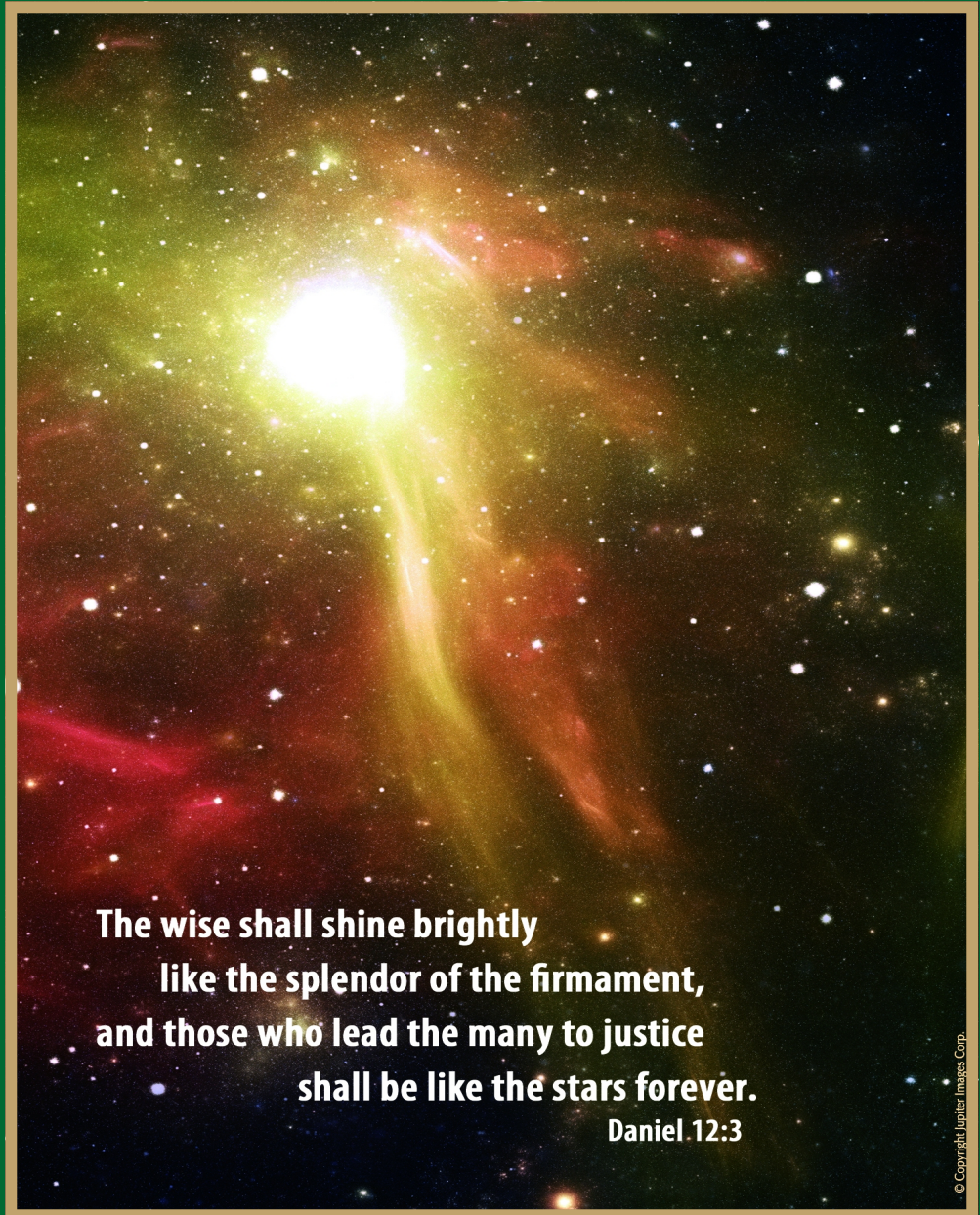

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Have you ever collected leaves while taking a walk in the Fall, taken your collection home, and carefully pressed each one between the pages of a book?

Or have you ever collected snowflakes on your sleeve and looked at them carefully before they melt? If you have, I'm sure you know that no two leaves, no two snowflakes are exactly alike. This is also true with people and the gifts God bestows to each individual. No two are exactly alike.



Recently I asked the RCIA participants to name a career/occupation for every letter of the alphabet. (Try this yourself.) Although this may seem like an exercise totally unrelated to catechesis, in fact if you complete this task you may think differently. Once you have a list reflect on each job and think of the skills needed to be successful. For example: Q for Quilter; a quilter must have good eyesight, be creative, work in tiny sometimes complicated patterns and stitches, and have great patience to finish something of beauty. Now for comparison try L for Lumberjack. The tools of this trade are bulky and dangerous to use; no needle and thread, no intricacies here. The lumberjack isn't creating, but rather taking apart something God created in nature. A lumberjack needs to be strong, able to maneuver quickly, and be acutely aware of the surroundings. These two individuals, at first glance, don't seem to have much in common, yet both the quilter and lumberjack possess gifts from God and both provide a unique, beneficial, service to others. A quilt may keep you warm on a cold night, while a felled tree provides lumber to build a shelter where you make a home.

As I stated before, no two people or the gifts they receive from God are the same, yet whoever I am or whatever gifts I've been given can be used in loving service to God and my fellow mankind. No matter what my intellectual level, economic status, gender, place in society, or appearance I know peace and blessings because I know God. By living each day in gratitude and using His gifts to serve other, I too stand out in my uniqueness, like a snowflake or leaf.

The French drains on the south parking lot have been completed. This expense (\$27,249) fell into October. This expense put us over in October. As I had explained last month, the first quarter was short on income and used all the money we planned on covering the drains. But, the drains needed to be done before winter to preserve the parking lot. Hopefully, we will see income increase to help cover some of the “up keep” issues as they need to be addressed.

Liberty Giving Thanks 5K Run

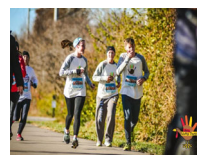
To Benefit Hillcrest Hope

This workshop will be held in the St. James School Art Room and is for children in 2nd grade and up!

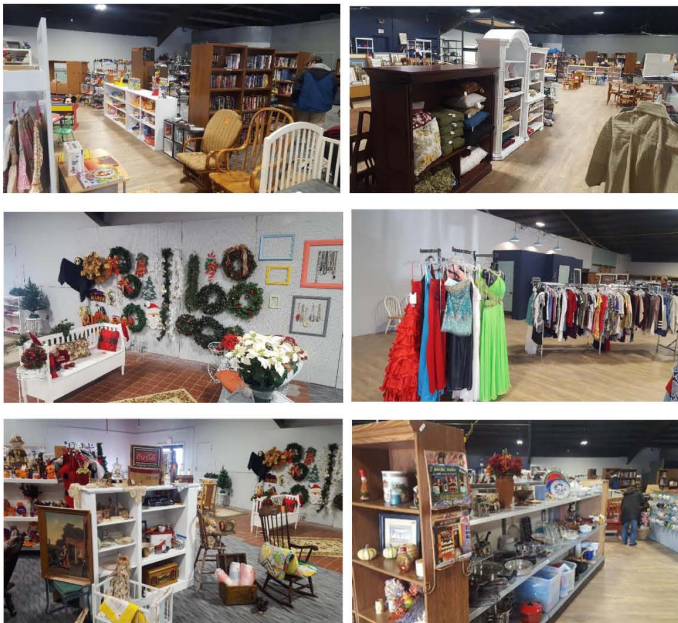

Advent Giving Trees Are Up

Take a Tag and Bless Someone's Christmas

I know that it's too early to be talking about Christmas, so let's instead talk about Advent, which begins in just a few short weeks! In our parish, every year our Advent Giving Tree committee works very hard to ensure that the poor in our area have a joyful Christmas. The trees in our narthex will be going up this weekend with tags from several organizations who work with the poor and the elderly.



There are many groups that benefit from the generosity of our Giving Tree, one of them being the Hillcrest graduates. For five years after a family has successfully completed the program, they can still take part in the Christmas program. We realize that although the family is back on the right track, saving money and spending wisely, money can still be tight and Christmas gifts can put a strain on a family's budget. So if you can, please budget in a tag or two from the Tree this year and share the fun of shopping & wrapping with your children!

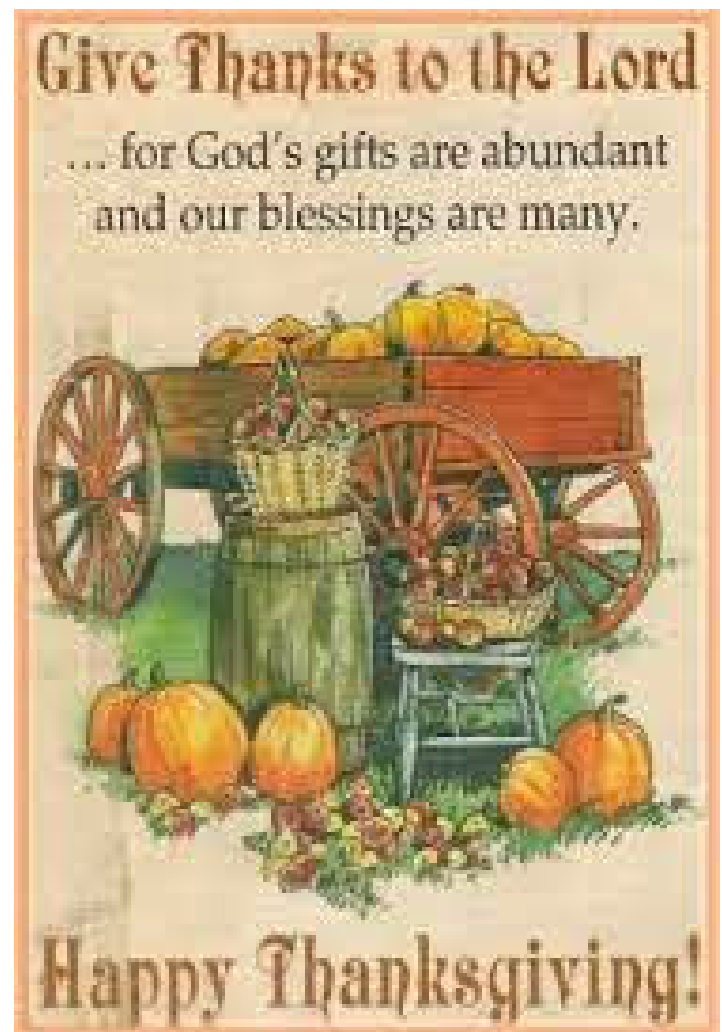
