From the Pastor's Pen

"I wish that I could have a thousand tongues, to endear every heart to the Precious Blood of Jesus," was spoken by our Founder, St. Gaspar del Bufalo, as he once visited city after city seeing the hurts and pains of so many.

On October 21, we celebrate his Feast day. St. Gaspar was ordained on July 31, 1808 at the age of 22. Less than a year later, on May 17, 1809, Napoleon suppressed the Papal States. Pope Pius VII was arrested and transported to Savona. On June 13, 1810, Gaspar was brought before the magistrate to take the oath of allegiance to the emperor. In words that echoed the Gospel of John when Jesus said "the truth will set you free," Gaspar told the magistrate: "I would rather die or suffer evil than to take such an oath. I cannot. I must not. I will not!"

While St. Gaspar was in exile, Fr. Francesco Albertini became his spiritual advisor and confidant; together they made plans for the future. Albertini had a great influence on Gaspar's developing appreciation of the Precious Blood. Gaspar likened his experience in exile to being nailed to the cross, so much did he desire to be out with the people, sharing the Gospel and tending to their needs.

During his exile, Gaspar's compassion deepened. In the solitude of his prison cell, his vision became clear: to continue the works of mercy and the evangelization in the context of community. He would join forces with other men and women united in the bond of charity to touch others with the redeeming grace of the blood of Jesus.

With the defeat of Napoleon in 1814, Gaspar was freed to return to Rome and continue his Mission. On August 15, 1815, he founded the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in Giano, Italy, in a 10th century abbey of San Felice. It was to be a society of apostolic life for the purpose of preaching missions and retreats, renewing the Church and proclaiming the salvation that comes through the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. The Preamble of the Constitution of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood captures this new beginning:

Impelled by the love of Christ, manifested especially in the shedding of his Blood, and sensitive to the needs of the Church, St. Gaspar del Bufalo founded a priestly institute. He attracted from the diocesan clergy a group of like-minded priests and unified them by a bond of charity only, instead of vows. Living together in mission houses, they were a source of continual renewal for the priests and the people, mainly by preaching missions and retreats.

His dream of a thousand tongues to preach reconciliation and renewal are still needed today.

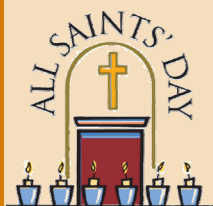

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over the past few weeks I have written about personal struggles that can block a full, rich relationship with God. Today, however, the struggle reaches into my understanding of *Social Justice*. Sometimes I feel so disgusted and disappointed by the continuous bombardment of the "us vs them" mentality. It just doesn't fit with Jesus' teaching. Further reflection on last Sunday's Gospel detailing the struggle of the rich young man who wanted to become a disciple of Jesus, I think represents each of us whenever we put wealth, power, pleasure or honor before loving and serving God. I am, therefore, shocked to hear and read about individuals who claim to be Christian while embracing the **Prosperity Gospel/Theology** which flies in the face of Catholic teaching related to social justice.

Prosperity theology developed during the 19th century and rose to prominence in the United States in the 1950's. This theology teaches that financial blessing and physical well-being are always the will of God, which is brought about by faith, positive speech and donations to their cause. Prosperity theology views the Bible as a contract between God. The strength of one's faith correlates with security, wealth, and good health. Hence, sickness and poverty, are a result of sin and lack of faith. In order to achieve prosperity and health, therefore, one must donate money (to the cause), visualize success and make positive confession in other words, tell God what you feel you are due. Prosperity theology teaches "entitlement" to the faith filled.

I find this theology very disturbing and divisive. Jesus never blames anyone who is ill or poor. HE embraces them and commands us to reach out in care for our brothers and sisters, especially those in need. (Matthew 25:31-46) Furthermore who am I to tell God what He should give to me, my entitlement. Instead Jesus taught we should come humbly to God in prayer and to be opened to "Father, your will be done." I cannot believe that God's will is for me to be financially secure while another lives in poverty. God loves all His children, shows abundant forgiveness, mercy and grace regardless of a man/woman's position, power, wealth, ethnicity, or health. God doesn't abandon humankind; humankind chooses to abandon God. He chose to become one of us so that we might know life, not prosperity.

2019 PINK PLEDGE CARDS

I have had a couple calls, so thought I would answer some questions.

2019 Stewardship of Treasure Pledge cards - The pink card in your letter is the 2019 pledge drive. Everyone is asked to fill out a pledge to the Stewardship of Treasure (left side of card), in the past known as tithe. This is a calendar year pledge, so folks have not filled this out before now. There are extras in the narthex, if you would need it.

The right side of the pink pledge card is for the New Church Fund (NCF). If you already made the commitment for 2019, then nothing is required, you may leave it blank. If you have not pledged to 2019, we ask you to do so. Our New Church is not paid for and we will continue to raise funds to assist with the loan.

If you currently use the ACH program, you may indicate that on the card and only sign on the line. (NO additional check information is required.) This would apply for either pledge, Stewardship of Treasure or NCF. If you would like to start using this method, sign and provide a voided check. NOTE: The ACH program is a ONCE A MONTH draw, on the first Wed. of the month.

PLEDGE CARD WEEKEND is Oct 27th and 28th. We ask you prayerfully consider returning these. Thank you for filling out the pledge cards, it is helpful for our budgeting.

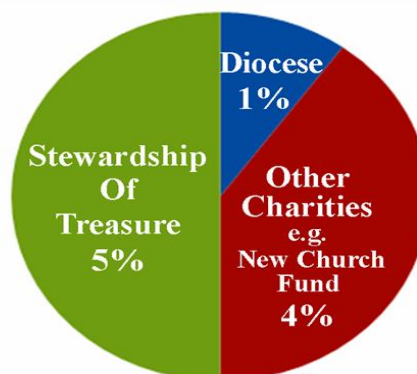

First Reconciliation Preparation

If you missed the parent meetings last week, you will need to contact the RE office right away to get on the list for the make up meeting. Just to recap the requirements to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, a child must be:



- At least 7 years old
- In at least the 2nd grade
- Have completed at least one year prior faith formation in either a Catholic school, a parish Religious Education program or a qualified program of home-study.

If your child does not meet those 3 requirements, then you would begin the preparation process next year and use this year to complete the basics. These requirements are not meant to be a burden for a child and his/her family, but to make the process easier for all involved.

Contact the RE office right away if your child is ready to receive these sacraments this year.

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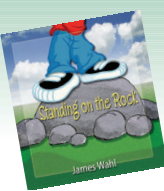
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
