Knights of Columbus 5th Sunday Breakfast

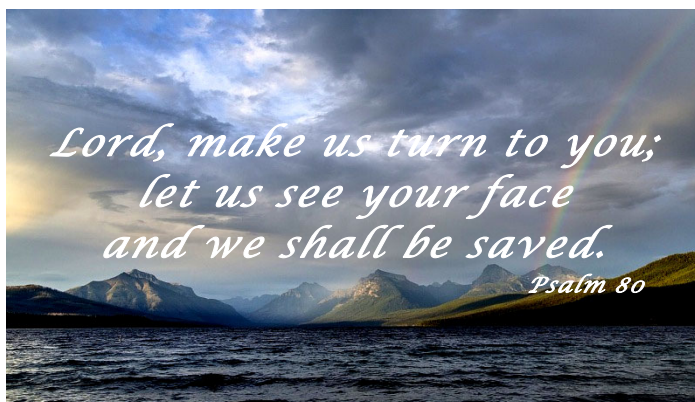

Reflection

The first reading and gospel speak of God's promise and the fulfillment of that promise to send a savior to God's people. Micah prophesies a ruler who will shepherd the people out of exile into a place of security and peace. John the Baptist announces the presence of this ruler in the womb of the Virgin Mary when he leaps for joy! Today's psalm has a different tone, however.

As a lament, it calls upon God to come to the aid of a nation in shambles. A lament that is all too true and relevant today.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



When I was in Girl Scouts, we sang many songs and strangely enough, I remember most of them. One of my favorites was "Down in My Heart." It was a simple song with

many verses. One verse went like this "I've got that peace that passes understanding, down in my heart, down in my heart, down in my heart. I've got that peace that passes understanding down in my heart to stay." At the time it was just a song, easy to learn, and sung after meals or around a campfire. Now, however, when reflecting on these words I think I finally get it and I feel that peace after many years of searching. True peace is not about me, it is a gift from God. It isn't something external, yet it resides in my very being day in and day out. Even when I try to hide, when there is turmoil in my life, and I'm unsure regarding the decisions I make, God's peace embraces me and quiets my restlessness.

I think I always felt His peace when my family brought out the crèche and placed the infant Jesus with Mary and Joseph. This ritual, remembered from my early childhood, has been an important part of my preparation for the celebration of Christmas. This year, however, as my granddaughter Elizabeth helped arrange the figures, I realized how important it is, not just arrange the crèche, but to also share my love of Jesus. I rather un-expectantly realized that this has become my purpose in writing this column each week.

When I created *Someone is Watching and Wondering* many years ago, I thought the purpose was to convey information in a catechetical manner. Over the years, however, I find myself, more and more, sharing my journey and love of God with each of you. Sometimes I feel anxious by events occurring in our church, country, and the world in which we live. At these times it is difficult to contain my personal feelings and frustrations and focus on words to share that are uplifting and which serve as a guide for your journey with Jesus. I become distracted and my mind is like a tornado spinning out of control and leaving havoc behind. Something strange seems to happen as I prepare to put word to paper. I sense direction and purpose. Sometimes it works, other times not so much. Today, however, I leave you with the Peace that Passes Understanding. I know this peace will come to you as you freely embrace God's love. May His Peace remain in your heart today and always.

The Legend Of The Poinsettia

There was once a poor Mexican girl called Pepita who had no present to give the baby Jesus at the Christmas Eve Services. As Pepita walked to the chapel, sadly, her cousin Pedro tried to cheer her up. 'Pepita', he said 'I'm sure that even the smallest gift, given by someone who loves him will make Jesus Happy.'

Pepita didn't know what she could give, so she picked a small handful of weeds from the roadside and made them into a small bouquet. She felt embarrassed because she could only give this small present to Jesus.

As she walked through the chapel to the altar, she remembered what Pedro had said. She began to feel better, knelt down and put the bouquet at the bottom of the nativity scene.

Suddenly, the bouquet of weeds burst into bright red flowers, and everyone who saw them were sure they had seen a miracle.

From that day on, the bright red flowers were known as the 'Flores de Noche Buena', or 'Flowers of the Holy Night'.

The shape of the poinsettia flower and leaves are sometimes thought as a symbol of the Star of Bethlehem which led the Wise Men to Jesus.

The red colored leaves symbolize the blood of Christ.

The white leaves represent his purity.

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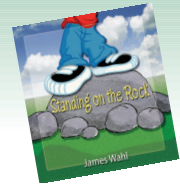

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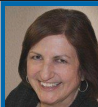
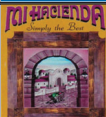
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
