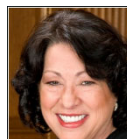

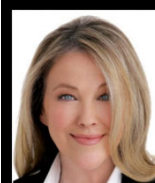
I hope this image caught your at-

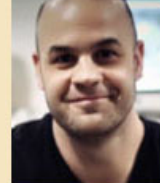

Danny's Progress *Calling All Chefs*

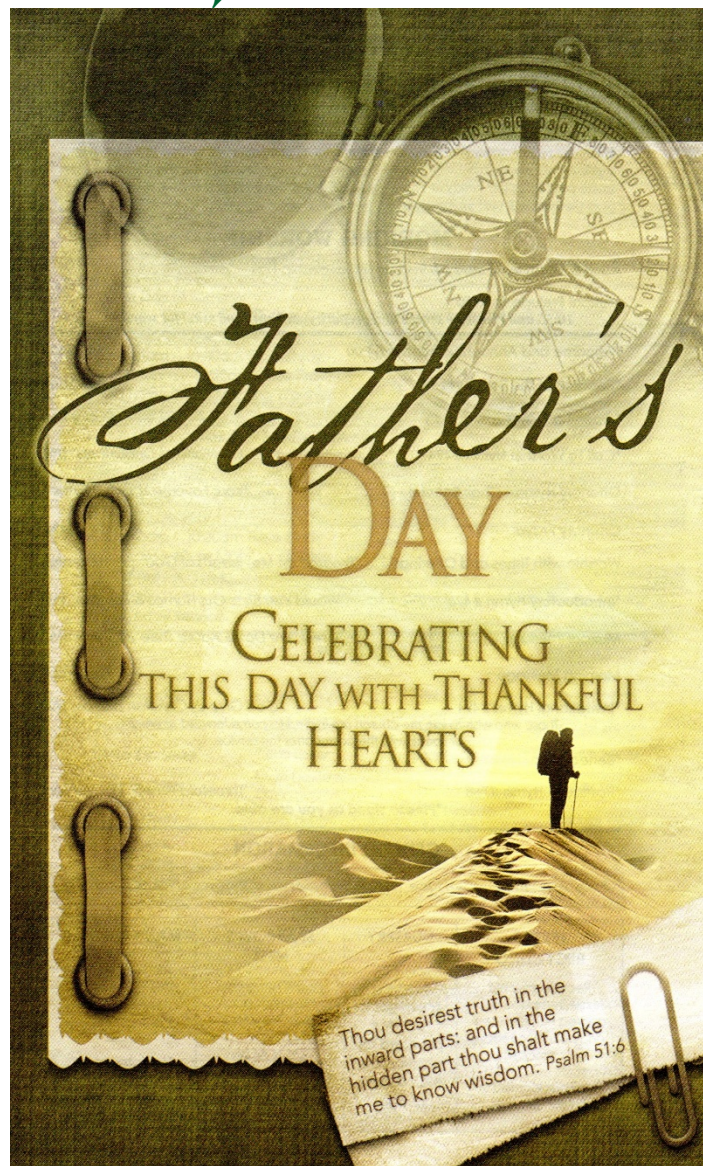

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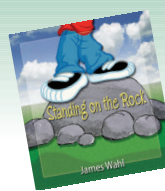
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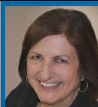
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
