From the Pastor's Pen

One of my favorite statues or wood carvings has always been the image of the Holy Family. As a child we would usually travel to visit Mom's folks the weekend after Christmas. I have fond memories of attending Mass on the Feast of the Holy Family and while Father was speaking about Mary, Jesus and Joseph I remember staring at the circular carving of the three. It appeared as if they were all one wrapped together. What an image of a family that you can't have one without the other.

Today as we celebrate, we are reminded about the importance of family. Each of us from our experiences sees family life a bit differently and yet in many different ways it works. But unfortunately not for all. Over the years, I have had the great opportunities to visit both with families who were doing well but wanted to be better and those struggling and just trying to make it. Sometimes I have been able to offer helpful advice and other times it was just too late. One time I even had a husband come to me as a last ditch effort to talk. After listening to his story, I invited him to watch a short 30 second clip from one of the marriage prep videos. After he shared "If someone had just shared that little bit with us twenty years ago, we might have avoided this whole disaster." Although we don't have the book with all the answers, we can offer tools to help.

Where do we begin with family and marriage to have the best picture perfect family? We begin with our own experiences, family life growing up, and hopes and dreams. We listen to our hearts and God's call in our life. We take advantage of marriage prep and marriage enrichment opportunities. It's like anything else in life, if we want it to succeed we gotta work at it.

Included in this bulletin is an invitation to join us at the Precious Blood Renewal Center for an opportunity for couples and families to grow in their relationship and make something good even better. We will be offering "The Choice Wine: 7 Steps to a Superabundant Marriage". We encourage you to see page 7 and consider joining us for this wonderful session.

May all of us be blest by the goodness of the Holy Family.

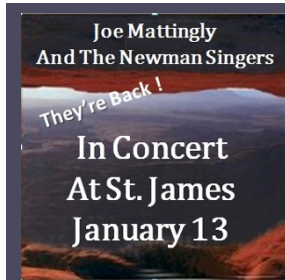

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Another year is coming to an end and I find myself looking backward and forward at the same time. 2018 has brought change to many; some good, others not so good. As I look back I wonder: Have the changes in my life helped me to be more open to the will of God? In all honesty I must answer: I'm not really sure, but I know I have tried. With confidence I can honestly state that at this moment I feel in a good place regarding my relationship with my Lord. Every day seems to begin with a greater openness and trust, feelings of peace and joy and hope that I can approach Jesus with a willingness to follow His example of loving servanthood. Another challenge to accept change. I really don't believe in making New Year's resolutions but I do write a list of areas in my life that need improvement and prioritize where I should begin. Looking toward 2019, I feel one priority is to improve my prayer life.

Thomas Keating wrote: "We may think of prayer as thoughts or feelings expressed in words. But this is only one expression. . . . Prayer is the opening of mind and heart – our whole being – to God, the Ultimate Mystery, beyond thoughts, words, and emotions. Through grace we open our awareness to God whom we know by faith is within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than choosing – closer than consciousness itself." (*Open Mind, Open Heart*, 20th anniversary edition, Bloomsbury: 2006, 175) I appreciate his words and will attempt to embrace this concept of prayer in the coming year. How wonderful for my heart, mind and body to be present to God at the same time, to experience His presence in a moment of deep inner connection, with pure gratitude and love. This will not be easy since my mind is generally struggling with a multitude of thoughts at any given moment: what deadlines are looming; what bills need paid and when; are there phone messages or email I need to answer; how should I deal with unsettling relationships, and on and on it goes. What a blessing to turn off all these thoughts, concerns, and feelings and simply rest in God's presence. To feel His presence in my heart, mind, and body. That is my hope and first priority for 2019.

YES – Life is not EASY

Reflecting again on being a steward of God from Tracy Welliver's book, here we are at "Life is not EASY!"

Mary said "Yes" and brought Jesus to us in the human form. Jesus said "Yes" to His fate on the cross. But Mary pondered the angel Gabriel's greeting. She did not understand, at all. She would be shamed and thrown out of her family and community. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Christ questioned, BUT accepted. Joseph said "Yes" to take Mary into his home. Joseph planned to divorce Mary quietly, because it was not his child. But Jesus receives his lineage to the House of David through Joseph!

God does not promise life will be easy, but He does promise to be with us. Now – I know Jesus and Mary were extraordinary. But God used them in human form, I think, so we could learn from them. They help guide us through this life.

Mr. Welliver says this, "But mature disciples say yes to God every day, even if that yes will bring hardship and include a heavy cost. Stewardship calls us to stop counting the cost."

I think of some of the things I feel God has brought me to and how difficult I found those choices to be. Not even thinking about the everyday requests that are part of life. Can you even image something as big as giving up your family, or your LIFE! God knows all of our struggles. I have this reminder that I keep with me – "If God brings you to it, He will bring you through it."

With Mary and Jesus beside us, let's take a moment this weekend and breath deep. Think of 3 ways you have said yes in your life that have made an impact on your relationship as a steward of God. Who knows, maybe you even can see the impact you had on someone else's life with God!

Recipe for a Happy New Year

Take twelve fine, full-grown months; see that these are thoroughly free from old memories of bitterness, rancor and hate, cleanse them completely from every clinging spite; pick off all specks of pettiness and littleness; in short, see that these months are freed from all the past—have them fresh and clean as when they first came from the great storehouse of Time.

Cut these months into thirty or thirty-one equal parts. Do not attempt to make up the whole batch at one time (so many persons spoil the entire lot this way) but prepare one day at a time.

Into each day put equal parts of faith, patience, courage, work (some people omit this ingredient and so spoil the flavor of the rest), hope, fidelity, liberality, kindness, rest (leaving this out is like leaving the oil out of the salad dressing—don't do it), prayer, meditation, and one well-selected resolution.

Put in about one teaspoonful of good spirits, a dash of fun, a pinch of laughter, a sprinkling of play, and a heaping cupful of good humor.

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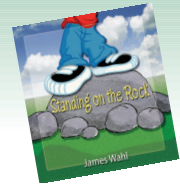
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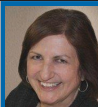
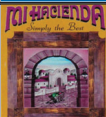
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
