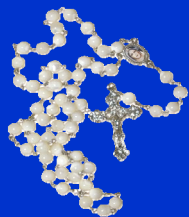

Reflection

Jesus chides his disciples on the journey to Capernaum, learning that they were discussing who was the greatest. I believe it's easy to pass judgment on the disciples as we hear this, but in all truthfulness, I think we might do this more than we'd care to think of. Do we ever brag about the number of choir members in our choir? Do we ever brag about the instruments we play (especially us organists), or that our style of music is superior to others? Here's the one I am guilty of . . . do we ever compete with each other by sharing the number of liturgies we do in a week ("I did three weddings, four funerals, four daily Masses and three weekend liturgies")? I could bet that most of us have done this at least once in our lifetime.

We are just as human as Jesus's disciples, and that's strangely comforting to me. Jesus reminds us in the Gospel that "if anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35). We strive to be humble in our actions as pastoral musicians as Jesus calls us to do here in the Gospel of Mark. We don't walk a perfect journey, but we have the guidance of the Lord as we aim to guide others in ministry.

Teen Choir

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Have you ever wondered about your family; who they are, where they came from, how you are similar yet unique from your ancestors. If you believe the flood of recent advertisements you can learn all about yourself and your

family roots through a simple DNA test. For me, however, though this genetic footprint is interesting, it is not a satisfactory answer to the question, "Who is my family."

Several years ago I was teaching an Honor's seminar class on "The Family." I began our discussion by encouraging my students to develop an understanding/definition of family. Initially my students gave traditional answers such as: a group consisting of parents and their children; a group of individuals closely related by blood; a group descended from a common ancestry; and a harmonious group bound together by common interest. Although not one of these descriptions seemed adequate, eventually my students reached the consensus that a **family is a group of individuals who love and care for one another unconditionally**. Over the years, I have never been able to discard this description from my memory. It seems not only adequate but appropriate especially in light of Jesus' teaching.

While Jesus was speaking / teaching to a crowd someone told him "Your mother and your brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you. . . Jesus replied "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" Pointing to his disciples he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers!"

For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." (Matthew 12:4-50) Jesus also taught His disciples to "love one another even as I have loved you" and that to care and provide for one another is the same as caring for Him. (Matthew 25:31-46)

Like most of you I can name some of my ancestors and extended relatives. Describing my immediate family, however, might be considered untraditional, so allow me to close with a simple idea. Being separate from others is an illusion. Although we often hear "it's us vs them" there is no them in Jesus teachings. We are all created equal members of **One Human Family** and to follow Jesus means to care for and protect that family.

names of the three Archangels mentioned in Scripture were officially recognized: Michael (one who is like God), Gabriel (God is my strength) and Raphael (God is my health). Although names of the other four Archangels (Ariel, Raquel, Zerachiel, and Remiel) appear in Jewish and Christian sources outside of the canon, they are not recognized by name in Catholic doctrine.

St. Michael is known as the Defender of the Church as well as the Patron of soldiers, police officers, and fire-fighters. He is generally regarded as the first among the Archangels.

St. Gabriel as God's holy messenger is revered as the Archangel of wisdom, revelation, prophecy and visions.

St. Raphael was pivotal in the Book of Tobit, helping Tobias on his journey. He is revered as the Archangel of healing due to a verse usually omitted from many translations of John's gospel: "and an angel of the Lord descended at certain times into the pond; and the water was moved." (John 5:4)

On September 29th we celebrate the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, and the Archangels. Based upon Scripture the Church determined there are Seven Archangels who played an important role in Jewish and Christian traditions. At the Council of Rome in 745, the
