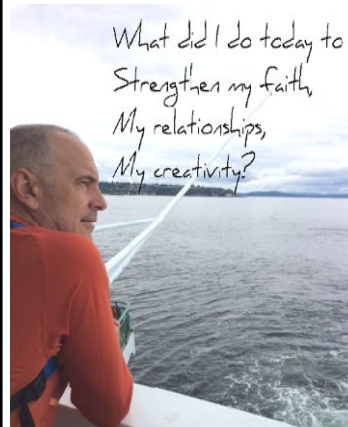

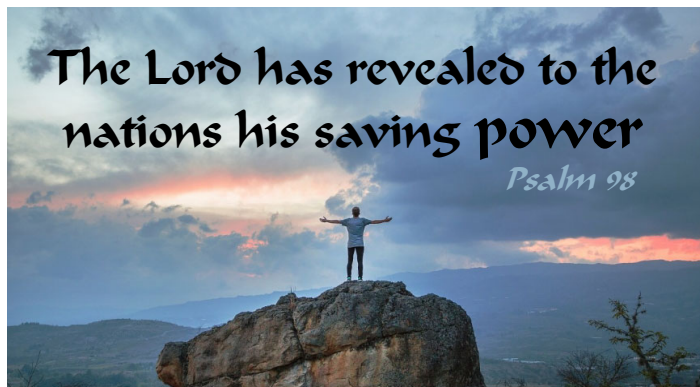

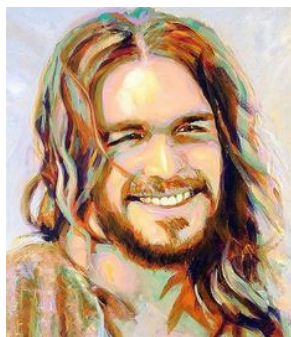
Danny's progress

What can you do?

Danny's progress after his liver transplant has been very good. He's recovering at home now in the peace and quiet! We have a Meal Train set up to help make sure that he's eating well while he's unable to do too much on his own. Because his immune system is compromised right now, he can't have visitors – the risk of infection or illness is just too dangerous during the recovery phase. He loves the cards that have been sent and he's very grateful for the help with meals. If your family would like to send him a card, you can send it via the St James parish office and we'll bring it to him. If you would like to help with meals, check out the St James Facebook page for the link to the Meal Train. You don't have to deliver meals to his apartment, they just need to be brought to the St James Social Hall kitchen/fridge and one of his family members or a vetted volunteer will bring it down to him.

He's hoping to be back at work soon – we are hoping that his doctors don't listen to him and make him wait until he's completely recovered!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



There are so many times when I feel I really don't know Jesus. I know about His conception and birth, how His parents found Him in the temple when they thought He was with other relatives. I've studied His teachings, cried when we read His passion narratives, and felt hope and joy as I reflected on His resurrection. I claim Jesus

as my Lord and Savior and there are so many times when I have felt His abundant love. I also know that I am in the process of developing a true relationship with Him but I am forced to ask, "What do I know of Jesus the child, teenager, and man?" In truth, my answer is very little.

Perhaps you read in scripture that Jesus wept or was angry, or you have even felt His frustration at the lack of understanding of His teachings by His family, friends, and followers even the twelve disciples. We can read of His love and compassion, of His complete surrender to the Father's will and His final words seeking forgiveness for others. There is, however, no mention of His personal happiness. Even a thorough search of the Bible Concordance makes no mention of Jesus laughing.

I cannot give you a reference citation to verify what I now write but I believe Jesus was a joy filled person. I think He saw the goodness in people, He enjoyed being with friends, and that He lived life to its fullness. I also think He had a great sense of humor. I feel He would enjoy sharing stories and laughing at a good joke. In short I know Jesus was full of life and that is His wish for each of us. If Jesus brings peace into our lives, if He offers hope and the path to inner joy then I believe He wants us to embrace our life with these gifts (hope, peace, joy and His love.) I think He smiles when we smile, He laughs when we laugh, and yes He also sheds tears with us and for us.

I recently told a group of people that prayer is every conversation we share with God. God accepts and understands our anger, frustrations, fears, and failures. Likewise He rejoices with us, shares our hopes, dreams, aspirations, and desire for a peaceful, life-giving society; and Yes, I believe He laughs with us.

Remember Jesus tells us not to go about with long faces, looking gloomy and solemn. He says to wash our faces, put on clean clothes, and face the world with love and joy. I have heard this expression many times: "Remember a smile is a just a frown turned upside down." Jesus continues to turn us upside down, so smile and laugh with Him.
