

The foundation depicted above gives a view of the "forming-up" of the upper level which will contain the Narthex, Chapel, and Sanctuary as well as support space for various church functions.

The space between the levels is approximately 30 inches including the upper level slab. The lower level is a "walk out" to the rear parking area which will accommodate approximately 90 vehicles. An elevator will help those needing assistance. The front stairs will be the main artery between levels.

From the Pastor's Pen

At various times of the year, we have different religious groups contacting the parish asking if they can set up tables and sell their wares. We've had everything from olive wood carvings, to religious items, to cinnamon rolls and baked goods, to items from our sister parish in Peru, and others. Whether it be one of our parish ministries or a ministry beyond our parish, each group is not only sharing their handiwork but also raising funds for various ministries or purposes.

Last week at Most Holy Redeemer in San Francisco, a parishioner who has traveled to Guatemala several times has begun a ministry of bringing back handmade items and selling them. The proceeds are then sent back to Guatemala to provide scholarships for young women. In wanting to support this great ministry, I stopped to check out the merchandise. Although her selection of items was small, I still found something I couldn't live without. I purchased a pair of jeweled hummingbirds. She had several hanging from a display and also several more in a display box.

Like the other items, they were all handcrafted in various shades and colors. I selected two of them in more vivid colors. Someone near me noticed what I had and was quick to comment what pretty earrings. I just laughed and held them to my ear. Nah, not my color. As I waited to check out, someone else inquired about the hummingbirds. She began to share a bit of the symbolism and importance of hummingbirds and what they meant to the ones who made them. She shared that the ones crafting them saw the hummingbirds as a symbol of freedom.

I was intrigued by her story and wanted to know more. So I did a little online research. Although I didn't find anything about freedom, I did discover something else. Its symbolism and meaning is "appearing out of nowhere ~ bringing joy." "Appearing out of nowhere the hummingbird springs joy in the heart, and there is magic in the air in this moment of fleeting serendipity. Iridescent colors shimmering in the breeze, she pauses mid-air to drink in the sweet nectar that the flower so generously provides her. A hummingbird is a symbol of all things good. The sweet little bird of joy, ever so dainty and beautiful, symbolizes great courage, determination, flexibility and adaptability. This little beauty is only a few ounces in weight, yet has the courage of a Lion. Indeed size is of no consequence. It is a totem of fearlessness, and at the same represents lightness of being."

It may not be freedom, but still great wonder and beauty packed into a small package. So whether they will one day be earrings, ornament on a tree, or just something lying on my desk, they will always be a reminder of a great trip and a great adventure.

Children's Choir

Parent Comment: My child loves to sing but gets so much more out of sports.



Miss Lori's Response: Sports and choir share a lot of the same social elements, such as learning to be a team member and basic social skills. Research shows unquestionably that chil-

dren involved in music have increased academic progress. More importantly though, singing in children's choir is an opportunity for your child to learn about and participate in Mass and it's weekly lesson, but to also learn and practice the importance of service. Our program has accommodated many budding athletes!

Children's Choir is open to all children in Kindergarten through 8th Grades with no fees and no auditions. Children K-5 make up the bulk of our choir, and we invite 6th-8th graders to be cantors-in-training, to bring harmony to our choir, and to serve as youth helpers when necessary. We practice most Saturdays at 10am, and we typically lead the music at the 11am Mass on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month, as well as on Christmas and Easter, and various other feast days.

Our first Mass is September 16. Children's Choir registrations are available in the Narthex after all Masses this weekend. We are also available online. Contact Lori Tajchman with questions.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As RCIA Director I talk to many people who express interest in the Catholic Church. Two of the first questions I ask are: Why do you desire to become a Catholic? What/Who brings you here? The most frequent responses are: I have family or friends who are Catholic; My parents are joining; I'm marrying a Catholic; I like the traditions and ritual; or I'm not sure. It seems to me these responses point to a common thread or need, namely a desire for "spirituality" and "belonging."

Richard McBrien describes spirituality as experiencing God, resulting in transformation of our consciousness and lives. Since God is available to everyone, spirituality is not exclusively Christian, but Christian spirituality is a life given to the Holy Spirit, and incorporation into the Body of Jesus Christ. It is surrendering to "God the Creator in a life of faith, hope, love, and service. It is *visionary, sacramental, relational,* and *transformational.*" (*Catholicism*, 1058.) It seems to me, this concept of spirituality is the cornerstone of catechesis for the RCIA Journey. On this journey there are three primary stages.

First, the inquirer begins to recognize God's presence in the ordinary. Every experience of God is unique and personal; the touch of wind, the smell of roses, the warmth of the sun, the small hand of a child, the kiss of a loved one, the tragedy of poverty, hunger and suffering, the violence of war, terminal illness or death of a relative or friend. God is present in these experiences, leading our lives by a golden thread, weaving a unique pattern for each of us. When we recognize His presence in these every day experiences, we make a choice to embrace His way.

Second, the experience transforms the **catechumen**. They feel and act differently, opening themselves to God's gift of *agape*; embracing, cherishing, and sharing it. Their actions reflect His unconditional love toward all of creation.

Finally, others can see the Holy Spirit living and working in the lives of the **Elect**. Their life becomes one of faith, hope and service. Their lives are visionary, sacramental, relational, and transformational to others.

This is the path all Catholics must follow. Learning doctrine and attending Mass at least once a week is not enough. Our strength as Christians, lies in embracing the whole of human life, experiencing God in that wholeness, and through our actions, witnessing to the saving grace of Jesus Christ. I believe the catechumenal journey continues throughout life, until we experience the joy of seeing God and being glorified with Him. I hope each of you will journey with our RCIA team and individuals seeking initiation. Share your experiences of God freely; look for ways God transforms your life, and envision how to share God's love in the present.

Stewardship of Treasure

Don't Quit - The journey

Everyday Stewardship – No one said it would be easy. Think of something you started, but not very long into it – you gave up. Loss weight, exercise, Bible Study, daily Mass, a bird house, or maybe cleaning the garage? A dear friend of mine told me: "My husband calls those UFO's – Un Finished Objects". I have my share of those. I think we all have started something we did not complete for one reason or another. Or maybe, we never even tried, for fear of failure. My Dad referred to the quote - "The road to hell is paved with good intentions." We try, but the going gets tough and it is our nature to retreat.

This is not much different than in Jesus's time. Sure the stakes were MUCH higher then to be a follower, but today it is not always easy either. Maybe we just avoid a conversation about religion; or I'll go to Mass next week; or I'm sure plenty of other people will give to the cause: or we just don't feel up to the fight today – not really a fight but the defense of what we believe. Maybe you have not faced this, but I know I have. I really don't feel good about myself afterward.

Stewardship calls for us to respond to Christ's call – whatever it is, regardless the cost. If we are going to take this commitment seriously – the one we were called to at baptism – we need to work at it. Things will fall away that we did not finish – but this commitment, this journey, will last forever. He will never leave us. He will guide us, hold us, even pick us up – if we only let Him.

Don't quit – He didn't promise it would be easy to follow Him, but He did promise to be with us the whole journey. Let Him help!
