

From the Pastor's Pen

My grandfather began smoking cigarettes at a young age and smoked most of his life. Over the years he tried to guit but to no avail. As family, we tried to encourage him to stop smoking but had no luck either. He had become a chain smoker and there were some days I don't think I ever saw him without a lit cigarette. As much as I loved running the tractor, I hated getting in the cab after him. The air was so thick with smoke it clung to the windows and made it difficult for me to breathe as well as to see. I learned to take the early shift so I didn't have to follow him. It wasn't until one day when he lit a cigarette and couldn't catch his breath to inhale, that he guit cold turkey. Unable to breath scared him enough that he never smoked again.

There are those moments in our life that take our breath away. Either because the moments are so over the top awesome and breathtaking beautiful or because we get the bejesus scared out of us. Those moments stop us in our tracks.

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit. We come to the end our Eastertide some fifty days after Easter. Jesus greets his disciples again with the words, "Peace be with you," and then he breathes on them and says, "Receive the gift of the Holy Spirit..." That breath of new life is more than just the air we breathe. It gives them hope and purpose and the strength to breathe new life into who they are and what they are now about.

A good friend of mine oftentimes shares with me what is going on in her life with her family. As she is telling me the story she just seems to rattle and never stops to take a breath. It's as if she is about to hyperventilate and pass out. She works herself into a frenzy telling the story and freaking out because she doesn't know what to do or how to respond. I've learned the only thing I can do is let her speak her truth, let it all out, and then when she can't catch her breath and has no more words to say, tell her, "Breathe....." The first time I told her "Breathe" she responded with a look of disbelief. As she took a deep breath and calmed down, we were than able to start sorting through things and make sense of what was happening.

No one image can capture the Holy Spirit. Today it is described as a life-giving breath. We might be facing some uncertainty in our lives, some issues that are testing our faith or draining our energy. These issues might even be leaving us short of breath. May we be reminded there is an ancient prayer that might still have some value for us today. Breathe in, and with each breath, pray this ancient prayer - "Come Holy Spirit come."

Someone is Watching and Wondering



According to Thaddée Matura, O.F.M.: "Christian spirituality is a life in the Spirit; a gift of God." (Francis of Assisi, Writer and Spiritual Master) He continues: "It is a vision and an experience to which we have access through faith, the sacraments and personal effort . . .and finds its expression in the new life produced in us by the Spirit." I think that is the meaning behind our yearly celebration of Pente-

cost which also concludes the season of Easter, a season of rebirth and new life. Today's celebration is all about our experiences of the Holy Spirit and the expression of those experiences in our every day, usually guite ordinary lives.

St. Francis writes in *The Second Letter to the Faithful*, "the Spirit of the Lord will rest upon [them]. . . and it will make a home and a dwelling place in them." Through the Spirit we become children of God and when we accept and recognize that the Spirit resides within us, we readily participate in the work of Christ. His light shines through our relationships with others, in the way we work for peace and justice, in our outreach to the poor and disenfranchised, in our acceptance of the "other" even our enemies, and in our willingness to acknowledge that all we are, all we do for the common good, are truly His works brought about through grace. Without His spirit it is impossible to see and to believe that He is truly present in our world, in one another, in sacred scripture, in the sacraments, and in the bread and wine which we receive in communion. Furthermore it is the Spirit which accompanies us on our spiritual journey and ultimately leads us into union with Jesus. The Spirit enables us to follow His teachings and to share in the life of the Trinity. It is the Spirit which leads us toward unity with one another, giving us the ability to love, to forgive, and to unite what is broken within each of us to the suffering and passion of our Lord. It is through receiving the Spirit, over and over again, that we are able to embrace Hope. It is through the Spirit that we come to find inner Peace and Joy even as we also acknowledge the sadness, suffering, discrimination, hate, and unrest that exists in our world. It is through God's grace and the indwelling of His Spirit that we can wake up each morning and feel blessed and grateful for the gift of creation and life. It is through the Spirit that we continue to follow the path ahead while always striving to discern His will. It is through the Spirit that we acknowledge the need to "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."



It looked and smelled lovely just like home. Our thanks to Jayme and Eric Langhorst who provided the basic groceries, which was extremely generous of them, and to the Hickey family for donating the new, very lovely bed frame for the master bedroom. We had been making do with a particle board basic frame that had seen better days - many, many better days! – and the new bed is SO much nicer! Also not likely to collapse unexpectedly.

Now our part of the hard work is over, and it's time for the family to get busy with the many things that Hill-crest requires of them to graduate. 




