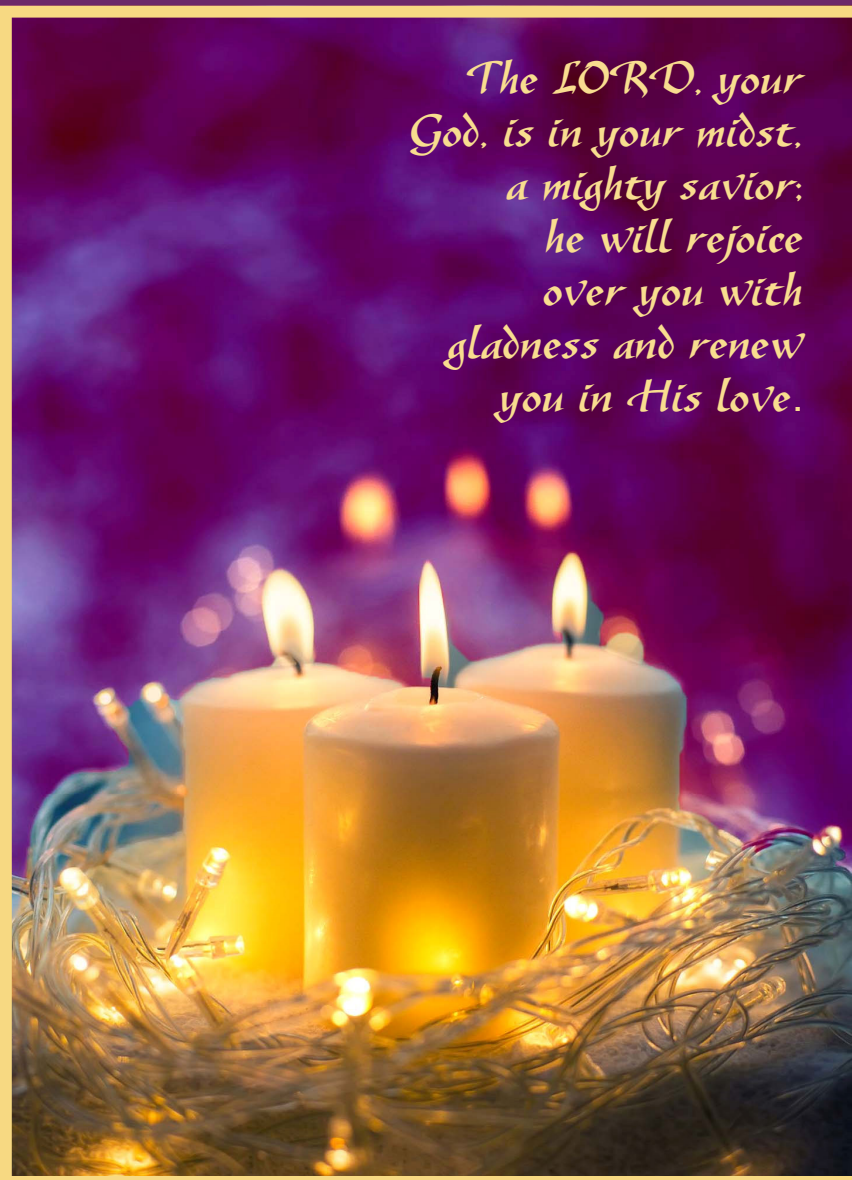

From the Pastor's Pen

Tampa was warm and sunny and I almost didn't want to come back home to Missouri. Last weekend I traveled to Tampa, Florida, for NCCYM 2018. It was the bi-annual gathering for the National Conference for Catholic Youth Ministers. It was three days of celebrating our faith and being renewed and energized about working with youth and young adults. Various bishops and other youth ministers shared their stories, their journeys of wins and losses, ups and downs.

In light of the recent Synod on Young Adults, Pope Francis's words of listening and accompanying youth and young adults was repeated throughout the weekend. Reflecting upon the Road to Emmaus, the image of walking with and listening to the other found a home with us. Jesus walked with the two and listened to what they were saying. Yet they didn't notice the truth that was right before them and with them. How difficult it is sometimes in our own lives to know and understand what's right before us. Although the reflections and the stories told didn't present anything earth shatteringly new, it did cause us to stop and pause and reflect upon what it is we are doing in ministry. It was both kudos for the work we are doing already and a challenge to take the time to just do it. How many times have we or do we question what another is doing or thinking and just assume we know? Have we taken the time to ask the question? And if we ask the question, have we taken the time to sit and listen?

Not too long ago I had the opportunity to join some friends for dinner. I generally don't care too much about Fortune Cookies, but this time it was actually worth reading and repeating. The fortune read: "By listening, one will learn truths. By hearing, one will only learn half truths." When we do take the time to listen to one another, are we truly taking the time to listen or are we just politely hearing?

In today's gospel, the people ask John the Baptist, "What should we do?" John replies with ways to treat one another with respect. Will the people only hear the words or will they listen and put into practice what he has said? We hear lots of words spoken in our world today. Are we just hearing the sounds or are we listening to what is being spoken? We put into practice what we choose to hear and listen to. What will we hear today? What will we put into practice from what we have heard?

Happy Third Sunday of Advent! Gaudete, Let us rejoice!!!

Reflection

The psalm today comes from the book of the prophet Isaiah. The name Emmanuel, which means "God with us," is not directly heard in the psalm or the readings for today, but we hear echoes of this theme. The prophet Zephaniah proclaims, "The Lord, your God, is in your midst." The apostle Paul writes, "The Lord is near." And in the psalm itself we hear, "Shout with exultation, O city of Zion, / for great in your midst / is the Holy One of Israel." As you proclaim the psalm this weekend, pause and reflect on how you have experienced Emmanuel, "God with us," in your own life.

You anoint us with your Spirit,
O Lord, that we may bring glad tidings.
Let the song of joy we sing this day
be lived in our lives.
Sing praise to the Lord and shout with joy, for
God is in our midst, the Holy One of Israel,
AMEN.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I was at the Post Office recently where I saw a Christmas Card with a picture of a snowman. Although the scene was cute, what caught my attention were the words on the front of the card: "Joy, Mercy, Jolly, Wonder." I thought this was a bit odd but the more I stared at the card I realized how appropriate these words are for our Advent Season.

Unlike so many people, I never feel stressed this time of year. Instead I am filled with a sense of beauty and wonder. Our recent snow, although making walking and driving treacherous, was beautiful. Looking at the world blanketed in white I was reminded of my white baptismal garment, and the cleansing, life giving waters of baptism. The snow also seemed to be nature's way of blanketing and protecting her new life, hidden from view, waiting for spring.

Going around my neighborhood I also felt jolly seeing children playing in the snow, creating their own unique snow sculptures, and slip-sliding about on their feet and sleds. I even chuckled, with my neighbors, as they attempted to free vehicles from snow banks.

My youngest son and his family had traveled from Iowa to celebrate Thanksgiving. When we saw the weather report, however, he made the decision to return one day early. Although I felt sad, I also felt relief when he called telling me they arrived home safely before the storm. Watching the blowing snow the following day, however, joy replaced my sadness. The joy I felt came from knowing that wherever they might live, my family is always close; they are in my thoughts and in my heart. I think that is what God intends for all His children. We are always in Him and He is within us. He cares for each of us, even when we forget to keep Him at the center of our lives.

Finally, in my quiet moments, when I sit in His presence, I am fully aware of His mercy. Sometimes I wish I could purge my memories of all the times I have forgot who I am and who I am not, when I forgot to trust God, patiently await His direction, when I have spoken harshly, or struggled with forgiveness. It is in those moments with my memories that I feel His mercy.

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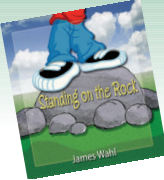
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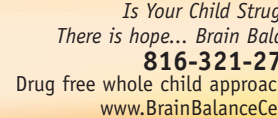


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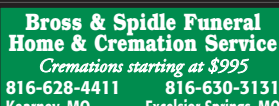
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
