We are invited to pray for vocations and consider it ourselves or encourage others we see involved in the church or service to consider the call.

We will begin Friday evening and conclude Sunday noon. It will be a time to reflect, discern, ask questions, and learn more about the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. If anyone is interested or you know of anyone to ask or invite, please let me know and I'll be happy to extend an invitation.

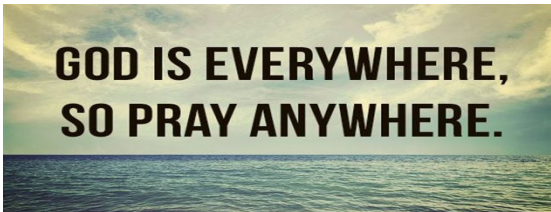

Children's Choir



Parent Comment: My child cannot read well, so how can he be in choir?

Miss Lori's Response: Mass is designed for the participation of all, - whether avid readers or not. Kinder-

garteners are able to memorize the refrains of the familiar songs we sing, and they likely already know the Mass parts. The middle school children make up for the still-growing skills of our youngest. The day for reading verses will come in time, but for now let them gain confidence in what comes easy - memorizing.

Children's Choir is open to all children in Kindergarten through 8th Grades with no fees and no auditions. Children K-5 make up the bulk of our choir, and we invite 6th-8th graders to be cantors-in-training, to bring harmony to our choir, and to serve as youth helpers when necessary. We practice most Saturdays at 10am, and we typically lead the music at the 11am Mass on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month, as well as on Christmas and Easter, and various other feast days.

Practices begin August 18. Our first Mass is September 16. Children's Choir registrations are available in the Narthex after all Masses this weekend. We are also available online. Contact Lori Tajchman with questions.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

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On the feast of the Epiphany, 1972, the Catholic Church reinstituted the Rites for Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Bishops recognized the Rites as a tool for missions in developing countries, and a way to revitalize faith in de-Christianized Europe. No one believed the RCIA would make much difference in the post-conciliar church, especially in the United States. In October 2000, however, the U.S. bishops reported that the RCIA "is renewing the life of the Church in the United States." Since RCIA is a journey of conversion, by extension it is a journey for all the faithful. When the Rites are well implemented, the RCIA is a source of energy and new life.

Initiation rites are about identity. They define the community and what it holds dear. Yet along with identity, initiation also involves change. While identity sounds firm and comforting, change is an occasion of risk. The rites are joyful, yet filled with awe and perhaps fear; they ritualize an acceptance of stepping into a new, unknown future. As the parish celebrates, the baptized faithful are called to redefine social values and re-evaluate what it means to be Catholics who remain faithful to the teachings of Jesus. The complacent may become unsettled, and the jaded refreshed as they witness changes in the heart and soul of the community.

Christian initiation is centered in catechesis, however, many people mistakenly assume that catechesis refers to teaching doctrines or theologies. Catechesis, however, is much more than teaching; it is a life long process involving a radical relationship with Jesus. Catechesis explores and recognizes God's action and presence in our natural lives, in scripture, and in the life, faith, and worship of the Church. Initiation is both catechetical and *opus dei*, embracing evangelization, ministry to the alienated, hospitality, accessibility, and the face the parish presents to strangers. The RCIA has turned the church outward and invited the faithful to recognize themselves as people who embrace their identity and mission as baptized disciples. Thus it is the entire community who bring new Christians to birth. The Rite states that those requesting initiation "seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion." People come to St James seeking God, and a community of fellow believers. Our parish as witness to the faith, experience Christ more deeply by sharing experiences, praying with and for the catechumens and guiding them along this life-long journey. We invite them into a wondrous process where they develop, deepen and enrich their relationship with our loving God in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Likewise when we witness catechumens giving up old ways of doing/being, and committing themselves to Jesus, it makes us want to recommit ourselves to Christ, to renew and refresh our faith lives, into mystogogy.

The Listening Session With Bishop Johnston Tuesday, July 31



There was good attendance at the Bishop's Listening Session on July 31, as parishioners gathered to share their goals, hopes, dreams for our diocese. The session was moderated by Visioning Team member Dino Durando, Director of the Domestic Church and Discipleship for the diocese.

Following the discussions, individuals were invited to come forward with their ideas.

As the meeting came to a close, Bishop Johnston thanked all for their participation and explained that



over the coming months feedback from all of the 10 listening sessions held throughout the diocese would be carefully reviewed and evaluated and that the areas of focus going forward would be announced sometime next year.

Three questions were posed for discussion:

(1) What do you most appreciate about the Diocese?



(2) What is your vision for the Diocese in the coming years and what 3 areas should be emphasized as part of that vision?



(3) In the areas named above, what would you like to see accomplished across the diocese if all focused efforts and what bold outcomes could be achieved?

Attendees were asked to record their thoughts on a form provided and then to gather into small groups to discuss each of the questions.

Have You Ever Wondered . . .

Why Ordinary Time is Called Ordinary?



Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church – the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

It's appropriate, therefore, that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) always features either John the Baptist's acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ's first miracle – the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana.

Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

St. Maximilian Kolbe Feast Day August 14



St. Maximilian Kolbe, born January 8, 1894, in Poland, was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar and a martyr in the German death Camp of Auschwitz during World War II.

He was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary. He organized the Militia Immaculata after witnessing demonstrations against Pope St. Pius X and Benedict XV. In 1941, Kolbe was arrested by the German Gestapo and sent to Auschwitz. When a prisoner escaped in July of that year, ten men from his barracks were picked to suffer death by starvation as both punishment and deterrent. Fr. Maximilian offered to take the place of one of the men; Franciszek Gajowniczek.

It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners. He died on August 14, 1941, and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Assumption of Mary feast day.

Kolbe was canonized as a saint by Pope John Paul II on October 10, 1982. There was one extraordinary man in attendance at St. Maximilian's canonization – Franciszek Gajowniczek.

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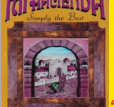
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
