Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today, November 11th is a time to remember the men and women who have served in the military. This day was originally marked to acknowledge the "War to end all wars" (World War I). Unfortunately, as you know, many wars have followed, yet we continue to observe this day as a time to embrace peace.

Unless you have just returned from a hermitage and years of isolation, you also know that our Nation and our Church have been deluged with horrendous revelations of crimes against children, hate, hypocrisy, bigotry, racism, and xenophobia. This past week we voted, and finally came to the end of vitreous campaigning. Yet I am forced to ask: Has anything changed?

Unfortunately there seems to be a shadowy darkness over our lives. The rhetoric and false promises don't seem diminished. This isn't to say, however, that I feel hopeless. I still believe in the innate goodness of human beings, as created by God, and I cling to the power of His healing. I believe in God's mercy and forgiveness. I know that anyone who turns to God in complete trust and surrender will find the path out of darkness and into His sacred space. Personally, I cling to this knowledge and hope.

Many times I have found myself walking through a forest and hearing the gentle sound of water, rippling over rocks. The water seems so clear and I know it is the source of life for the surrounding flora and fauna. Other times I spend time after a rainfall, smelling that unmistakable odor of freshness brought to the earth. I watch birds seemingly playing in small pools and it seems the flowers are giving off stronger scents and color than before the refreshing waters. This is yet another experience of God's blessings and promises that leads me to hopefulness.

As the Director of the RCIA I walk with individuals who are seeking a new relationship with Christ Jesus, new direction, new hope in their lives. Some are seeking, for the first time, new life through the baptism. At the Easter Vigil these individuals will experience God's grace, washing away their sins and leading them into His light. Renewed and refreshed they will come out of the water reborn, putting on a white garment to symbolize the purity of Christ's presence in their lives. Unfortunately, it seems that with the passing of time many of us forget the meaning of our "Life in Christ." We forget our role as members of His body and we feel despair, hopelessness, and fear. We forget who or what we are committed to follow. Our trust in God falters as we sink into the harsh realities of our world. So let us pray with one voice: For the healing of the nations, for a just and equal sharing of the things the earth affords. To a life of love in action, Abba help us rise and pledge our hearts.

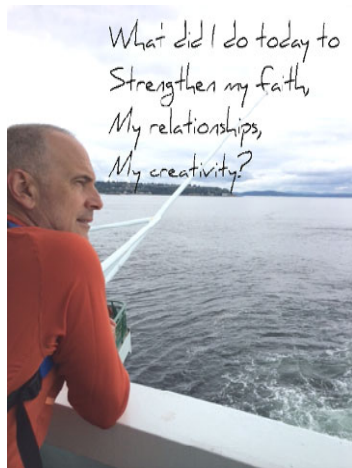

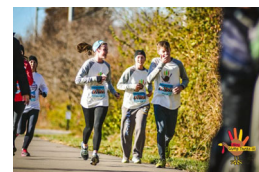

**The Gospel According to Luke

On the first Sunday of Advent, 2018, we begin a new liturgical year focused on the Gospel according to Luke. Hospitality towards all, especially the poor, the stranger, the marginalized, and those rejected, is the essential image of God that the Lucan Jesus offers to anyone willing to listen and follow through on his message and life.
