We continue to move ahead on the church foundation. We are at approximately 90% of completion on the excavation and are preparing for the arrival of rebar to dig and pour the footings.


The majority of the earth moving equipment belongs to Brown Excavation, a Liberty firm, who successfully bid and received the excavation contract.

From the Pastor's Pen

On this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we reflect upon what this gift means to us. In today's gospel, Mark recounts the words of Jesus at the last supper: After He took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them, saying "Take it; this is my body," Jesus then took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many."

As a community of Precious Blood, the Cup, the Blood of Christ, is central to our spirituality. Jesus's blood was poured out for us, His precious blood was shed on the cross for the forgiveness of sins. Blood and water flowed from His side - an image of new life and birth. We know how important blood is to each one of us. It is the very life-force that flows through our bodies that feeds and nourishes us. Jesus asked Peter, "Can you drink of the cup?" What does it mean for us today to drink of the cup? Is it a cup of blessing? A cup of bitterness? A cup of sorrow? A cup of healing? What of our lives have we poured into this cup? And what of the cup have we drank and shared?

Last weekend as we celebrated the Feast of the Holy Trinity, I went camping with some friends. After arriving at camp and setting up, we built a fire, grilled hamburgers and later added wood to the fire and sat under the stars, then made our way to the pool for a late night swim and then back to camp for s'mores, which made me think about the Trinity.

So what do s'mores have to do with the Trinity? Over the years different theologians have offered different images to help visualize and explain this great mystery. Today, I would like to offer another.

We broke the graham crackers in half and loaded them with chocolate. We loaded the sticks with marshmallows and into the fire to melt and roast. Then carefully scraping marshmallow off sticks onto chocolate and graham held together over fire to melt chocolate and soften graham cracker. Oh what a hot yummy, gooey, sticky, and sweet mess! All three ingredients mixed together and interacted with each other while still holding a bit of self. That hard outer shell softened by heat and the chocolate and marshmallow holds it all together. That chocolate giving it smoothness and sweet melting and binding things together. That marshmallow roasted and charred giving some light and fluffiness to the mix and its gooey stickiness sticking to everything as I take a bite.

Now I know this might be stretching the stickiness of this image but in some way this image speaks to me of the Trinity. That hard outer shell that protects and holds it all together yet can be softened with heat and the melting of the chocolate and marshmallow. The sweetness of chocolate that brings about the goodness of life and the melted marshmallow that is fluffy and gooey that sticks to hold together but also gives some breathe to life. Strength, support, gooey messiness of life, ability to laugh and have fun, sweet and substance is all wrapped up in that s'more. Even still it remains a mystery that cannot fully be explained or understood.

A from the Liturgy/Music Office

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 8



Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important liturgical day in the Catholic Church.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



One awesome thing about Eeyore is that even though he is basically clinically depressed, he still gets invited to participate in adventures and shenanigans with all of his friends. And they never expect him to pretend to feel happy, they just love him anyway, and they never leave him behind or ask him to change.

Recently I returned from a short vacation in Virginia where I spent time with friends and visited several sites that are significant to our country's history. This past week as we celebrated Memorial Day, a day set aside to honor the dead, I began to think about how I honor the dead. Although our nation celebrates with banners, parades, speeches, outdoor concerts, placing wreaths, flags, or flowers on graves, and families enjoying a three day weekend, what does this holiday really signify? How do I honor my faith, country and familial ancestors?

A quick search of the internet yielded innumerable descriptions of customs and celebrations, held at least annually, throughout the world with an emphasis on remembering and honoring the dead. I was struck, however, by the lack of any information related to how these celebrations and memorials, change the life of the living. The more I thought about previous generations including my familial ancestors and friends, the more I came to realize that I should honor them through the life I live. The number of people who opened my eyes and helped form me into who I am today continued to invade my thoughts. Although I have experienced hurts, disappointments and pain, I realize that the people who had the greatest impact and who I try to emulate accepted me much like Eeyore's friends in the above picture. They knew my faults, stubbornness, and failings, yet they did not abandon me or accept me only when I changed to become the person they thought I should be instead of who I am. I hope you won't mind, therefore, if I share some thoughts gleaned over the last few weeks on honoring the dead. I believe the way I live, how I treat others and care for all God's creation, is truly a reflection of my country, faith, and family ancestors. It is with a heartfelt sense of gratitude that I acknowledge their wisdom in helping me understand diversity, commonalities, God's love, and how through trust and faith I can answer His call to service. It is in living that I honor the lives and memory of the dead, especially those who lost their lives to protect our freedoms, those who refused to deny their faith, and those who lived simply, always reaching out to help any and all in need. These lives give me the courage to stand for my beliefs, to let go of always being in control, and to allow God the central focus of my life. Through the realization that each person is a unique, beloved child of God I am learning to respect them, never leave them behind, and never demand that they change to suit me. I honor the dead by living *agapically*.

There's a new alarm clock on the nightstand – those we replace with each tenant as well, as getting off to work on time is important.


The living room has the couch






