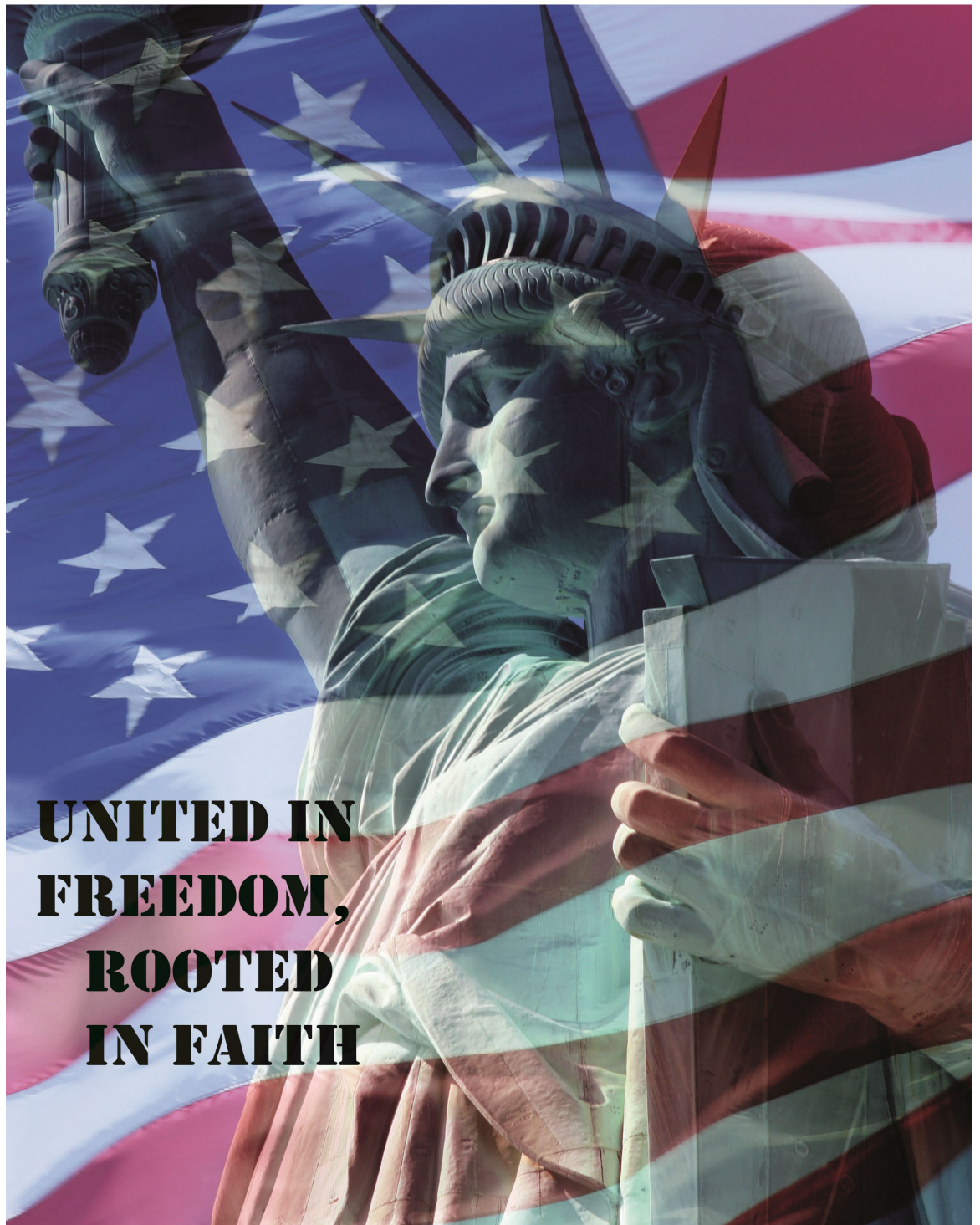

From the Pastor's Pen

Happy Feast Day! July 1st is the Feast of the Precious Blood and the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

As Missionaries of the Precious Blood we celebrate this day that gives meaning and understanding to our Spirituality of the Precious Blood. For many years in our community it was more of a devotion to the Blood with various prayers and rituals. Beginning in the 1980's, in response to the violence of the times, our spirituality grew from a devotion to actions. Our members began to "Hear the Cry of the Blood" from those suffering at the hands of injustice and in places of great bloodshed. Our ministry then, and still today, focuses upon being Preachers of the Word and working for renewal and reconciliation in the Church through the power of the Blood. We work to create safe spaces where people can share their story and speak their truth so that those who are at odds with one another may have a safe space to dialogue and work towards reconciliation. This ministry is not always easy but it is greatly needed.

In July of 2015, I had the wonderful opportunity to join our community in Rome for the 200th anniversary celebration of the founding of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. What an awesome sight it was to be gathered with other Missionaries from around the world speaking different languages but still one. Our founder St. Gaspar del Bufalo had many dreams for the community. One of his dreams was to have a thousand tongues to proclaim the merits of the Precious Blood. He knew and understood the reconciling powers of the Blood and wished to share that message with the world.

We, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, on this Feast of the Precious Blood, are humbled and encouraged to follow in our founders footsteps of being those thousand tongues.

A 🎵 from the Liturgy/Music Office



This week, we celebrate Independence Day, a day which affords us a great opportunity to consider the freedom we enjoy today – and so often take for granted.

One of the most precious freedoms we enjoy as Americans is the Freedom of religion. Some might scoff at the notion we are at risk of losing this freedom, but let's pay attention to what is going on. No longer do we talk, in the public arena, of "Freedom of Religion". A certain faction of public servants never use the phrase, "Freedom of Religion" by which we mean the freedom to worship and practice our religion according to our belief – a right guaranteed in our Constitution. Rather, they speak of "Freedom of Worship" by which they mean: "Keep your religion to yourself. Religion is a private affair. What you do behind the walls of your church is your business, but there is no place for you in the public square where religion is barred."

Listen carefully and you will hear this subtle change everywhere today. Unfortunately, that is not the only evidence. In the past decade, we have seen yet another assault on religious liberty. The examples are too numerous to detail here, but here are but a few:

The activity of military chaplains is challenged.

The Catholic Church and charitable adoption agencies incur legal challenges for being loyal to the tenets of their faith. Catholic hospitals that provide health care to many of the poorest areas of the country are being sued for not performing abortions.

Francis Cardinal George, the late Cardinal Archbishop of Chicago, saw this developing years ago. In a speech he made in Rome, he warned, "In this culture, the Gospel's call to receive freedom as a gift from God and to live its demands faithfully is regarded as oppressive, and the Church, which voices those demands publicly, is seen as an enemy of personal freedom.

But Independence Day is not a day to worry and be filled with anxiety. It is a day to celebrate a country in which we are so privileged to live and the freedom we know so well. It is also a time to renew our "eternal vigilance" to preserve our right to religious freedom.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



For the past two weeks I've shared thoughts on what it means to be Catholic. Now, I want to focus on what it means to be *Church*. In my quest for understanding the phrase "we are the Church" I rediscovered these beautiful and thought-provoking words

from *Gaudium et Spes* (7 December 1965): "The joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted, are the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ as well. Nothing that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community of people united in Christ and guided by the holy Spirit in their pilgrimage towards the Father's kingdom, bearers of a message of salvation for all of humanity." This is the universal call to all who through baptism are incorporated into Christ, who as His holy people, His Church have become sharers in His priestly, prophetic and kingly mission to the world. "The primary effect of sharing in the body and blood of Christ is to be transformed into that which we receive." (*Lumen Gentium* 21 November 1964) It is our vocation in life, therefore, "to illuminate and order all temporal matters" in praise of God. In Christ and His Church there is no inequality arising from race, nationality, social condition, age, sex or orientation. We are all one in Christ Jesus, and as His people we are to be witnesses and a living example of the mission of His Church. Therefore, we have a duty to work for justice, love and peace, rejoicing in hope and sharing one another's sorrows, standing for truth and life. We who are the Church must also acknowledge that God's salvation extends to all people, even those who through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ. We must remember that "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God and God abides in them." (1 John 4:16) The Church has many faces, lives throughout the world, celebrates with different customs, and praises God through unique cultures, music, art, and language. Yet, we are all one, united through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus. We are all brothers and sisters, created in the image and likeness of God. We were created by God's love, conceived in love, and graced with a desire to love and be loved. We are all one people, united by God's salvific plan. We who are the Church must work to share His love so all will know they are welcome in this place, His kingdom.

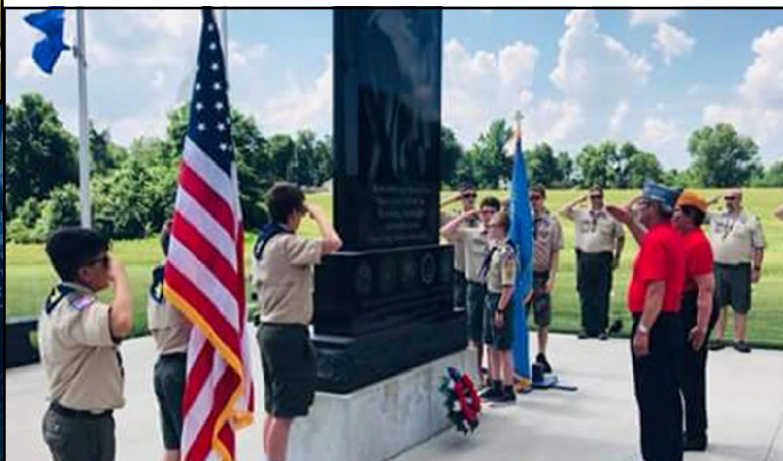


St. James Boy Scout Troop 2014 A Job Well Done

15 Decades of the Rosary Begin at 6:30 am

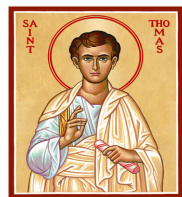

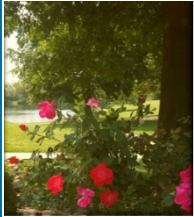

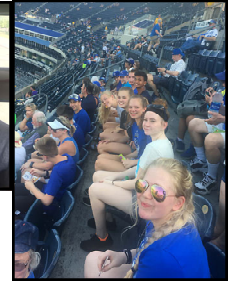
