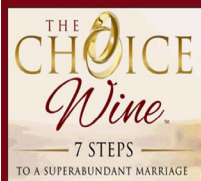

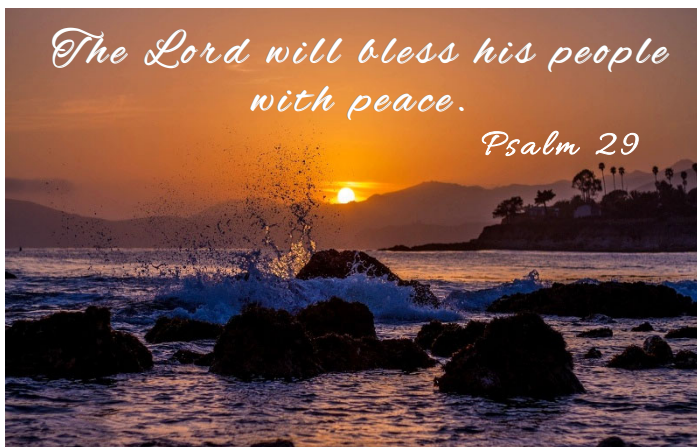

Reflection

This psalm gives praise to God, whose might and glory are shown by his command of the waters of the earth. This water is destructive at times through flooding, but water also brings life into the dry desert. In the gospel a new moment in salvation history is narrated and it, too, contains water. Jesus steps forward to be baptized in the waters of the Jordan River and when he comes out we again hear the "voice of the Lord...over the waters." This heavenly voice proclaims, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased," and we can picture Jesus at prayer "enthroned" at the Jordan River as he lives more fully into this kingship as God's beloved.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over the past several weeks I have been re-evaluating my life; choices I've made, friends and family who have been present during difficult times, careers/jobs held over more than 50 years, paths taken and roads traveled. I feel that my life has been graced by God's presence.



I must state, however, that visiting the Holy Land and walking over paths that Jesus walked remains one of the greatest experiences of my life. Although I visited many Holy sites those places without great churches and monuments were where I felt closest to my Lord.

One such place was the River Jordan. Like most rivers it winds its way through the many different terrains and as you can see from the map this river travels from the Sea of Galilee to the Dead Sea. There is no outlet, rather the River Jordan ends in the desert. The map also indicates that the Jordan serves as a boundary between Israel, Jordan the Palestine (The West Bank) providing much needed water to this arid part of the world.

Today, however, my thoughts are not geopolitical but rather the Jordan River as a site for many pilgrims desiring to be baptized in the river of Jesus' baptism. The day I visited the Jordan there was such a group entering the waters for Christian baptism and I remember thinking about my own baptism.

I was baptized Palm Sunday evening at Budd Park Christian Church in the Northeast part of Kansas City. I was in sixth grade and both excited and nervous. The baptismal pool was at the front of the church, behind the choir. It was very large and with my pastor I walked into the pool, wearing a white garment. The water was very warm, he held one of my hands and with his other hand gently lowered me into the water three times. I was so happy to be baptized and I received my first Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday. I felt great joy but I don't think I really understood the commitment I was making. Even now there are still so many times, sitting alone, quietly with God when I ask, "Who am I, Why am I here, What matters most, and What am I willing to let go." Baptism was a beginning but my journey continues and hopefully I will continue to love and trust Jesus to lead the way.

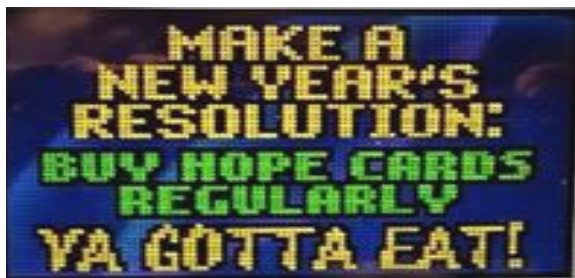

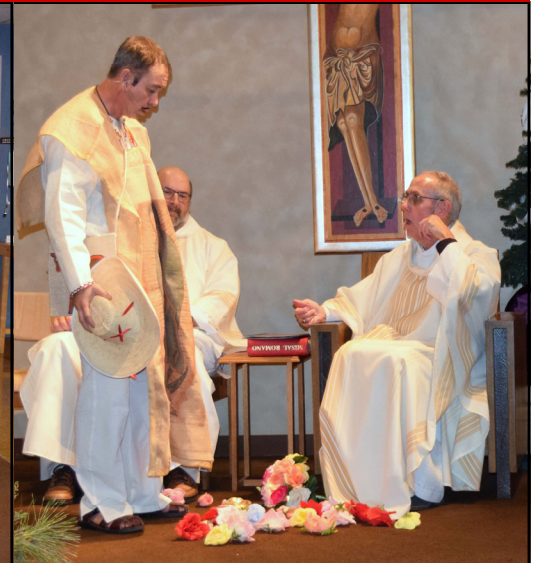

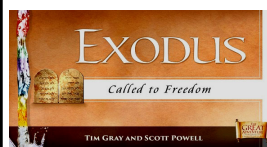

I will forever remember this Christmas and thank you for giving me the confidence and helping me start a new beginning in my apartment after I graduate Hillcrest..Once again, thank you for everything and I am so thankful!! Secondly, Kristin graduated in a ceremony on January 9th at Pleasant Valley Baptist (one of our church partners). She will be moving out at the end of January. She got an extension because her new apartment won't be ready to move into until the end of the month. We'll be giving Kristin a little graduation gift, as well as our warmest wishes for a brand new start for her!

Then the work will begin to get our apartment ready for another new family to start the process to rebuild their lives! It's wonderful to be able to feel a part of someone making positive and life-changing decisions. The Hillcrest program is tough and requires that the person/family be really willing to make over their entire life, but the end results are amazing. The majority of our apartment's residents have gone on to have productive lives and are still self-sufficient. Even one of our residents who didn't make it through the program is, at last word, still doing well and benefiting from the lessons that she learned while at Hillcrest.

Keep watching the newsletter for ways that your family can help. We'll need folks to help clean the apartment, as well as donations to cover the cost of the move-in groceries and any items that need to be replaced. Since the residents are kept to an all-needs-no-wants regimen, any wear and tear on the apartment's furnishings and supplies is up to us to replace. To keep the costs down, we try to keep on top of refurbishing as each tenant moves out. Even with the gentlest and most careful of tenants, there is going to be some wear & tear, and even more so when kids are involved, as you know from your own children! We always appreciate your generosity and your support of this program!
