PARKING LOT REPAIRS OCTOBER 18 AND 19

St. James has contracted with Wil-Pav, Inc. to repair the South end of the parking lot on October 18 and 19.

Our intent is to minimize ground water concerns and repair damaged areas. The contractor will move their equipment on site after 4:00pm on Wednesday, October 17, after the school pick-up is completed and will clearly designate areas to be repaired.

The school will designate temporary pick-up areas for the 18th and 19th. We do not anticipate concerns with the morning student "drop off" nor problems in parking for those attending morning Mass.

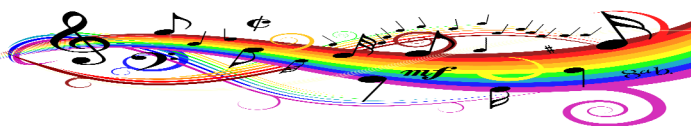
We are but mere mortals.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I wrote about the struggle to allow God to be the center of our lives rather than yield to the temptations to put wealth, power, pleasure and/or honor before God. You might be wondering how this picture

fits into my daily struggle or it may be obvious if you share my tendency to “eat for all occasions.” However, allow me to fall back to my days teaching Human Nutrition. I began every semester asking the students to write an explanation of this quote: “*You are what you eat!*” Usually the students developed the idea that if you eat healthy you will be healthy or if you eat junk food you will suffer from health issues. A logical answer since most of you are aware of the on-going saga over healthy eating; there are so many choices (Vegan, paleo, low carb, etc.)

It seems to me, however, Jesus words cause a greater struggle than any dietary choice I make. As the Jews argued among themselves, Jesus said, “unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life within you.” (John 6:52-53) As a Catholic I believe that Christ Jesus is truly present in the consecrated bread and wine and that I follow His words when I receive communion. I don't struggle over transubstantiation of the bread and wine but rather I struggle with how I am transformed when I eat and drink His body and blood? How does regularly receiving Jesus change my everyday life?

For transformation to occur I must first be truly present; present to the Holy Spirit, present to God's love, present to Jesus' teachings, and present to His command to love and care for one another. Second, transformation also requires a realization that God is present in **all His children**. No one can eliminate God from his/her life. Although many attempt to reject God's presence, love, and mercy, He alone remains intimately, eternally connected to each of us. Only when I am freely, completely present to Christ Jesus, will I experience His presence in me. Only then will I be transformed to move beyond mere words or rational thoughts and into the Mystery of God's being. Jesus said, “On that day, you will know that you are in me and I am in you. (John 14:20) Then I will “become what I eat.”

George Bernard Shaw told this story: “A Native American elder once described his own inner struggles in this manner; inside of me there are two dogs. One of the dogs is mean and evil. The other dog is good. The mean dog fights the good dog all the time. When asked which dog wins, he reflected for a moment and replied. The one I feed the most.” Which dog do and I feed? Do we allow Jesus to feed us?

Thanks, for the gifts - I think I'll Keep them?

Everyday Steward of God's gifts – God's gifts to us are given to share.

You know those life experiences that have impact on you - I mean real impact? Our mission trips to Guatemala were some of those for me. It was a profound experience for most of the students and chaperones that would attend. I think one thing that resonated with each group was: "They have so little and they seem so happy. They are so thankful. They really love their church."

Wow - that is a hard one for most of us. We want things and we give things. But we don't need – really need – most of us, anyway. And we give of our excess. Don't get me wrong. I believe the parents in the villages we visit want more for their children, more for themselves just like we do. I think that is human nature. But the acceptance that GOD WILL PROVIDE is overwhelming. It is the environment they live in every day. It is something though you can feel and embrace your whole being while you're there. I have tried to hold on to that.

This is where the "other" gifts (time and talent) come into play. We took money and things with us to help provide basic life needs: Clean water, clean air, clothing, food and medicine. They were always very grateful and gracious. They wanted to share the experience with us - help do the physical work – side by side. They wanted to visit with us. Part of the fun was trying to communicate without fully understanding each other's language.

When you don't have all the "stuff" to distract you, you can focus on the real life event. Everyday life is full of gifts from God. Sharing that gratitude with others causes more gratitude and happiness and thanksgiving and glorious prayer.

This week try to be optimistic. Share the little gifts and see them grow bigger through others. Sharing makes it is easier to see how precious life's little things are. Don't keep the gifts – share them!
